## TIE DOWN PROGRAM

Recently, William gave me paper work on Mobile Home Tie Down programs. What is a tie down--- tie-downs are systems of heavy-duty straps and anchors designed to stabilize manufactured homes (also known as mobile homes) during high winds.

The State of Florida has allocated grant money through a contract with Tallahassee Community College to implement the Manufactured Home Tie Down Enhancement Program. One of the eligibility requirements is homes must be built and installed prior to September 1999. Cost is free and covered by the grant. In the past, the cost of removal and re-installation of skirting on your home was not covered, it is now no cost to you.

I called the women in charge and found out that the quotas that they use to have no longer exist.

I have been speaking with the representative from Windstorm Mitigation, who is the company that does the installs. She likes to have is about 100 homes in a park for them to come out and do the installs of tie downs. If we can not get all 100, then we would be combined with another local park to make the 100. I do not know if we will have 100 participants, if not she said it can take a bit longer to pair us up with another park. I am working on getting information and more details together, at this time.

She will be coming to Gateway on September 6th, time to be announced. At that time, she will answer a lot of our questions. The forms also have eligibility requirements, what they will be doing and authorization to proceed consent form to sign to participate.

Forms will be available by the activities table in the Club House. For those who are not currently in the park, they will be available on line. You need to print the form out, and mail it back. You can mail it back to me at Jayne Naska 10640 Bay Street NE, St Petersburg FL 33716. Please do not e-mail it back. It was requested by the women in charge of the program to have all our forms mailed together at one time.

Meda O'Donnel (813) 309-3202) is one of our newer residence and she will be assisting and gathering forms. We also will try and survey the park and see if we can find home that do not have tie downs and inform them of the program.

## **No-See-Ems!**

Florida, unfortunately, is home not only for abundant mosquitoes, but also for minute biting insects known locally as "sandflies" (elsewhere as "no-see'ums" or "punkies"), although the more correct name is "biting midges." They are especially troublesome in coastal areas, where most of Florida's population lives.

#### **No-See-Em Repellents**

Avon Skin-So-Soft; Skin-So-Soft + Rubbing Alcohol (50/50 Spray); Sandalwood Incense & Oils; Manuka Oil (pricey); or this: Mix 1 cup of Original Listerine with 1 cup of witch hazel and 3 drops of tea tree oil, apply as spray every few hours. (Editors Note: Before you use any of these make certain you are not allergic to any of the ingredients they contain!)

Keep in mind the pipes supplying water to our homes and to water our lawns are old and not buried deeply in the ground. 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## A SUMMER OF CLEANUP AND REPAIR

A smany of you have come to know Kathy and I escape the heat and humidity of the Gateway summer at a riverside campground in East-central Ohio. For years it was a weekend retreat that was upgraded to accommodate full-time living when we retired in 2005. It has been the place of many enjoyable days, weeks and months of summer fun and relaxation. This brings us to my story. This past winter was quite unkind to the mid-western states. In

Ohio especially, the cold settled in around Thanksgiving and it did not warm again until the end of March. Typically, central Ohio experiences brief periods, usually a few days and at times a week each of the winter months when the Arctic cold is forced to retreat. Such was not the case this season. An extended near zero cold spell beginning in mid-December froze the river to a thickness of four feet. An ice dam formed and eventually raised the water and ice nearly 20 feet above the normal flow level. People staying at the campground were rescued by boats manned by local EMS personnel as the river rose nearly six feet in a matter of a few hours during the nighttime and early morning hours. All but six of the nearly forty homes at the campground were flooded. While our lot and ground level storage sheds flooded to a height of nearly three feet, our home itself was spared by mere inches. Two gas powered lawnmowers, a chain saw, electric tools and a variety of items were destroyed. The vinyl skirting surrounding our home was torn from the channels and scattered in neighbors yards and a field close by. A railroad tie and large tree branch debris were left under the home when the water receded and ice melted. Our boat dock, stored in the yard, was floated off it's supports and deposited in a field a halfmile from our lot. Neighbors lost entire trailers, pontoon boats, docks, decks, cars and trucks. Satellite dishes were crushed and rolled to resemble grey metal burritos as the mass of heavy ice was pushed into yards as the water rose. When the ice dams broke and water levels quickly fell the debris that had been collected was dropped where the thick blocks of ice came to rest. One person noted how the water level fell by nearly three feet in about 30 minutes on one occasion.

Kathy and I spent a February four-day weekend in Ohio, surveyed the damage and thus came to know how this would be a working rather than a vacation summer. I came north in late May, Kathy arrived early June and with weekend help of our son Michael and a great deal on a Craig's List mower, we are well on our way to having our lot and home in respectable looking condition.

I have little doubt we will be looking forward to returning to our Gateway home in September.
