t the Shareholder's Budget Meeting held on December 17, 2019, there were 178 shareholders represented by 119 proxies with 59 signed in. The shareholders voted to adopt the proposed Budget.

Running for the Board of Directors

The first notice of the Annual Meeting to be held on February 18, 2020 will be mailed or distributed to all shareholders on or before December 18, 2019. This notice describes the procedure to be followed in qualifying to run for the Board of Directors. At that Annual Meeting it will be necessary to elect two directors to our Board. The terms of Paul Carter and Dennis Dufault will expire in February, 2020. This means there will be 2 positions on the board that you will be voting for at our Shareholders Annual meeting in February.

Important: Your notice of intent to run must be back to the office on or before January 9th, 2020 to be eligible.

NOTICE FROM THE BOARD of DIRECTORS:

From the GOLDEN GATE MASTER OCCUPANCY AGREEMENT ARTICLE ELEVEN ALTERATIONS TO THE UNIT

The Resident shall not, without first obtaining the written consent of the Corporation, alter in any way the unit, or add to the mobile home presently located upon the unit or any of its fixtures and appurtenances. The Resident shall not change the color of the mobile home located on the premises, or substantially alter its outward appearance without first having obtained written approval thereof from the Directors.



From the Golden Gate Rules and Regulations

16. HOME SITES: All homes must have their house number visible on the front of the home. Each shareholder is responsible for the neat and orderly appearance of his or her premises at all times. No outside storage is permitted around or under your home. If the home is not maintained in accordance with general established standards set by the Association (i.e., in a run-down condition or is in general disrepair), the shareholder shall be subject to the provisions of Article 3 of these rules. Each shareholder is responsible for the condition of his planter boxes, fruit trees and plantings at all times. Lower branches of fruit trees must be trimmed to a minimum of 48 inches from the ground. Our Board of Directors or their appointee(s) have the authority to designate those residences which are not properly maintained. Flowers, plants, trees, and shrubs enhance the appearance of your lot but a permit is required from the Association before planting other than in planters. The Association is responsible for lawn mowing and maintaining the Association planted trees. Trash and recycle pickup will be established according to city guidelines. Residents are requested to refrain from putting garbage out at the curb the night before, unless in a secure covered receptacle, and are also requested to promptly remove any trash receptacles after pickup. The trash receptacles should not block driveways or sidewalks. Any additions or revisions to your exterior property, including outside painting of any type, must be approved by the Board of Directors and a permit obtained from the office before starting work. The permit must be displayed in a clearly visible area. No fences permitted without approval of Board of Directors. Federal and State laws allow for the installation of satellite antennas 1 meter or less in diameter, but permission from the Board of Directors must be obtained first. Only umbrella type drying lines may be used and should be set in the back of home. No clothes hanging on the carport, including swimwear. Water, sewer, and garbage pickup charges are billed to the individual shareholder by the City of Pinellas Park on a monthly basis. Shareholders are to adhere to county and city water conservation rules. Irrigation and/or other watering must be done by a handheld hose; no automated sprinklers permitted. The Association shall have the right at any time to cause the water to be individually metered at each mobile home. No new wells are permitted. No resident or guest may engage in any type of commercial business in the community. Patio or rummage sales are permitted with approval of the Board of Directors. The Association reserves the right to enforce the rules and regulations at the shareholders' expense should they not be adhered to. Residents leaving for the summer or extended periods of time should obtain a form from the office, completing each item, and returning the completed form to the office. If a shareholder does not provide for the care of these items in his/her absence, the Association will have the work done, and the Unit will be assessed at the rate of \$25.00 per hour with a two hour (\$50.00) minimum per occurrence. There will be NO exemptions from billing for City utilities unless the home is unoccupied for the entire month and the sign out procedure with the office has been completed.

Please remember that bicycles are vehicles and must obey all traffic laws including stopping at all stop signs. If you are riding a bike or driving a golf car at night you should have lights on so others can see you!

Just a reminder, while driving around the community there were several homes that did not have the street numbers visible from the street. This could be a problem should Pinellas Park Statutes mandates that all homes MUST have their street numbers Visible from the street.

Parking Request

henever you, your guests, or contractors need to park out on the street, please follow Community Rules!

No parking on the sidewalks. Your maintenance fees pay for all repairs.

Please use common sense and do not park near or on corners or close to intersections. We would encourage parking on the same side of the street to avoid traffic having to "zig-zag" to get by. This causes obstructions and creates a dangerous situation for cars, golf carts and bicycles trying to proceed by the vehicles.

Recycling on Wednesday

<u>No plastic bags please!</u>

Aluminum Cans-Empty aluminum cans used for drinks or food. Rinse and crush if possible.

Cartons – Empty gable-top beverage containers such as milk, half and half or orange juice cartons. Rinse and crush if possible.

Glass – Empty glass bottles or jars (all colors). Labels okay. No caps or lids.

Mixed Paper – Any clean, dry paper item that tears, such as white or colored paper, shredded paper, office paper, magazines, catalogs, phone books, junk mail, envelopes, wrapping paper, or paperboard items such as cereal boxes. No paper towels or tissues.

Newspapers – Clean and dry newspapers (including inserts). No string or twine. It's okay to put the news¬papers inside a paper bag.

Plastic Bottles – Empty bottles such as water, soda or mouthwash bottles. Rinse and crush if possible. No need to check for a number—just "check for a neck" (i.e., an opening smaller than the base). Bottles only; no tubs, cups or bags. Labels okay. Caps okay but remove the cap from the bottle so that liquids dry out. Place the cap and the bottle in the bin.

Steel (Tin) Cans – Empty steel cans used for food such as soup cans. Labels and lids okay. No paint cans. Aerosol cans okay. Rinse if possible.

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




