GO AHEAD ... BURN THAT FLAG...

o ahead burn that flag, I won't stop you. You have the "privilege" to disrespect that flag and make your statement. I will turn my back and walk away, I will not be part of your audience.

But, before you do can we sit down and talk for a minute, the way civilized, mature, educated people do when they get to enjoy their freedoms and rights that so many others never will? It is because of what that flag represents and the sacrifices made, that you can stand here and destroy it.

You should note that I used the word privilege in the lead to describe burning the flag because there is big difference between a right and a privilege, which is hardly ever brought out in our every-day lives.

Rights are something that humans worldwide are born with, including the right to a clean, safe environment that should allow us to exist and prosper. Another right is to be allowed to provide food and shelter for ourselves. We have very few actual rights, but no one can legally or morally take them away from us.

A privilege is something that is normally granted by our respective government, religion, parents and other such authorities. It is very seldom ever distinguished in our lives because we hear phrases such as, the right to vote, the right to own a hand gun, the right to an abortion, the right to burn a flag and freedom of speech. But, let us not forget these rights were granted to us under the American constitution and they could be rescinded at any time.

Even though it is extremely unlikely to happen, our government could say if you burn our flag we can arrest you or do something even worse to you.

In many countries throughout history, and even in today's world, if you burned a nation's flag, especially in public, you could be assaulted, tortured and even killed. The government and people of that nation could view you as an enemy and treat you as they wished.



Don't you feel safe knowing that you are in the United States of America as you prepare to burn to their flag?

The love and respect for America's flag did not appear instantly among citizens of our country during the Revolutionary War, as we may believe. It evolved from the 1776 era into the new century and was transformed many times, especially as more stars were added and re-arranged. The flag steadily matured and gained more respect during the war with Mexico in the 1830s. It was during our nation's Civil War that our soldiers and citizens really came to know that it represents new concepts to the world, including, that all people should live freely and treat others as equals, with respect.

The concepts of freedom, unity and self-expression were still in their infancy during the mid-1800s. During that time people identified more with their individual states and followed their rules and guidelines rather than a single federal government in Washington, D.C.

In some of our southern states people would refer to a state such as Virginia, Alabama or Mississippi as their country.

These feelings are part of what caused the Civil War and inspired southern leaders to try to form a separate nation and government called the Confederate States of America, thus tearing our country in half. Those brave federal soldiers and citizens who supported Abraham Lincoln made the ultimate sacrifice to keep our country as one. Those union soldiers in blue competed to have the honor to carry the Star-Spangled Banner and lead the charge in battle even though it meant almost certain death. The enemy would continue to fire upon the flag holder for many reasons including to disrespect the flag, and cause confusion or retreat.

But retreat was the last thing on the minds of those soldiers as they took their last breath, while desperately keeping the flag from touching the ground. They passed it from one to the other knowing their life expectancy could instantly be reduced to only a matter of minutes or seconds.

It was after the Civil War that the concept and term United States of America really evolved. Think of how many wars and engagements followed after 1865 including the Spanish American War, two world wars, Korea, Vietnam and our modern involvements.

Our nation's presidents, leaders, and those who create and enforce our rules and regulations may not be the honest, honorable people we expect they should be, but at least in this country we have the right to expect, demand and decide by our vote. A Constitutional right, that is. Some of our politicians, even local ones, may be as dirty and sinister as any of the world's tyrants but as long as that flag flies we can control them.

Many politicians might be corrupt but you live in the greatest country, with the greatest rights and freedoms that the world has ever known, or could ever know. It may not be perfect yet, but your actions and intentions should be designed to strengthen it and protect it, not to weaken it. In answer to the question, that I know you have heard,

Life, Liberty and the Pursuit of Happiness

would like to express MY feelings on the subject of OUR constitutionally guaranteed civil rights, from the perspective of a Homosexual individual. I can not speak for the entire Gay **L** community. I can only speak from my own personal experience. If given the opportunity, I would like to follow up, later on, with a couple more articles that may be more in depth. But, in order to confine myself to an acceptable length for a Domei article, I will try to limit this article to a brief overview of MY feelings regarding MY right to Life, Liberty and the Pursuit of Happiness.

LIFE: There are a few "crazies" out there, who believe that all homosexuals should be roundedup and executed. And, of course there are those who want to be able to test a fetus for the "gay gene", early in the pregnancy, and abort, if the child might be gay. But, except for those few fanatics, I think that most Americans would agree that we should be given the same life-saving medical care as anyone else.

LIBERTY: To me, it seems that Liberty and the Pursuit of Happiness are very inter-connected. We need to have the Liberty to pursue happiness. So, I will restrict my view of Liberty, only inSo, I will restrict my view of Liberty, only in regards to being the opposite of Confinement. I am pretty sure that most of you would agree that the people, in the Gay community, should not be put into Concentration Camps. Surely you would agree that we should have the same Freedom of Movement that is accorded other Citizens of the United States of America. When my spouse and I attend a Social Club event (especially if I am dressed in a suit and tie) some of you may feel a little bit uncomfortable. But, I think that even the most conservative of you would not say that we should not be allowed to attend, or that I should be forced (or at least asked) to conform to a "normal" dress-code.

PURSUIT of HAPPINESS: Now here is the area where we could possibly have a long discussion. That discussion, in it's entirety, could require one or more articles of their own. So, for now, we will only hit a couple of points.

As a female gay person, i.e., a Lesbian, do I have the right (the freedom) to wear men's clothing? I feel better in men's clothes. I am happier wearing men's clothes. This is certainly one way in which I pursue happiness.

Many of you would ask, do I want to be a man? If not, then why wear men's clothing? I have ...continued on page 12



given this question much thought. Let me answer that I do not believe that I want to be a man! So, that leaves the second part of this question. I believe that it is not so much a matter of wearing men's clothing, as it is to NOT wear women's clothing. And if the occasion calls for the possibility of dressing up, it provides a great opportunity to wear my suit.

I would love to have the time and page-space to tell you what it was like, for me, being forced to wear skirts and blouses, or dresses, in High School and in the state job that I found upon

graduation from High School.

The second issue that I will address, at this time, is most briefly addressed with the following questions. Do I have the right to Pursue a Life of Peace and Happiness with someone I love? If I find the person that I believe can give Me that Life, do I have a right to allow my Happiness to overflow and share it with my friends and work associates? I see others walk around overflowing with the "glow" of "new love"! Do I need to hide my "glow". . . . to shove it into a dark corner somewhere, like it is something to be ashamed of!

I have, for years, refused to do that! I have suffered, at times, for being so "out". But, I believe that it is the "moral" responsibility, of every adult homosexual, to be "out". In order to help make the world a safer place for the younger Gay kids and teenagers who are trying to grow up and survive in this society.

I thank God that our society is, finally, starting to accept God's Gay Children. At this time, we are still a long way from full acceptance, but we are at least, in most situations, being tolerated.






