PARK MANAGER'S REPORT

he summer mowing schedule is in effect - every Tuesday of the month weather permitting.

As reported last month, Desiree & I presented a communicational tool to the ROC Executive Board called Volo Village which was approved at the April Board Meeting. This is a system of communication through automatic calling, texting, or email regarding emergencies & such to each coach, each resident. We will be working on this project during the summer months. We are looking into a new Sharp copier machine to lessen administrative costs, become more efficient & qualitative as well.

Final touches on the pool and shuffleboard renovation are completed. The patio floor has been painted as well as the shuffleboard benches. We have received several plumbing bids for the corner drainage area at the pool on best remedy & solution. That decision will be made quite soon.

The signs at the first and second entrances have been redone. Decision was made in mid May to implement two (removable) speed bumps/humps at the second entrance. These are rubber & short in height. Please everyone be mindful of our 10 MPH speed limit throughout the park.

In early May I met with the new representative for Republic Services (our trash compactor) and adjusted the contract, savings of about \$400 per month.

We expect to resume our contact with Tampa Bay Plumbing regarding their presentation for additional valves, possible water line replacement remedies.

A beautiful new coach at # 484 is completed and for sale. Anyone interested, should contact Desiree who is our licensed agent. As soon as we receive permits from Largo, we will order another 2 bedroom home for lot #480.

I continue to work with Mathew Gridzlo, Pinellas County canal rep, regarding the growth in the canal and along the banks. We continue also to remove any dead trees and invasive plants throughout the park. Please notify the office if you see anything that needs our attention. Additional palm tree trimming is being done since the palms are producing pods now due to the unusually warm spring. Alexander's palm tree bid for the park just received.

We are grateful that many of our winter residents, who have left for northern homes, notified the office upon their leaving. It is important for our summer residents to let Desiree know when you leave the Park even for a week. For the safety of all residents it is imperative that we know which units are occupied or unoccupied.

It is always helpful to know when guests are visiting. If they are using the pool, please be sure that they are wearing green identification bracelets. And a reminder to all: if you are the last person out of the pool, remember to put the rope back across the pool. We could be cited if the pool is empty and the rope is not in place – should a Largo inspector make a surprise visit.

If you notice a street light out in your area, jot down the number on the pole and give ...continued on page 10

We also continue to appreciate your cooperation on our trash/recycling pick-up days. Trash in a covered trash receptacle will keep the streets clean and the animals and birds under control. An instructional flyer will be left at your coach's door when a proper trash receptacle is not implemented.

For those owners who wish to have Alexander's (or any individual/other company) care for your planter and/or flower beds while you are away, I am requesting that you deal directly with Alexander's and contract with them. FLORIDA TROPICAL STORM SEASON JUNE - NOVEMBER

re you ready – just in case? Because we live in a mobile home we are required to evacuate in case of a hurricane. Where will you go? Do you have your medications at the ready with a supply of them in case you are gone for an extended length of time? What about food and water and clothes, etc?

First thing - where would you go? Friends or family? Hotel? Do you need help by police/ fire - there are forms that must be filled out and turned into them before a disaster strikes. Which hotel would you go to? How long will it take you to get ready to leave? Remember you have to also prepare the outside of your home - bring in "flying" objects like outside chairs, tables, plants, decorations, BBQ grills, etc. how long will this take? Put your awnings down! Will you need help? Fill up your gas tank before the storm is upon us - the gas pumps won't work if no power? Do you have cash available in case there is no power and you can't withdraw from an ATM - most stores won't take a credit/debit card.

FOOD? What do you have in your evacuation kit? Put high protein non-perishable food items like tuna, chicken, beans, peanut butter, spam, maybe some dry cereal cups, crackers. How about non-refrigerated milk? Can opener? Plastic utensils, paper plates, napkins.

BEDDING? If you have to leave do you need to bring bedding supplies with you? Your favorite blankets or pillow? What about bath towels?

CLOTHING? What will you need for a couple of days? What about a week? Take warm clothes in case of a chill? Rain gear? Footwear? Anything special?

MEDICATIONS? Do you have your medications together? Do you have enough for a couple of weeks in case pharmacies are closed or shipments can't be delivered? If the medications are in the refrigerator do you have a note in your evacuation kit to remind you to

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grasp. Do you need needles? Alcohol swabs? Do you have a first aide kit at the ready?

DO YOU HAVE A NOAA weather alert radio/device? Make sure you have it on and if it needs batteries put them in just in case of an electrical outage. Are you listening to the weather to keep track of updates? DONT PANIC BUT BE PREPARED!

IMPORTANT PAPERS: take them with you. If you have a fireproof box, take it with you! Let your family and friends know where you will be staying for the duration. Let the office at 4 Seasons know where you are going and when you are leaving. Let the office know when you return to your home.

I found most of this information in the Verizon telephone book so if you want more please check it out. God bless us and keep us safe.

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




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WHERE IN THE WORLD HAVE YOU BEEN?

n March 10, 2016 we flew from Miami to Barbados to spend 2 days on the sugar sand beach prior to a cruise of the Windward Islands in the Lesser Antilles. It was part of a deal we found online but booked thru Star Clippers office. Arriving early assured making the embarkation on time as airport complications can happen. We embarked The Royal Clipper, a 5 masted square rigged clipper ship built in 2000 carrying 190 passengers & 100 crew members. It is the largest of its kind in the world. It was a vacation perfecting the fine art of doing nothing. This was not a "working" cruise. The square sails were lowered mechanically with a push of a button while the jibs were handled by crew. There was much drama while setting sail into the sunset while the theme song from the movie 1492 was played on deck. The noticeable thing was the quiet soft breezes of a ship underway. 95% of the journey was under sail reserving the engines for practical things like running the electric, AC, & refrigeration on the boat.

The itinerary included stops at St. Lucia, Martinique, Isle de France, St. Kitts, Aruba, Dominica, & Antigua. All the islands are volcanic, jutting out of the ocean except Barbados. Because it is a "smaller" ship we were able to stop at destinations unavailable to the floating hotels. We also avoided the extra 5,000 + tourists in the ports. These boats are really geared for adults and do not have water slides, rock climbing walls, casinos, or elevators. Deck chairs were a plenty and there were 2 small pools. For some, the adventure was to climb the mast using the ropes in a harness for a great photo op.



The crew & passengers were very international which made for interesting meal times All announcements were in 3 languages, English, German, & French, all made by an Italian crew member. The menu was also done the same making for some humorous moments resulting in signs next to the samples indicating "meat", "vegetables", or "fruit", clarifying everything. Dinner was at 7:30 following a 5:30 snack time & entertainment was centered around your tablemates. We found that the Europeans were fascinated by American politics, not shy to ask what our views were & what they thought about it all. After 7 days we returned to Barbados to fly to Miami. The best advice is to fly out of another airport as that part of the journey put a damper on a lot of pleasant memories!




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
