Help for Severe Aortic Stenosis



Severe aortic stenosis is a narrowed aortic heart valve that doesn't open and close properly, reducing blood flow to the rest of the body.

Morton Plant Hospital is now enrolling eligible patients in the Medtronic Evolut R low-risk trial, which investigates the safety and effectiveness of a transcatheter aortic valve replacement (TAVR) system in patients with severe aortic stenosis who are at a low surgical mortality risk. TAVR is a minimally invasive alternative to open-heart surgery used to treat failing aortic heart valves in patients with severe aortic stenosis. Morton Plant Hospital was chosen as the first hospital in Tampa Bay to offer the TAVR procedure for patients with severe aortic stenosis who were at an intermediate or high surgical mortality risk. Our team has completed more than 700 TAVR procedures over the last five years.

Technology changing our TV habits

The days of the whole family sitting around the TV watching the same show are over. We're still watching programming, but the options have boomed. According to The New York Times, the average American adult watches five hours and four minutes of TV per day, most of it live programming—about four and a half hours, with another 30 minutes coming from DVRs. That sounds like a lot, but it's actually down by 19 minutes from two years ago.

Most live programming is watched by people over 50. People 24 and under view about two fewer hours of live TV and DVR programming per week than they did in 2015. Millennials (25- to 34-year-olds) watch an hour less per week than that, down from 27.5 hours to 26.5. Viewers between 35 and 49 now mostly watch about 22 minutes less live programming per week.

Approximately 50 percent of U.S. households have subscriptions to online streaming services like Nextflix or Hulu. With tablets increasingly common—58 percent of U.S. homes have at least one—time spent consuming media on them has risen 63 percent from 2015.

Books: Not going away

S ince the rise of e-books and e-readers like the Kindle, pessimistic pundits have predicted that the physical book would soon become obsolete. That isn't happening yet, though. A study from the Pew Research Center found that 73 percent of Americans have read at least one book in the last 12 months (a number unchanged since 2012), and most of them

are reading print books: The survey found that 65 percent of Americans picked up a physical book when they read in the past year, far more than those who read at least one e-book (28 percent) or listened to an audiobook (14 percent).

We're living in a yoga nation now

Popularity. A 2016 survey by the Yoga Journal and Yoga Alliance found that some 36 million Americans practice yoga, up from 20.4 million in 2012. Yoga practitioners spent \$16 billion on classes, clothing, and equipment in 2016, an increase of \$10 billion from 2012.

Women make up 72 percent of yoga enthusiasts, although men are catching up. The survey found that 34 percent of Americans—approximately 80 million people—say they're likely to try yoga for the first time in 2017. The main reasons for doing yoga? Flexibility (61 percent), stress relief (56 percent), general fitness (49 percent), improved overall health (49 percent), and physical fitness (44 percent).

Take prompt action on eye injuries

Your eyes can be the most vulnerable parts of your body at work. Accidents like chemical splashes or bumps can happen all too easily, and the first aid that you apply to your eyes can mean the difference between minor eye damage and blindness. Here are recommended first-aid techniques for some common situations:

- Foreign objects. Don't rub your eyes. Instead, lift your upper eyelid outward and gently pull it over your lower lashes. This will cause your eyes to tear, which can wash out the foreign object. However, if an object is embedded in your eye, don't try to remove it—immediately seek medical attention.
- **Chemicals.** Immediately flush your eyes with cool water for at least 15 minutes. If possible, keep your head under a stream of water from the faucet, or slowly pour water from a cup to your eyes. If you wear contacts, remove them immediately and then flush your eyes. See a doctor right away.
- Cut or penetration. Gently cover your eye with a bandage or gauze and go to a nearby hospital. Don't try to flush it with water, remove the object, or apply medication.
