Cal Am has expressed an interest in sharing more cost to present monthly events which will allow greater upscale events and more utilization of the club house more during the day.

Meet your neighbor-Jessie Forcan

Interviewed by Pat Henderson

Jessie Forcan, lot #203, a longtime resident of IITS, was born and grew up in Bosnia, and came to the United States in 1975 with her husband and two children. She worked as a buyer for a large company in the north. In spite of being half a world away from anyone she knew, she raised her children and was successful throughout the hardship, without the help of a husband or family. She is very proud of the way her son and daughter turned out, but does not have any grandchildren. She holds a Master's Degree in Graphic Arts from the University of Belgrade and has been a graphic designer.

After Jessie's children grew up, she came to the bay area on vacation and fell in love with Florida. She owned an interior design



business in Largo for 15 years, so switched from buying to selling and was successful in her business. She is now a full time volunteer activist.

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Jessie has always had an interest in environmental and community issues. She attended the Clearwater Academy 101 where she learned a lot about our city government and how it works. That knowledge has led her to get involved in surrounding communities as well. She is a member of the Florida Grassroots Democrats as well as local Women's Democrat group. She has volunteered to register people to vote and has worked at helping those with criminal records to get rehab and become eligible to vote again. She shook hands with several of our U.S. Presidents and has had her picture taken with a Vice President. Because of her affiliation with local politics she even gets an annual Christmas card from the White House personally signed by the President and each family member.

Years ago when the City of Clearwater picked up recycling, they only picked up paper and aluminum. Jessie would pick up the cardboard, glass and hazardous waste left at curbside and deliver it to the recycle center. Jessie arranged for a representative from the Solid Waste Dept. of Clearwater to come to our park and explain "Single Stream Recycling" and how to properly dispose of hazardous waste. Jessie was responsible for getting recycle containers for our park.

Because of her love for animals, Jessie is a member of the Audubon Society, National Parks, Wilderness Society and Moccasin Lake. She picks up injured birds and animals and transports them to the proper places for treatment and care. She worked with the city engineering dept. and got duck crossing signs put up on Hampton Rd. near Gulf to Bay.

Jessie is a member of the Florida Sun coast Sierra Club and was recently awarded the "Black Bear" award that is given once a year to the "super volunteer" of the year. She feels that this is one of her greatest accomplishments, and is humbled by this recognition.

Jessie is constantly looking for ways to volunteer and give back to the community. She is currently working with city Code Enforcement and Bay Care Corporate behind the park to prevent Bay Care's bright parking lot lights from shining into homes on St. Martin St.


Jessie was able to convince the city to mark turn lanes on Hampton Rd. so that cars could enter and exit our park safely.

In addition to all her volunteering, Jessie makes a trip back and forth daily from her 10 acre farm in Hudson to tend to the chickens, horses, dogs, and cats, mostly rescued animals.

If you don't know Jessie, you should get acquainted as I have. She has a "heart of gold", a good sense of humor, has had an interesting life and she is passionate about the causes she believes in. She hopes someday to record for her children, the "ups and downs" of her overcoming being an immigrant.



HOUSEHOLD HINTS

To keep away mice and snakes, keep fruit picked up from your yard that has fallen from trees. Scatter moth balls underneath your home, or plant mint around your foundation.

To scare away intruders, place your car keys next to your bed at night before falling asleep. If you hear strange noises, hit the alarm button on your key fob as this will scare them away and alert your neighbors to look out their windows.

For your safety, place your cell phone and flashlight on your bedside table upon retiring. Your phone will be handy if you become ill and need to call for help and you may need the flashlight in case of power failure during the night. Good idea to have a key hidden outside so emergency workers could get to you

To clean food burnt or stuck on pots and pans, put a small section of a fabric softener sheet in the pan with a bit of detergent and hot water, and let it sit several hours or overnight. The softener will loosen every bit of the food, making the pot easy to wash. I cut a fabric sheet into 6 little sections and keep them handy in a kitchen drawer.

Create other uses for those small appliances, mix your combread batter and pour it into your waffle maker (mine is heart shape). It makes cute little combread sections to eat with a nice bowl of soup. Put a tortilla in the waffle maker with some cheese, chicken, peppers, onions, etc. Put another tortilla on top and make a Mexican quesadilla.

Use your George Forman grill, and make a grilled cheese or pannini sandwich. Layer meat, cheese and whatever else you like between any bread of choice. Grill it and serve with a big dill pickle and some chips.

If you like sweet tea, use juice leftover from canned fruit such as peach, pear, pineapple, fruit cocktail, etc. and pour into your tea to sweeten. You can always add more sugar or sweetener if needed. A fruity tea can be very refreshing, especially on a hot summer day.

Use leftover food to make TV dinners, Pick up divided containers, fill with leftover meat and veggies and freeze for later use. Handy for quick meals if one spouse is away or hospitalized. You can even take one to a neighbor or shut-in to share. Don't throw away a few spoonfuls of meat or vegetable. Keep a quart size container in the freezer to toss in leftovers. Cut whatever leftovers into bite size pieces before dumping in the **soup pot**.

It is good to start a soup pot with a leftover beef or pork roast with veggies, then just keep adding other leftovers. This can create a very interesting, inexpensive, and tasty soup for a cool fall day with a good loaf of bread and a small salad. Mixing several kinds of meat with assorted kinds of vegetables makes for a good meal.

The first time I met the Dennison's was St. Patricks' Day in 2014. Ed and Helen were dressed to the nines in Irish Green. Helen sang an Irish song - "you can tell that I'm Irish by the way that I walk...." She had on layers of green clothing. Wish I had video-taped it so I could quote more of it. That was my first impression of Helen. She is also the lady behind the camera for so many of the pictures in the park. Helen said her philosophy is ABC - Always Bring Camera. Very interesting lady. And what about Ed? My first recollection of this soft-spoken gentleman was playing dominos. He seems to always



have a smile. What an interesting couple - they are Christians and don't hesitate to tell you so.

Ed and Helen will celebrate their 62nd anniversary in June. They were married when Helen was just 16 years old. They have five kids, 15 grandchildren and one on the way; and 16 great grandchildren. When they lived up north in the big Cape Cod home built by their own four hands, all of the family gatherings were hosted by them. They lived in that home for 51 years. Helen said it got to be too much hosting the family dinners and they decided to make the move to Florida. Ed loves it here and said he has wanted to live in Florida since he was 16 years old.

Ed raised homing pigeons for 55 years when they were up north, starting when he was 11 years old. He sometimes had 300 at a time. He once won "Best Tumbler" in a competition which is a pigeon that flies and then starts flipping as it spirals downward and then it starts flying again. Ed's pigeons never had lice which is deadly for them. His secret was that he bought a pack of cigarettes for 13 cents and soaked them. Then he used an eye dropper to put the tobacco juice under the wings of his pigeons and chickens. Other kids didn't do that and their birds would always get lice and die. When Ed retired, he sold all of his pigeons because they needed food, water and tending and Ed couldn't do that if he traveled. He said it took about 5 months to finally get them all placed; the problem - they kept coming home.

Ed retired from the railroad business at age 62 after 34 1/2 years. 14 1/2 years was in the office and the remaining 20 years was outside night work as a Lineman/Engineer. Helen was a school bus driver for 27 years and said she should have had combat pay. Once she even had her hair set on fire. Ed's dad was a carpenter and Ed learned the skill, he could build or fix anything. He now has learned to hire others to do what he once did himself.

Ed and Helen both like to fish. They go to Safety Harbor, Passe Grille, Redington - anywhere that they can place their chairs and cast off. Sometimes they catch and keep to eat; other times they catch and release. Helen also likes to crochet and do scrapbooking. Without looking at her, he quietly retorted, "You lose."

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
