here are several reminders to all residents.

Your payments to PMI must be mailed by you. Please do not drop them off to the office, we stopped this policy about 7 years ago. You are responsible for getting it there on time, not us. Of course, there are exceptions when starting up with auto-debit.

Please let the office know in advance that you are renting your coach by filling out one of our simple forms. We need to know names and dates of arrival and departure. The forms are in the lobby of the office and on our web site.

Before you request a new shop key, please check to see if you possibly still have yours. It would be helpful to us, rather than continuously making new keys. Don't forget to sign the waiver yearly even if you still have your key.

Many of you may be cleaning out or doing remodeling. The City of Dunedin has an excellent service of providing dumpsters of several sizes. Simply call the office and we will request the dumpster for you, and you pay Golden Acres the fee. A two (2) yard dumpster (3 X 3 X 6) is \$50.64. If you have one or two large items of which you need to dispose, the city will pick these up as well. The office makes the arrangement and is usually the same day service. (cost \$15.82 for one large item) (No TV pickup) Best Buy will take these if you can take the item to the store.

Thank you all for signing into the office and clubhouse. PLEASE put your departure date even if you are not certain it can be an estimate. This information is for PMI so when they do their mailings, they know to which address they should be sending your mail.



NEA: Fewer Americans enjoy the arts in person

When was the last time you went to the symphony, the ballet, or a museum? A National Endowment for the Arts study points to a disturbing trend: The number of Americans attending core arts events like the opera, the theater, and other activities is on the decline.

According to "A Decade of Arts Engagement: Findings From the Survey of Public Participation in the Arts, 2002–2012," only 33.4 percent of U.S. adults attended any arts events between July 2011 and July 2012—down from 34.6 percent in 2008, and down yet again from a decade earlier when the figure was 39.4 percent.

One bright spot in the report: Although only a third of U.S. adults attended a cultural event in person, 71 percent said they had watched, listened to, or downloaded some kind of artistic event via the Internet. That includes streaming pop music, however, lumping Beethoven in with Nicki Minaj.




Americans upbeat about science





espite controversies and disagreements about climate change, genetically modified foods, animal testing, and other scientific issues, most U.S. citizens have a positive view of science and scientists, according to a study from the Pew Research Center.




The study found that 79 percent of U.S. adults believe science has made their lives better, and a majority of them have a positive view of science's impact on such matters as food quality, health care, and the environment. Additionally, 61 percent believe that government investment is essential to scientific progress, although 34 percent say that

private investment would be sufficient.

The effort to understand the universe is one of the very few things that lifts human life a little above the level of farce, and gives it some of the grace of tragedy.
