Hello Treasure Cove March is here and so is Spring. Oh how we Love the Month of March in Florida, the weather is perfect, flowers are in bloom, all our Northern Friends are here, and many of our friends visit us for their Vacation.

DUNEDIN MARDI GRAS PARADE & FESTIVAL

Downtown Dunedin Florida will be transformed into the largest Mardi Gras, celebrations in the Southeast. This annual event is held on Fat Tuesday – March 5, 2019. This event has become the must-attend event for festival attendees. About 34,000 people are expected to attend this year's 28th annual Dunedin Mardi Gras Parade and Festival, which includes musical performances. It runs from 4 to 10 p.m. Tuesday and then spills over to local pubs and restaurants until closing time. Parade attendees are advised to stake out a spot along the parade route early since some attendees begin arriving shortly after lunchtime. The procession begins at 7:00 p.m. in front of the Dunedin Stadium, runs along Douglas Avenue and ends near Skinner Boulevard. Food truck Court, as well as other vendors, will line Main Street. The parade features floats and of course our very own Mardi Gras King and Queen. VIP Lounge Tickets available, which includes unlimited beer and wine.



Americans prefer to stay at home

Planning a vacation overseas this year? You're not exactly alone, but you're not in the majority. As reported on the NerdWallet website, a survey by Priority Pass found that only 14 percent of Americans plan to leave the United States for a vacation this year. Forty-five percent said they'd prefer to stay in the U.S.

The survey included 10,000 people in nine countries. Overall, 32 percent of respondents said they expect to go abroad for their holidays. Among other travel-related findings from the survey:

• Americans are least likely to spend a cash gift on travel. If given \$300, U.S. residents are least likely to use it to help pay for a trip. People in the United Kingdom and Mexico are most likely.

• Americans spend more on travel. Although they travel less, Americans have the highest per-person budget for overseas travel.

• Americans don't share. Finally, the survey found that Americans are least likely to share their travel memories on social media, or recommend hotels, airlines, and transportation services than residents of other countries.

We're still looking at our phones on the road

e all know the dangers of texting while driving—or do we? A survey of drivers in Philadelphia, as reported on the Fox 8 website, found that 75 percent admit to using mobile devices behind the wheel.

They're not all kids, either. Although 91 percent of millennials reported using a smartphone or other device while driving, so did 79 percent of Gen Xers and 64 percent of Baby Boomers. What are they doing? Reading text messages or emails (48 percent), updating or checking social media (23 percent), and recording videos (18 percent). Only 9 percent of drivers in the survey said they use a "Do not disturb" app on their phones while driving.

These drawing games can spur your brain

Prawing can spur your creativity. You don't have to be a Picasso. Just try some of these games with your friends (from the My Modern Met website):
The Exquisite Corpse. In this game, developed by the 20th-century Surrealist artists, one person begins a drawing at the top of a sheet of paper, then folds it over or covers it up so only a bit of the bottom is showing. The next person continues the drawing, folds it down, and so on. Unfolding it to reveal the completed drawing should produce surprises, laughs, and even some ideas.

• Paper Telephone. One person writes a short, descriptive phrase on a piece of paper, then passes it to the next. He or she then draws a picture based on the phrase. The next person looks only at the picture and then writes a phrase or sentence describing it. The following person then draws a picture of that phrase, and so on. By the end, the final picture and the original phrase may have nothing to do with each other.

• Blind Contour. In this exercise you (and a partner) draw something around you, but without looking at the paper—just the subject of your drawing. Keep your pen or pencil on the paper at all times. You might be surprised at what you see.

• Scribbles. One person scribbles on a piece of paper, eyes closed. The next person has to turn that doodle into a drawing. This forces your mind to make sense of nonsense.

A simple exercise for imagination

• our subconscious mind can help you exercise your imagination. Try this technique (used by Thomas Edison):

Ten minutes before you go to sleep, organize your thoughts. Think about a problem you're trying to solve, or ask your brain a question. Keep thinking about this as you drift off to dreamland. Then, during the first 10 minutes after waking up, write down whatever pops into your head. You'll often find that your brain has answered your question during your sleep. In the morning your mind is looser, and you're more likely to remember dreams and connect them to your daytime reality.
