

couple of PYGMY RATTLESNAKES have been spotted in the Park...

Snakebite can be the stabbing strike of a Rattlesnake that can be recognized by one or two definite puncture wounds and if venom is injected there will be intense, burning pain and swelling around the holes.

The Coral Snake bites and usually holds. There will be little pain but the victim will begin to lose control of all reflexes. Drooping eyelids will probably be the first outward sign of envenomation.

### For Snakebite First Aid

DO:

- **1. REMAIN CALM** Remember that there is an excellent chance for survival and in most cases there is plenty of time.
- **2. GET TO THE HOSPITAL AS QUICKLY AS POSSIBLE** Anti-venom serum is the only specific treatment for envenomation, and because some people are allergic to horse serum, it should only be given in a fully equipped medical facility.
- **3.** APPLY SUCTION Immediately and directly to the fang punctures.
- **4. REMOVE JEWELRY** Rapid progression of swelling make rings, watches, and bracelets a real problem.
- **5. MARK THE TIME** The progress of symptoms (swelling) is the most obvious indicator of the amount of envenomation. Periodically mark the stricken limb with a pen as swelling progresses, noting the time of each mark.
- 6. KEEP THE STRICKEN LIMB BELOW THE HEART Treat for shock if necessary.
- **7. ATTEMPT TO IDENTIFY THE OFFENDING SNAKE** Positive identification in the form of a dead snake is helpful if convenient, but only if it can be done quickly and safely. Symptoms should give medical personnel an accurate diagnosis.
- 8. GET A TETANUS SHOT

#### DON'T:

- 1. DON'T CUT THE WOUND This almost always causes more trouble than it's worth.
- **2. DON'T USE A TOURNIQUET** This isolates the venom in a small area and causes digestive enzymes in the venom to concentrate the damage.
- **3. DON'T USÉ ALCOHOL ORALLY** It speeds up the heart and blood flow and reduces the body's counteracting ability.
- **4. DON'T USE ICE** Freezing the stricken limb has been found to be a major factor leading to amputation.

## My Hep-C Adventure - Part 4

lright, the Hepatitis C reappeared. But I had insurance this time! Right? I won't say that the insurance was worthless because it truly did help with the expenses, this time, but...

Although there was no deductible before medical benefits kicked in, I had a \$20 co-pay for a regular doctor visit and a \$50 co-pay for a specialist. My Hepatitis-C doctor, Dr. Fern, was a specialist. In addition there was a \$100 deductible per day or per visit for inpatient hospital stays or outpatient hospital treatments. I was never checked into the hospital for an overnight stay. However, I had many outpatient trips to the hospital to receive IV's. The medicine that I had to take, as before, made me very dehydrated. It was an updated version of the same medicine I had been given during my first round of treatments. The cure rate for this updated medication was now up to 50%. This medication was in the top tier of medication rating in my drug coverage. Therefore, after my paying a \$500 drug deductible, the insurance covered 60% of the cost of the medication and I was left with the remaining 40%.

This second round of treatments made me feel even worse than the first round had. Dr. Fern explained that the medicine they were now using was a stronger version of the medicine I had taken before. This time, because the Hep-C had returned after the first round of treatments, Dr. Fern continued the treatments for a month and a half after the Hep-C viral-load started testing zero.

It took a couple of months to get over the treatments and get my energy back enough to go back to work. I went back to work for the same consulting company and got another out-of-town assignment! I asked for an out-of-town assignment in order to get the extra income for such an assignment. Financially I was totally broke and had a lot of charge card debt but I still had our home and it was paid for. So, I set about trying to recover my retirement account and our savings.

I was able to work for a little over 8 months before the Hep-C came back, AGAIN! Dr. Fern let me know that, based on the two failures we had with the treatment, he was unable to recommend another round of that same treatment. So, I continued to work and resolved myself to the fact that I was going to die. .....*continued on page 29*

They prescribed Oxycontin for my pain. Dr. Fern said that they could not prescribe a less habit-forming pain medication because it would damage my liver, so they had to prescribe Oxycontin. They never said it but I believe that they didn't worry about my getting hooked on Oxycontin because what did it really matter - I was going to die anyway! I remember asking Dr. Fern if he could promise me that when the time came, and that it was just a matter of time, would they be able to prescribe all the Oxycontin that I would need to deal with the pain. He told me not to worry, they would take care of that.

I was still managing to work in spite of the pain. It wasn't easy but with the help of the Oxycontin, I was hanging in there. Then Dr. Fern popped up with a grain of hope. He told me about a new treatment that was about to become available. It was still in the experimental stage but it was about to be approved for use. It consisted of the same treatment I had previously with an additional drug given on top of that. It did not have enough statistics accumulated to determine a percentage of success but they had a lot of success using it on people like myself, for whom the regular treatments had failed.

I went on medical leave and set about getting ready to start the new treatment! I arranged for a line-of-credit home equity loan on our house. It was setup with a charge card that applied directly to the line-of-credit. The interest rate was much better than any I would have gotten if I had used one of my other charge cards.


