Help for Severe Aortic Stenosis



Severe aortic stenosis is a narrowed aortic heart valve that doesn't open and close properly, reducing blood flow to the rest of the body.

Morton Plant Hospital is now enrolling eligible patients in the Medtronic Evolut R low-risk trial, which investigates the safety and effectiveness of a transcatheter aortic valve replacement (TAVR) system in patients with severe aortic stenosis who are at a low surgical mortality risk. TAVR is a minimally invasive alternative to open-heart surgery used to treat failing aortic heart valves in patients with severe aortic stenosis. Morton Plant Hospital was chosen as the first hospital in Tampa Bay to offer the TAVR procedure for patients with severe aortic stenosis who were at an intermediate or high surgical mortality risk. Our team has completed more than 700 TAVR procedures over the last five years.

"MORE THAN WORDS CAN EXPRESS"

Record breaking numbers behind Hurricane Irma. "Hurricane Irma has wreaked havoc in Florida after devastating islands throughout the Caribbean. Meteorologists have described it as one of the most powerful hurricanes ever recorded - 185 mph lifetime max winds." Over 400 miles wide, engulfing the entire state of Florida. These are the words we heard from Aug 30-Sept 10th. There was a mandatory evacuation of our homes on Thursday Sept. 7th. Florida had started the evacuation of the Florida keys the beginning of the week, the roads were packed with people



moving North, gas stations had no gas, airports were jammed, no food in grocery stores....... What to do?....We decided to leave. On our way out of the park on Saturday A.M., the Police with buses showed up to transport people out of thier homes to shelters. Steve, Joe and a handful of residents stayed behind -- to ride out the storm. Many of us made the choice to leave and prayed for the safety for those who chose to stay.

For those who have not been in a hurricane, this is a snapchat of our life during the largest hurricane recorded. As many of you know, papa Don, Mark's dad is 86 years old and lives with us; he suffers many health issues, needing machines. The hurricane had us scared, especially when electricity is needed for his health.

We were registered at the local shelter since Thursday, then Meteorologists said Irma was going to be a cat 4 or 5, directly hitting Clearwater. We got nervous on our ability to deal with the devastation after the storm. There were so many people who stayed in Florida and around the area, but by the end of the week you couldn't go North...roads were clear, but no gas. Saturday we decided to head to the east coast to a parking ramp since there were no hotels. Thank God we were invited to an extended family's home (whom we had never met) with hurricane shutters, food and a generator. With both of our cars packed with what we felt were our most needed belongings, we left the park. We genuinely felt we would not have a home to come back to. During that long weekend, there were a number of us that continued to text as long as we could, making sure all were safe and documenting where we were. Mark kept in contact with Steve and Joe along with a handful of other residents who chose to stay in their homes, bless thier hearts. They then assessed a lot of our homes after the storm. I have to say I was scared for the brave folks who stayed behind. Monday came, Irma shifted and the park was standing; we were delighted and feeling very grateful. So the next challenge was to return to Clearwater, it took us almost two days for a 2 hr drive. Downed trees, power lines, distraught family and no communication made it very difficult. We finally saw our home on Tuesday at noon, no electricity, no phone service or internet.

Thank God our home was intact, along with our friends' homes, our park had bumps and bruises but people were safe.

Park Management definitely stepped up for the residents in the park and for those who returned. Steve helped folks in many ways; one was allowing folks access to his generator with a charging



table; people were able to charge their cell phones and golfcarts at the time. Some had thier refrigerators plugged in to provide ice for others. When we returned, we helped staff clean out residents' refrigerators of spoiled food. Everyone stepped up and checked on the elderly that stayed in the park. John and Joe patrolled the park, watching over our community. We even witnessed the local police officers coming in to charge a home bound resident's cell phone for her. After the devastation in Florida the good people definitely showed up. I feel so blessed that many of them reside in our own Japanese Garden.

I want to thank the brave folks again for keeping our park safe and giving us, who weren't here, a sense of comfort about our homes. Thanks again to all who helped others with comfort by words, a detail or two, or being a presence in the park. So many were grateful for the generator use, charging phones allowed communication at times with family. Many of us had stress with family and children concerned about our safety, wanting us anywhere, but in Clearwater.

Having folks who think of others first, and go the extra mile in giving comfort in so many ways, is more than mere words of gratitude can express.

Thanks again to Steve and his crew for the amazing cleanup within the park-- This community truly feels like a family.




