What a Miracle is. A Hero, The power of your Prayers By Kurt Novakowski / as experiencing this miracle

rewent to Florida anticipating the sunshine as the weather was cooling in Pennsylvania in October. We planned to refurbish a mobile home coach we had purchased months earlier, so we would no longer rent during winters in Florida.

Gail was excited and happy as we arrived and could hardly wait to see the Gulf of Mexico off of Dunedin Florida. She and I love watching Pelicans, a Prehistoric bird that hardly seems they could actually fly. They are humorous to observe.

As we begin this season in a new environment not knowing anyone in the 55 and older mobile home park, whereas we were welcomed and befriended in the park we rented during the previous season.

In fact friends from Canada we had befriended had invited us to come up to visit them during August prompting us to obtain passports. We have a wonderful time whenever we get together. This becomes a very important element to a miracle which will be explained in this writing.

Months earlier in April, Gail began a cough and was not her energetic self. She went to a local Med Center and was told she had a small spot on her lung likely due to walking pneumonia for which she was treated. Advised to get a follow up x-ray when she would return home to Erie PA in May, which she did and was found clear by Hamot Imaging in Erie.

Having enjoyed a beautiful summer we now find ourselves in Florida on October 10th introducing ourselves to new neighbors and begin the renovation of our coach. Nearly two weeks later on the 22nd I asked Gail to return to the Med Center because she had reduced energy, was nauseated and was still coughing. I continued removing the ceiling of the coach as she was being reviewed. A short time later the phone rang and the Med Center asked that Gail call them as soon as she would return home.

Upon calling she was advised to get a CT scan which showed a 7.5 x 4.4 cm mass on upper left lung pressing against the aorta of her heart, and a second smaller mass and activity in one lymph node. And now the bad news having tried to get her scheduled with a pulmonologist to review the findings the soonest appointment would have to wait until November 16th which would only be an intake meeting to explain the findings. It is Amazing being told you are in a serious life threatening condition with no time to lose and three weeks delay placed in front of us. The Doctor's assistant advised us to walk into the Pulmonologist's office and plead for the Doctor to read the CT scan summary to determine if Gail could truly wait three weeks to be seen.

I called the receptionist and did as advised, The receptionist was kind and I took the report to her office. Gail would be seen in just two days, on October 28th Cutting three weeks off of the delay.

The next day Gail spoke with her family doctor and she scheduled a PET scan which shows ...Continued on page 12

the size of the large mass at 8.5 x 4.4 cm. The pulmonologist said "Very sorry no one is assured tomorrow, this is very bad for sure and would attempt to schedule a biopsy." He came back with again November 16th of which I protested as life threatening to wait. He apologized and repeated what he said earlier. "Very sorry, no one is assured tomorrow, but will try to move her up the schedule." I was flabbergasted!

The following day I called the Doctor's office pushing for an update in scheduling which eventually brought a new date of November 6th which was one week away but it was at least an improvement.

The weekend passed and on Monday November 2nd we received a call from the doctor that Gail's biopsy was canceled as a result of Doctor scheduling issues. And a new date would be sought.

Gail has a mass that grew from nothing in May to three and one half inches x 2 inches in five months time. With a second smaller breakaway mass and activity in one lymph node. Common sense told us this was a very aggressive cancer which would likely metastasize if she didn't get treatment immediately, and we sensed a nonchalant attitude implying she is wasting her time because she was beyond help.

With the biopsy now canceled and the pulmonologist attempting to reschedule a biopsy, I decided on Tuesday, November 3rd to call the Cleveland Clinic in Ohio and explain Gail's situation. Surprisingly, I received a return call and was informed Gail would be seen on Thursday at 8am in Cleveland. We immediate booked our flights and would board a plane the next day.

I have a friend who recommended an Outstanding Oncologist in Clearwater Florida whom saved his friend's life by removing a cancerous lung, so I called and scheduled an appointment for next Wednesday November 11th with the doctor because it could be weeks otherwise to get on his schedule.

We arrived at the airport only to discover that I left my wallet and ID at home as I changed clothes in a hurry and didn't empty my pockets. I was frantic as Gail stated she would not fly to Cleveland without me. And then she asked me if my US passport would suffice as identification? I asked her "you have my passport?" And she answered that she felt funny about leaving it at home in a drawer. This was the beginning of a miracle in process as I only obtained this passport two months prior and now it salvaged a very bad situation and got us on the plane to Cleveland.

We arrived at our hotel on Thursday at 1 am and we would see the Pulmonologist at 8 am. We awoke at 7am and went to the breakfast area where Gail placed a banana in her purse to eat later and she took one sip of orange juice as she bypassed eating anything, which was not like her.

Upon meeting Dr. Louis Lam at the Cleveland Clinic he explained the seriousness of the situation and pointed out the fact that it is not possible to obtain a biopsy on short notice as

surgery rooms are scheduled. However he would press to get her immediately scheduled. I explained she is scheduled in just 6 days with an oncologist in our hope to biopsy and get results in time. Dr. Lam stood up and said "wait here I will be back" and then left the room. A short time later an elder Doctor came into the room informing us that he was the senior fellow at the Clinic and Dr. Lam was on a mission that was not likely to succeed as biopsies are not performed on short notice. Being alone in the room I watched outside the upper floor window and could see Dr. Lam returning from a good distance across the Campus. Upon entering he asked Gail if she had eaten anything at all at breakfast and she said no. He said then she would have a Bronchoscopy performed at 4 o'clock. The senior fellow gasped as we were in tears of relief. It was explained it could not be done had she eaten anything.

Upon arriving at surgery, The Head of Surgery explained that Dr. Lam scrubbed and came into surgery and asked if he could have the room at the close of the day as he had a patient that must be done today. She explained that she owes him many favors and desires to hire him on her staff. She said yes and advised us that he has the calmest hands of any Doctor she has seen and would perform with her guidance. This is the second miracle as Dr. Lam is the only Doctor in Cleveland Clinic who could have accomplished this feat and Gail was placed in his midst. As I thanked him I observed such a peace I would swear he had the glow of an angel. I said Doctor I believe God has his hand on you. He did not speak as he humbly lowered his head.

Dr. Lam informed us that indeed the findings confirmed cancer was present and that the results would be expedited to meet Gail's appointment with her Oncologist on Wednesday morning. In such short time it could be difficult.

Gail and I Live one 100 miles away from Cleveland in Erie, PA, so we returned home over the weekend to inform our children and family that Gail had Lung Cancer in three locations including her left lung and lymph node. We were only home for the weekend and returned to Florida on Monday. We pursued the Pathology results for the oncologist meeting on Wednesday. Dr. Lam achieved another miracle as the results arrived ¹/₂ hour prior to our appointment time at 9am.on November 11th.

Meeting with the Oncologist was calming, as I said "Doctor this is going to be a very tough case" and he said "I don't mind resolving tough cases". He then went into the details and worked out a treatment plan which would include placing a port in her chest on Friday with Chemotherapy to begin on Monday November 16th. This is the very date we were to initially have our first meeting with the pulmonologist that proved slow in his actions. Dr. Lam cut at least one month or more of delay out of this process almost certainly preventing the cancer from further growth and spreading.

On Monday we met with the Oncologist and he did a final review and as we left his office he said "Ok, now let's go out there and kill some cancer." Then Gail sat on a couch for three hours with an IV drip of Chemotherapy. She would do this for three consecutive days. The plan would be every 21 days return for Chemo and blood work monitored continuous throughout the time.

Gail was nauseated and had low energy following her first three day regimen and then she had a most excruciating pain in her back which pulsed to a level 50 on a scale of ten. This is a side effect of Neulasta which is necessary to rebuild and stabilize blood counts.

On December 4th I went to our family doctor in Florida a very skilled female whom spoke with Gail and ordered her PET scan in advance of seeing the pulmonologist. I asked her without Gail present what she would do if she was to find herself in Gail's condition. Her answer was that she would do nothing and go on a very long vacation. I asked her seriously what she would do and she answered "seriously I would go on a long vacation".

Following Gail's 2nd three day Regimen of Chemo her nausea worsened and during the middle of the night she literally scared the dickens out of both of us as she vomited one quarter to one half cup of blood with tissue like in it. I called for help to the doctor on call but for some unexplained reason he did not get my message. Gail laid down and slept like a baby afterward and her coughing ended.

Her Nausea is now pretty much gone following the blood vomit experience and she actually was normalizing by going shopping again and picking up interest and going out and doing things. It turned out to be a blessing as she emptied out some cancer that night.

Neulasta as I explained has side effects and one such event is when Gail complained of her returned pain where she had broken her foot two years earlier. I found her a cane and we went to dinner. An hour later as we went to go home she handed me the cane and said all the pain is gone which had lasted approximately 2 hours. The same as her back pain which was mentioned earlier.

Third Chemo Regimen began on December 28th and here is the best part. Other than Gail's hair loss she has no noticeable sign of sickness or cancer. She had energy and her appetite was returning. We met with her oncologist and we discussed radiation which might be better to start while she was still doing well. Radiation will be added for six weeks to begin every day except weekends. Beginning January 11th

Gail was not nauseated or ill in any way, with Chemo and radiation at the same time. Her problems were blood counts and platelets fell to dangerous levels which make her anemic and could not allow a cut anywhere. And her white counts were so low she required a blood transfusion. But she was well in spite of this.

Blood count issues caused a delay in radiation treatment twice but that turned out to be a good thing as she did not suffer any issues with receiving radiation. Except three weeks after completion she asked me what the big round blotchy area was on her back. I laughed and said the equivalent of a peeling sunburn. She never even knew it.

On March 3rd, 2016 Chemo ended and radiation ended on the 12th. A CT scan was done on April 7th showing cancer appeared defeated. On June 21st a PET scan showed that Gail no longer has cancer and we will watch her like a hawk for five years.

Watch for the dangers of carbon monoxide

arbon monoxide (CO) is a colorless and nearly odorless gas created by the incomplete burning of solid, liquid, and gaseous fuels. It's poisonous to people and pets, so be careful. Symptoms of the poisoning are:

- Headache
- Fatigue
- Shortness of breath
- Nausea
- Dizziness

To prevent CO poisoning, take these precautions at work and at home:

- Buy and install a CO alarm. Make sure it meets safety requirements, and follow the directions for proper placement and installation.
- Install appliances properly. Most of them should be installed by a professional.
- Check your appliances. Have your heating system inspected and serviced every year.
- Only burn charcoal outdoors. Never burn it in a tent, home, garage, vehicle, etc.
- Make sure you turn off fuel-burning engine equipment when you are inside a garage or basement. Just having the doors open does not ensure your safety.
- Always follow the manual directions when servicing fuel-burning equipment.
- Do not use gas appliances, such as ranges, ovens or clothes dryers, to heat your home.
- If you use a fuel-burning appliance that is approved for indoors, make sure it is vented to the outside following the manufacturer's instructions.
- Install and use exhaust fans over gas stoves.
- Open flues when you use your fireplace.
- Choose the proper size wood-burning stove for your home.
- Have a professional inspect, clean and tune up your central heating system (furnaces, flues, and chimneys) annually.
