Emma Nebel reported that she met with Manager Susan Worden and presented the requests and concerns of our park residents. We are happy to announce that the new chairs were bought sometime in the late spring to summer for around the pool areas. The new pool pump was installed shortly after it broke so that all residents could go back to enjoying the pool and Jacuzzi.



A camera was installed at the entrance on Gandy Blvd, but now missing the accrual camera. Susan said that the people that they bought the camera from, gave them a defective one. ...continued on page 9

So they will be getting a replacement. No word on when our kitchen will be updated as of yet.

There is an issue of a few people parking in the streets and on the grass. Please be careful and try to park your cars in your carport areas only. Also mentioned was of grass being dug up in areas where people are parking. Please stay off the grass.

Our sewer system cannot handle those "flushable wipes." Please don't flush them down the commodes. It breaks the pumps.

This note was from March 2014...It was reported that Park Management has had contractors replace three damaged pumps in the sewage tank. The damage was likely the result of cloth rags, handi-wipes or diapers being flushed down toilets. The cost of this type of maintenance is quite high and forces management to divert funds from other park improvements. Residents are urged to avoid flushing the items mentioned and to alert their visiting guests to the problem.

The issue of the letter regarding the pass on tax was brought up and Susan Worden stated they have an attorney on it and try to stop it before it takes effect on the residents. Al Kirkley also read a Pinellas County document why the pass on law needs to be added to Pinellas county.

The issue of a request again about if we can lower the lot rent by having garbage pick up once a week instead of 2 times a week. But we were told by management that the price would be the same anyway.

The issue of the overwhelming traffic from all the construction off Gandy Blvd is making it increasingly difficult to come in and out safety, Al Kirkley suggested leaving the back locked gate open during the hours of 6 am to dusk 7 days a week. We will have a responsible volunteer person open and lock at no expense to the park. We took a count of hands, total was approximately 22 voting to open the gate during these times. Unless we get more break ins, at which time, everyone will need to go back to just using their keys. You can get keys directly from Susan Worden, Park manager.

There are reports of attempted break ins on 1st Way N and 1st Street recently. All park residents need to take immediate precautionary measures. I walked around the park and noticed many very dark unlit areas. We are all very concerned, this is why we all need to do a little extra to keep ourselves and our neighbors safe. I suggested that everyone purchase a motion detector light and also a small air horn to startle these intruders away. If you have a panic button in your cars, you can use these. Keep these alarms close to you at all times at night. If we all do these small things they will not come into our areas as frequently as to be seen and then caught. They will move on to somewhere else. That is exactly what we want them out of here!!

The Board is seeking a volunteer to replace retiring Secretary Cheryl Williams. Those interested should contact Deborah Gray at 727-754-1227.

Our next regular Board Meeting will be Monday, November 3rd.

So join us at the Gateway clubhouse each and every Tuesday for another great year of Gateway Bingo.




