PARK MANAGER'S REPORT

The summer mowing schedule continues in effect - every Tuesday weather permitting. The clubhouse interior painting project is almost completed. We continue to assess the effectiveness of the two removable speed bumps installed at the second entrance. Signs have been placed on either side of the street to alert drivers. These are recyclable rubber & short in height. Please everyone be mindful of our 10 MPH speed limit throughout the park and observe all stop signs – for everyone's safety.

Julie Williams' colleague from the Largo PD spoke at Koffee Klatch in July and we have scheduled Julie to speak in the fall. It's imperative to be made aware of safety issues.

Corner pool drainage project is completed. Paverstone Pavers were contacted to redo the slope where ponding occurs.

The beautiful new coach at # 484 is now under contract (as of this writing). Anyone interested in the new coach at lot # 480 should contact Desiree, our licensed dealership agent. A sign has also been placed at lot #366 stating that it is available for any one to put their new home there. We are also awaiting the placement of two privately owned units (as of this writing, the owners are awaiting their new home at #352).

I continue to work with Mathew Gredzlo, Pinellas County canal rep, regarding the growth in the canal and along the banks. We continue also to remove any dead trees and invasive plants throughout the park. Please notify the office if you see anything that warrants attention.

Contacted City of Largo rep Ken Anderson @ 727/587-6718 regarding concerns about the channel. They did some cleanup on the channel between FSE & PW in mid-July. Joe completed much cleanup along all canal areas. City of Largo Parks Director Brian Usher has agreed to come speak to us at KK on August 17th.

Beware of Alligator signs ordered, & Joe will be placing along canal areas.

It is important for all our residents to let Desiree know when you leave the Park and, of course, when you return. This updates our computer system for necessary mailings and other park information. And for the safety of all residents it is imperative that we know which units are occupied or unoccupied.

It is always helpful to know when guests are visiting. If they are using the pool, please be sure that they are wearing green identification bracelets. And a reminder to all: if you are the last person out of the pool, remember to put the rope back across the pool. We could be cited if the pool is empty and the rope is not in place – should a Department of Health inspector make a surprise visit.

If you notice a street light out in your area, jot down the number on the pole and give Desiree a call. She will notify Duke Energy for repair.

For those owners who wish to have Alexander's (or any individual/other company) care for your planter and/or flower beds while you are away, I am requesting that you deal directly



with Alexander's and contract with them. Many letters have just gone out to those residents that need to clean up weeds in beds, & such. The FSE office will not be responsible for any contractual agreements between a home owner and Alexander's (or any individual/other company). You must deal directly with the company (or the individual) – phone 727-535-7314 or info@alexanderspm.com. Ryan Hudson is our representative and is usually in the Park on Tuesdays.

We also continue to appreciate your cooperation on our trash/recycling pick-up days. Trash in a covered trash receptacle will keep the streets clean and the animals and birds under control. An instructional flyer will be left at your coach's door when a proper trash receptacle is not implemented.

WHERE IN THE WORLD HAVE YOU BEEN?

A nhour's drive north on 95 from Jacksonville, Florida, is lovely Jekyll Island. Jekyll Island is one of only four Georgia barrier islands that have a paved causeway to allow access from the mainland by car. It has 5,700 acres of land, including 4,400 acres of solid earth and the 200-acre Jekyll Island Club Historic District. The rest is tidal marshlands, mostly on the island's western shore. The island is about 7 miles long by 1.5 miles wide, has 8 miles of wide, flat beaches on its east shore with sand packed hard enough for easy walking or biking, and boasts 20 miles of hiking trails. There are private homes as well as several hotels; the Jekyll Island Club Hotel is on the National Registry of Historic Places. For a small fee you can tour the Georgia Sea Turtle Center – a habitat and rehab facility – and watch the turtles being fed and cared for by the professional and volunteer staff. And Driftwood Beach is amazing – stark beauty of trees that have been uprooted by the tides. In addition to the hiking and biking trails there is even a water park for the little kids and the big kids, too. It was a great way to cool off on a hot summer day!

By way of the ROC web site, I receive upwards of 100 inquiries a year looking for seasonal rentals. My stock response has been "sorry, there is no central listing of homeowners desiring to rent out their homes".

The ROC board of directors has authorized me to create a simple list of owners willing to rent, which I would then send out to anyone inquiring about a rental. This is being done as a service to all owners in the park. The list will consist of owner's name, lot number, contact info, single/doublewide, number of bedrooms and baths, and months available. FLORIDA TROPICAL STORM SEASON JUNE - NOVEMBER

S eptember is here and the weather has cooperated so far even though we've certainly had more than enough rain! However, we still need to remain vigilant. Let's not be caught off guard!

Because we live in a mobile home we are required to evacuate in case of a hurricane. Where will you go? Do you have your medications at the ready with a supply of them in case you are gone for an extended length of time? What about food and water and clothes, etc?

First thing - where would you go? Friends or family? Hotel? Do you need help by police/ fire - there are forms that must be filled out and turned into them before a disaster strikes. Which hotel would you go to? How long will it take you to get ready to leave? Remember you have to also prepare the outside of your home - bring in "flying" objects like outside chairs, tables, plants, decorations, BBQ grills, etc. how long will this take? Put your awnings down! Will you need help? Fill up your gas tank before the storm is upon us - the gas pumps won't work if no power! Do you have cash available in case there is no power and you can't withdraw from an ATM - most stores won't take a credit/debit card.

FOOD? What do you have in your evacuation kit? Put high protein non-perishable food items like tuna, chicken, beans, peanut butter, spam, maybe some dry cereal cups, crackers. How about non-refrigerated milk? Can opener? Plastic utensils, paper plates, napkins.

BEDDING? If you have to leave do you need to bring bedding supplies with you? Your favorite blankets or pillow? What about bath towels?

CLOTHING? What will you need for a couple of days? What about a week? Take warm clothes in case of a chill? Rain gear? Footwear? Anything special?

MEDICATIONS? Do you have your medications together? Do you have enough for a couple of weeks in case pharmacies are closed or shipments can't be delivered? If the medications are in the refrigerator do you have a note in your evacuation kit to remind you to grasp. Do you need needles? Alcohol swabs? Do you have a first aide kit at the ready?

DO YOU HAVE A NOAA weather alert radio/device? Make sure you have it on and if it needs batteries put them in just in case of an electrical outage. Are you listening to the weather to keep track of updates? DONT PANIC BUT BE PREPARED!

IMPORTANT PAPERS: take them with you. If you have a fireproof box, take it with you! Let your family and friends know where you will be staying for the duration. Let the office at 4 Seasons know where you are going and when you are leaving. Let the office know when you return to your home.

Most of the local newspapers have hurricane readiness information and this came from the Verizon/Frontier telephone book. God bless us and keep us safe.




