This causes obstructions and creates a dangerous situation for cars, golf carts and bicycles trying to proceed by the vehicles.

Do not confront the solicitors.

The Board of Directors' Meeting is the third Tuesday of the month and the agreement with the publisher gives us up to the day after the meeting to deliver copy to be published. If you don't have a computer you may continue to deliver a double-spaced paper copy, again, preferably by the Monday before the third Tuesday of the month.

<u>Light up at Night</u>

<u>Open Door Policy</u> The Board of Directors at Golden Gate have always had an "open door policy". There are a number of ways for you to discuss any Community issue with them either during the summer months or during the peak season. At least one Director is in the office between the hours of 9:00 AM and 11:00 AM that you can request to speak to; you can write a letter or email, or



there are intake forms to submit issues that will be kept confidential and responded to, and they conduct Director's Workshops on Thursday mornings at 9:30 AM to discuss, plan and schedule work programs on items as they arise. A notice of these workshops is posted on the bulletin board by the Tuesday of the week they are scheduled (if required).

As you know, being on the Board is a volunteer job. Please utilize any way listed above to bring issues to their attention. Please respect that outside of these venues, they are retired citizens just like you and enjoy their "free" time with their spouses in this beautiful Community you all enjoy.

WEED PROGRAM

As most of you are aware, we have a problem with the growth of weeds during the summer months, typically May through September. The weed problem we are concerned about is in the planter boxes and the front of the homes. Even those homes that have mulch or stones in the planter boxes will have weed growth.

The board does send "friendly reminders" to alert residents as stated in rule #16..."Each shareholder is responsible for the neat and orderly appearance of his or her premises at all times. However, the general response to the friendly reminders has been less than satisfactory.

We would like to aid in solving this problem by having our maintenance staff spray weed killer in the planter boxes or in front of the home for any resident that desires to participate. There will be a \$40.00 per year fee to cover the cost of the material for spraying from May through September. If you wish to participate in this program, send a check or pay cash to Jane in the office. If you choose to participate in this program, our maintenance staff will spray, beginning in May and ending in September. However, if you have ornamental plants that could be harmed by the spraying, you will have to make other arrangements, since we will not be responsible for any damages. If you choose not to participate, the weed issue for planters and the front of your home will continue to be your responsibility, and be subject to the terms of rule #16 concerning work done in your absence.

The Office will be closed on Fridays through August 31, 2018. Please plan to conduct any office business you may have from Monday through Thursday during this time period. Don't forget, there is a self –serve copy machine in the hall near the entrance to the Patio for your use. 

The cost of dry cleaning around the world

ave you ever wondered how much dry-cleaning a suit costs around the world? Maybe not, but the online dry cleaning service Zipjet did, and it looked at 100 cities around the world to find the answer.

The most expensive city for dry cleaning a two- or three-piece suit is Oslo, Norway, where the cost is \$52.03 in U.S. dollars. The cheapest is Jakarta, Malaysia, at \$2.20. Chicago ranks 53rd, with a cost of \$12.72.

Russia is the biggest user of dry cleaning services, spending \$3,265,888,189 annually. The United States comes in second, at \$3,029,470,494, followed by Brazil in third place, at \$1,065,702,298. Of 10 countries surveyed, Canada spends the least—\$500,834,651.

A recent survey by Decluttr.com found that Americans have some \$33 billion worth of discarded technology lying around, with the average U.S. home hanging onto \$264 worth of unused tech. • Almost 60 percent of U.S. homes with more than two unused cell phones (Apple and



Samsung, mostly).

• Thirty percent of people who say they keep their old phones for backup, and 30 percent who don't want to risk losing control of their personal information.

• Other devices, such as cameras (40 percent), PCs (25 percent), consoles (10 percent), and iPods, tablets and more (10 percent).

Keep your dog safe in hot weather

ogs are often like members of the family, so you will want to treat them with care during hot weather. Here are a few tips to keep your four-legged friends happy and healthy:

• Never leave your dog—or any animal—in the car during hot or even warm weather. The interior temperature of your car can easily soar to 120 degrees in just minutes. The only way dogs can cool down is by panting and through the pads of their feet. Many animals die every year because their owners leave them in cars. Even if you leave the windows partially down, the temperatures can soar to dangerously high levels.

• Don't let your dog ride in the bed of a pickup truck. Serious eye injuries can occur from debris hitting their eyes at up to 70 miles per hour. The dog could also be thrown into oncoming traffic or could fall underneath the truck and be injured. Serious injury or death can also occur when a driver hits the brakes suddenly, swerves, or is hit by another vehicle.

• Keep your dog away from fertilizers, plant foods, and insecticides. They can be fatal if your pet ingests them. Don't let your pet walk or play on a treated lawn.

• Make sure your pet always wears an ID tag. Even if your dog has an embedded identification chip, you'll still want to make sure it has a tag so that he can be returned quickly to you if it is found. It's also a good idea to keep a current picture of your pet with you. That way, if it disappears or wanders off, you have a photo to show to people when you ask them if they've seen your dog.

• Give your dog prescribed heartworm medicine on a regular basis. It is also a good practice to use only flea and tick medications prescribed by your dog's veterinarian.



• Make sure your pet has plenty of water and shade outdoors. You'll also want to make sure your dog isn't walking on hot asphalt when the heat is high, because it can burn its paws.

Good health is not something we can buy. However, it can be an extremely valuable savings account.

New initiative in the hunt for E.T.

The search for extraterrestrial life is moving to a new, more ambitious phase, reports an article on the Independent website. Up until now, scientists have been restricted to surveying a relatively small area of the sky, studying stars only a few light-years from Earth. A new project, called Breakthrough Listen, will use new technology at the Parkes telescope in Australia to scan a much wider area of the sky more quickly than before.

The Parkes telescope and others will gather 1,500 hours of data in 2018, then analyze it for any phenomena that appear artificial—while ruling out activity from Earth.

The project is one of several from Breakthrough, one of which includes a plan to send small spacecraft on deep-space missions far from Earth.
