Each paid-up household is entitled to one vote. If you have not paid for 2016, please remit the \$2 renewal fee before the meeting starts. GHA Treasurer Lana Kennedy will be at the registration table accepting fees from 6:30 to 7:30 pm. It is important for members to attend the meeting as a majority of the membership is required to constitute a quorum of 50% of the members. The election shall be by ballot and a simple majority (50%+1) of the votes cast shall be binding. Votes may be cast in person or by proxy. Proxy forms are now available from GHA Secretary Sandy Vertz, and must be submitted by 7:15 pm. the day of the meeting.

Any Gateway homeowner who is interested in serving on the Board is encouraged to submit their name to one of the following members of the Nominating Committee: Chair, June Boudreau; Directors Susan Peckham and Linda Puckett; Members-at-Large Bob Harris and Lew Wood. Nominations from the floor will also be accepted at the meeting on December 14th.


There was continued concern expressed for excessive speeding occurring within the park along with remarks concerning the call for additional security cameras within the park.


