Please remember to call me if you have news of a death or a concern. The friends in our park are concerned about their neighbors. Keep us informed.



#### **Spotlight on IITS Resident - Rex Plent**

R ex Plent lives at #172 and has been a resident of IITS for 22 years. He was Secretary of the HOA from 2002-2004 and was a handyman, helping other residents with electrical and plumbing needs, among other chores.

Rex Windsor Richard Plent was born in Liverpool, Lancashire, England in 1933, named after the King of England. He attended an all boy's school which he blames for his shyness. Rex wrote his "Memoirs of an Englishman, Now a Proud American" in 2013. This very detailed writing describes his life as a young boy during the war years of 1939-1945. He tells of picking

up pieces of bombs and shells in the yard after a night of bombing and of spending many nights in a room under the stairs that his father had lined with mattresses.

Rex moved to New Jersey with his family in 1947 when he was 14 years old. He got a job pumping gas when he was 16 years old, which he attributes to his career in the auto repair business. In 1953 Rex was drafted into the U.S. Army and served in Germany for 2 years. He was a Corporal in charge of the motor pool. In 1955 his Company Commander called him into his office and asked if he was a U.S. citizen. Rex told him he was not but had applied for citizenship before he was drafted.

As a British citizen he should not have been drafted. Rex was only 2 months from getting out of the Army. His Captain ordered a jeep to take him to the American Embassy in Stuttgart and that's where he became a citizen of the United States!

Rex owned "Rex's Texaco Service, when he met his wife, Norma. Norma had three children from a previous relationship. When they married, Rex had a ready-made family. Rex and Norma subsequently had a son named Richard who was born in 1960. They also had a daughter in 1966, Heidi, who died at birth. Rex was also service manager for several car dealerships, including Dimmit, Bay Cadillac, and Quinlan Chevrolet.

In addition to the various auto related jobs Rex had, he and Norma had a very lucrative antiques business both up north and here in Florida. Their place was called the "House of Plent-y." When they sold their business and moved to IITS, many of their antiques came with them. If you were ever fortunate enough to be in their home, you were certainly amazed by all that was there. And they could both tell you the history of every piece!

Rex was diagnosed with leukemia in 1988. Fortunately, this turned out to be an incorrect diagnosis. However, Rex was diagnosed with colon cancer in 2010 and that diagnosis was correct. Rex had surgery and chemotherapy treatment. Norma was also sick during this time and passed away on January 14, 2012. Their son, Richard, died just over a year later in 2013. Rex's cancer returned last summer and he has chosen to forego any further treatment. He has regular visits from a Hospice volunteer and his daughter, Mary. Rex says that he wants whoever reads his Memoirs to know that he has been through a lifetime of sorrows and regrets but he also has memories that have given him hope, love, enjoyment, and a beautiful family.

#### Horses can't talk, but they do communicate—with each other

No one can talk to a horse, of course (as the theme song for TV's Mr. Ed tells us), but horses can communicate with each other. Not by talking, but with their eyes and ears.

Scientists at the University of Sussex have observed that ear position is an important visual signal that horses see and respond to. In a study, they posted life-sized photographs of horses between two feeding buckets. The photo would show which bucket the horse was watching. As part of the test, the scientists blocked physical cues from the pictures, particularly views of the eyes and ears.

Their findings indicated that horses depend on the orientation of other horses' heads to locate food, an ability they lose when those cues aren't visible. The results seem to dispute the common theory that animals whose eyes are on the sides of their heads can't pick up information based on the direction of each other's heads.

While some communities have a volunteer fire department, here at Island in the Sun we have a volunteer security department, consisting of one fine resident. His name is Stan Baldwin, Lot 156. This was not a posted position; no one asked him to do it; Stan took it upon himself to fill what he saw as a need to protect our residents, especially those more vulnerable.

Several years ago and prior to Cal-Am being here, there was a subsidized housing complex behind our community that caused IITS to set up a visible security system to deter wrongful activity. Residents would sign up and work shifts by driving around the park looking for suspicious activity and sitting in the parking lot monitoring cars that came in. Residents had stickers on their car to assist in the monitoring effort. The security "guard" had a magnetic security card on their vehicle and a phone to call authorities when necessary.

At that time, Stan worked for the City of Dunedin's Street Department, working on trees, asphalt, concrete, etc. Stan worked that job Monday through Thursday for 12 years and then would volunteer for IITS security every Friday and Saturday night.

Prior to that, Stan was in the Army and retired after 20 years of service. He was in Viet Nam for 1 year, a place he described as a very bad place. Stan's experiences in Viet Nam caused him to suffer from post traumatic stress disorder for a period of time. He also suffers from Agent Orange to this day. After he retired from the Army, he worked for the National Guard for 1 year and then as a recruiter in Cadillac, Michigan for 7 years.

Stan and Bonnie came to Florida when Bonnie's mother was ill and subsequently decided to make their home here. He then became a part-time training NCO in St. Pete until his retirement. Stan and Bonnie have been married for almost 50 years.

On his own initiative, Stan has continued to drive our community several times a day. He is often called by one of our residents with a concern and he will check out the complaint or follow a suspicious vehicle and has often scared them out of the park.

In addition to the volunteer work Stan does for us, he goes to the American Legion Post in Safety Harbor every day and picks up their cardboard. He keeps it in his truck until he has a full load and then takes it to the recycle center. This task saves the American Legion Post approximately \$100.00 monthly.

Stan's word of advice to our residents: "If you don't have a sticker on your vehicle(s), you should go to the office and get one." The make, model, year, and license plate number is given to Cal-Am and a sticker is then issued. He said Cal-Am also has a dashboard placard that should be used for overnight guests. This would make Stan's service to us much easier. When you see Stan driving around, give him a thumbs up or thank you of some sort for all that he does.




