

Jackie and I arrived in FSE on the 5th of Nov. by auto-train and it appears that we got out just in time. We thought it was cold while we were packing the van to leave, 37 degrees F, but now the snow is flying and the temperature is dipping to single digits. We're glad to be back. With your cooperation we hope to complete this in a couple of days. It will make life a lot more comfortable for all of us

**OFFICE SPACE UPGRADE:** The renovation of the office spaces are well underway and looking good. Clay is doing a wonderful job and it should be complete before you receive this newsletter.

**<u>Digitization:</u>** The work of digitizing our files has been completed by Desiree and Beryle Patton. Thank you both.

**ROC Units:** Clay continues to work diligently on rehabbing these coaches and has reduced the yet to be rehabbed to 6.

We have said this many times before, but I will say it again, if you are having someone coming to occupy your coach they need to be approved before hand and they need to check in at the office. It can be very embarrassing for you and the guest if they are denied occupancy after they have traveled many miles because we find they do not qualify. Please make sure that your renters understand that we are a 55+ community and a pet free Park. If you are uncertain what needs to be done, contact Desiree in the office. Finally, we should all understand that we are responsible for the people that we allow to rent or occupy our units, so make sure they are fully aware of the rules and regs of our Park.

gentler, and the background changing from the stark brownish darks of winter to the lush bright greens of the tropics. After six days of driving, the car filled past capacity, we finally arrive at our little house on the Canal in Largo.

The next morning a sense of peace and tranquility overwhelms me as I sit on the familiar dock drinking delicious hot coffee and eating still-warm bagels from the local deli. The air, while by no means cold is brisk with a gentle breeze shifting the fronds of the ubiquitous palm trees. There are the ever present midges, flying nonchalantly around, seemingly unaware of the unlikelihood of their existence at this time of the year. The most wondrous sight and sound of all, however is the BIRDS!!!!!!

I have never been able to relate to birds at home like I do in Florida, partially I guess because they are bigger and brighter here but mostly because of their unadulterated audacity. There is no false modesty here. There is one particular Ibis (I call him Benny) who ensconces himself on the windowsill and tirelessly peers in at the activity inside as if he were truly part of the family. Then, there's the Wood stork we call Hedley....he actually used to knock on the screen door for handouts. Each different species of bird characteristically occupies a different "hotel" (so we dubbed the various trees) across the canal, and woe betide any who attempt to usurp another's domain!!!

By the second day the inevitable head cold (the price of traveling from one climate into another) has brought me down somewhat. I've finally relented and started taking the horrid cold tablets which dull my senses and make me incessantly hungry. I sat out here on my dock last night with a hot toddy (for the cold of course !!!) and got bitten by creatures called "no see'ums". These nasty little mosquitoes are invisible and their effects cannot be felt until later when you awake in a frenzy of itching and hive-like bumps. Why is it that some people (like my husband) are so unaffected and others of us are so tormented by our entomological brethren???

It's the third day and so far all we've done is shop, shop, shop. We need to do this because there was no room in the car for Xmas decorations (an oversized SUV). I'm dying to go to the beach and swim in the Gulf. Floridians think I'm a little eccentric because I like to swim in the ocean in the winter, however, it's still much warmer that at home in July. You'd think the mosquitoes would have the decency to lie low at least for Xmas...ooh I'm not feeling full of good cheer this morning...the d...cold still hanging on...need to regroup...need to work out - that always does it...another bite...sniff, sniff.


