Staying Healthy

S taying healthy today can be as easy as drinking more tea. Did you know that both green and black tea contains a concentrated dose of caechins, which are substances that help blood vessels relax and protect your heart. In a study of more than 40,500 Japanese men and women, those who drank 5 or





more cups of green teas every day had the lowest risk of dying from heart disease and stroke. Other studies involving black tea showed similar results. You only need 1 or 2 cups of tea daily to start doing your heart some good, but just make it a fresh brew. Ready-to-drink teas don't offer the same health benefits.

"Once water is added to tea leaves, their catechins degrade within a few days" says Jeffrey Blumberg, PhD, a professor of nutrition science and policy at Tufts University.


Also, some studies show that adding milk might eliminate tea's protective effects on cardiovascular system, so stick to lemon or honey.

Spotlight on IITS Residents Don and Alta Keith, #177

If you want to have a conversation with a couple whose life is centered around the family, stop and talk to Don and Alta Keith. They have been married for 61 years and have 2 sons and 2 daughters, eight grandchildren, and 8 great grandchildren. It is difficult keeping up with them, especially Alta, when the conversation centers around the family. They have a beautiful rug/blanket wall hanging showing pictures of their extensive family and many photo albums of their family.

Don is a proud Marine veteran and he served our country for 2 1/2 years in a burial detail. He had to attend two months of training before conducting burials. His service included 89 burials of service men from Virginia, West Virginia and North Carolina.



Don played professional hockey for 5 years, first with the Boston Olympics and then with the Springfield Indians. They had 2 or 3 children by that time and every weekend he would come home after playing with "something" broken. Alta finally said "enough" and he gave up his hockey career.

Don and Alta moved here from Stow, Massachusetts in 1984 and their home was the third one in our park. Even though they are on Leeward, the land was so barren that they could see clear through to Drew Street.

Because of Don's background in carpentry, the 3 original owners of the park approached him and asked him to be the manager. At that time, 2-3 houses were coming in daily and he directed the builders to the appropriate sites. The owners

then asked him to also be the pool manager. When the number of homes reached 80, Don had been the park manager and pool manager, for 2 years, as well as working with builders on the installation of homes. That was when he decided it was time to retire again. In recent years, Alta served as a Director on the Homeowner's Association for 3 years. As you can see, they have both been positive influences to our community.

Both Don and Alta were teachers. Don retired in 1984 as a high school teacher at a vocational school in Massachusetts, teaching carpentry; Alta was a teacher at Skycrest Elementary School on Drew Street from 1984 - 2003, and then substitute taught until 2013 when she retired.

The Keith's used to travel to Cape Cod every summer until health concerns slowed those trips down. They also used to go to the beach about 3 times a week. This was when Alta was still teaching. After the students left, Alta would change into her swimsuit in a closet and Don would pick her up and off they would go.

Alta says Don is obsessed with Amaryllis plants and has over 100 in his back yard. Alta loves the social life here - potlucks, Halloween parties, and especially the pool which she says is her stress-reliever. Alta's obsessions include scrapbooking of family pictures, on the computer with family, and keeping a journal "only positive things - no bad". They are a delightful couple and a very positive asset to our neighborhood.

Save a life: Recognize the symptoms of stroke

Every minute matters when someone suffers a stroke. Prompt medical attention can make a huge difference in whether the person lives or dies, as well as in the quality of his or her recovery. Be alert for these warnings signs so you can take fast action:

- Difficulty walking. The person may appear dizzy, off-balance, or uncoordinated on his or her feet.
- Speech problems. Stroke can affect a person's ability to remember words or pronounce them correctly, making him or her seem confused or intoxicated.
- Drooping face. One side of the person's face may droop or look frozen.
- Difficulty with arm movements. Ask the person to lift both arms. An inability to raise his or her hands may indicate a stroke.
- Headache. Stroke can cause a sudden, severe headache accompanied by nausea or vomiting. If you observe, or experience, any of these symptoms, seek medical help right away.
