



ur annual meeting was held on Thursday, March 3rd. Approximately 30 residents attended. President Cheryl Williams presented her report highlighting this past seasons activities. Other noted issues of concern included: annual rent increases; stop signs; benches; dead palm trees; security camera at side gate and our status as 55 plus manufactured home park.

It was noted that the clubhouse kitchen area will be worked on over the summer and there was a suggestion as to the addition of a defibrillator to the clubhouse.

reminder that the swans are afforded a special diet at the direction of the veterinarian. Parents and grandparents with children will discover that by merely standing at the fence in their vicinity, the swans will approach if you are quiet and remain still. Under no conditions should stale bread be offered. Dogs, especially those with aggressive personalities, should not be walked in the common area surrounding the front pond.

Special care should be taken by those fishing to avoid the swans altogether. There was an occasion where an errantly tossed lure became embedded in the side of one of the swans and it took extraordinary measures to capture and then remove the lure and correct what could have been a life threatening event. The swans are quite curious and easily attracted to a lure being tossed and retrieved.

Our Gateway swans are a valuable asset and very precious to a great many park residents and though the ponds are available we request you exercise extreme care by avoiding all birds when fishing.

We continue to accept donations from residents for the purchase of food and the care of the swans. We still recycle all metals, large and small. The money goes for the swan's food and upkeep and also for the activities of the park.
