FROM YOUR BOARD OF DIRECTORS

t the Annual Shareholders Meeting held on February 16, 2016 there were 98 shareholders signed in with 77 others represented by proxies to create a quorum. There was an election for Board of Directors held and Jim Alaimo will join the Board with a three year term, having won the election over Delores Hathaway. The Board of Directors meeting was held in conjunction with the Annual Meeting. Our financial report for the month of January, 2016 indicates that income for the month was \$33,641 with expenditures of \$37,373. The financial statement for each month is posted on the bulletin board at the rear of the hall for everyone to review. Officers were elected for the following year as follows: Paul Carter – President, Mike Sorenson – Vice President, Don Kuzmickas – Treasurer, Dennis Dufault – Secretary, Jim Alaimo – Director.









FROM THE OFFICE

Here are a few reminders for your attention:

* * * * * * * * * * * * * * * *

• Please remember to sign out in the office. Your signature is needed to stop the Water/Sewer/Trash Bill. Per the Golden Gate Rules & Regulations: (#16 Home sites): Shareholders will be exempt from billing for City utilities for any month which the home is occupied less than 7 days providing the sign out procedure with the office has been properly completed. There is a city charge of \$25 to reactivate the water bill.

- When signing out please check to make sure we have an "away" contact number and address to reach you.
- "Weeds Needs" Once again, the Weed program is available for \$40.00. This covers spraying for weeds in your front planters from May through September. If you choose not to participate or if someone is watching out for the upkeep of your property, if there is an issue, the "Friendly Reminder" will be sent to you. Please accept the reminder in the spirit it was intended.....just a friendly notice that your property may need a little attention.
- Hurricane Season Please put away or secure all outside items that may become a projectile during a Hurricane. Even items that you may think are heavy (patio chairs/ tables, flower box pots or ornaments, etc.) will become airborne in 40+ mph winds. Your neighbors appreciate your consideration. It also does not invite potential thieves in to take your "stuff".
- Don't forget to get a forwarding mail package from either the mail man or there is a limited supply in the Office. If you do forget, you can forward your mail on-line at www. usps.gov.

This is probably a good time to give a refresher on how the Water/Sewer/Trash bills work. If you are here more than 6 days in a calendar month, you will get a bill from the city. The bill date is always 1 month past the usage month. For example, if you were here more than 6 days in April, you will get a bill in May, with a bill date of May. The payment will be due in June. To make it a little more confusing, if you have an electronic debit from your checking account, you will see the payment in June, (because that is the due date) for April's usage. Hope this helps....if not give Jane a call.

WEED PROGRAM

s most of you are aware, we have a problem with the growth of weeds during the summer months, typically May through September. The weed problem we are concerned about is in the planter boxes and the front of the homes. Even those homes that have mulch or stones in the planter boxes will have weed growth.

The board does send "friendly reminders" to alert residents as stated in rule #16..."Each shareholder is responsible for the neat and orderly appearance of his or her premises at all times. However, the general response to the friendly reminders has been less than satisfactory.

We would like to aid in solving this problem by having our maintenance staff spray weed killer in the planter boxes or in front of the home for any resident that desires to participate. There will be a \$40.00 per year fee to cover the cost of the material for spraying from May through September. If you wish to participate in this program, send a check or pay cash to Jane in the office. However, if you have ornamental plants that could be harmed by the spraying, you will have to make other arrangements, since we will not be responsible for any damages.

If you choose not to participate, the weed issue for planters and the front of your home will continue to be your responsibility, and be subject to the terms of rule #16 concerning work done in your absence.

Tractice discs vs competition discs

When the white discs were purchased, a suggestion was made to "season" the discs by using them for practice. Later a decision was made



• "season" the discs by using them for practice. Later a decision was made to have the discs professionally seasoned by the disc vendor, and that was done. Currently there is no reason to use the white competition discs for any practice by anyone. These discs should be kept in the best waxed condition for tournaments and competitions and not be beat up by novices in practice. Too many times teams have been preparing for a match and the discs are in no condition to be used in match play, and recently they were in use by friendship members up until the visiting team arrived to compete in the nova league. 



Mission to gravity: Space probe searches for waves

European space probe will try to confirm a theory about gravity developed by Albert Einstein, according to the Reuters website. Launched late last year, the LISA (Laser Interferometer Space Antenna) Pathfinder will assume an orbit between the Earth and our sun, collecting data about gravity waves.



Einstein predicted the existence of ripples of gravity that bend space and time some 100 years ago, but finding those ripples on Earth has been impossible. The space-based experiment will monitor two cubes of a goldplatinum alloy to determine whether they maintain their distance from each other in free fall. The results will allow scientists to observe minute oscillations caused by gravity waves.
