- ➤ 6 of our 7 Board members were present.
- ➤ <u>OPEN FORUM</u> for members comments; #1, Jan Schultz requested that keys to unlock the clubhouse thermostat be made available to someone on call nights and weekends. A recent function found the A/C set at a very uncomfortably low setting causing much discomfort for the audience. Currently the thermostat is located behind a locked shield. The manager will review this situation. #2, Rita Teeter would like to see NO SMOKING signs placed at the pool and card room. The signage would include regular and VAPOR type cigarettes smoking in these places. The Board will follow up with the manager Re; new signage. #3, Patsy Perry asked if the new pool railing has been installed. The manager replied the new railing has been placed on the summer work list.
- ➤ <u>CORRESPONDENCE</u>, #1; request to permit a 3rd person to live in a home as a care giver was approved. #2; request to plant flowers in a front yard was denied. #3; request for the Board to help pay for a cracked driveway was denied. #4; letter concerning financial matters arrived too late to be studied for this month's meeting. The issue will be discussed at the April meeting. #5; came as a comment from the floor; a cable TV wire has been lying on the surface of the ground behind Lot #85 for several month. commented that the plan is to lower new asphalt roads to 1 ½ inch below the existing curbs then gradually increase the road height to zero at the center of the road. A preliminary quote to do the entire road system was \$300,000.00. The quote will be updated within 90 days of starting the road upgrades. Bruce indicated we could expect the cost to increase 10 to 20% at that time. The current plan is to have the road work done in 2022. The work may be done sooner as the park has funds available. Bruce reported that all the roads have been inspected and the only unknown at this time is settling at the Falcon Street entrance. He is attempting to get a camera inspection of that section of the lake out-flow to see what needs to be done to repair that problem. Manager Beth Carroll added all the water lines running under the roads have been identified and a plumbing firm will do an inspection of their condition before road resurfacing begins. The Board thanked Bruce for his efforts to date (He is a retired Road Builder) and asked him to continue overseeing this project.

- TREASURERS REPORT Treasurer Susan Zerbe reviewed the current monthly financials; additional income over expenses within the budget is due to members prepaying their maintenance fees. The mortgage pay down account stands at \$838,000.00. A team of Board members, (Susan Zerbe, Michel Bergeron and Doug Stewart) are speaking with financial institutions as we prepare to refinance our mortgage in 2018. To date, reserves are fully funded and financials are in very good shape.
- > <u>SALES AND MARKETING</u>, report by Mary Lou Fraher is found elsewhere in this edition in the OPEN HOUSE article.
- > <u>SAFETY AND SECURITY</u>. Patsy and Larry Perry have accepted chairmanship of this committee. They announced a new committee is currently being formed. President Gerry Killham spoke about the traffic situation that currently exists within the park. Please obey the **ONE WAY** signs, especially the road going by the new office, which is regularly crowded with parked cars. Remember that bikes and golf carts must use lights after dark. If you see something suspicious call the Sheriff's Suspicious Activity hot line at 582-6177. This number is also located in the yellow park phone book.
- ▶ LONG RANGE PLANNING REPORT, Co-chairman Michel Bergeron reported that after studying the cost of installing water meters, the committee recommends the park NOT install them. Co-Chair Bob Martin reported on the findings of his group after visiting 7 Senior Parks in our area. Our facilities compare very favorably with one exception. Our DIRECTORY (large map with names and lot numbers at Flag Pole) is badly outdated and has become somewhat unsightly. It was suggested a new directory be planned and built. The new directory would include lot numbers only, no residents names. The manager commented that she agrees the Directory needs upgrading. She asked for permission to remove the existing Directory and work on the landscaping before adding a new and improved directory. The Board gave their approval. Speed Bumps controlling speeding vehicles were found in ½ the parks visited. Doug Stewart announced the Long Range planning Committee now has a Plan Process, detailing how items being considered will be worked on. He has circulated the new form to the entire Board The Plan process will instruct each Chairperson to do studies before bringing projects to the manager and the Board of Directors. No additional paper work is anticipated for the office staff

- ➤ <u>UNFINISHED BUSINESS</u>, Swan Replacement Study Chairperson Susan Zerbe gave a report of her committees findings to date. Working with 3 outside organizations, swan prices have been obtained as well as shipping suggestions and how best to prepare for new swans. The committee continues to work on the design for a small enclosure as recommended by all 3 swan handling organizations. Their final report will include a design sketch as well as estimated costs for the project and suggestions as to who will be responsible for overseeing swan care.
- ➤ <u>NEW BUSINESS</u>, Doug Stewart announced he is getting details about installing security cameras, including license plate readers at the C.R.1 and Falcon St. entrances. The cameras allow storing video results for up to 3 months.. Director Stewart and the Park Manager will work together to insure the new Directory and cameras are compatible. The system cost was ball parked at approximately \$5,100.00.

i Mini Pizzas (Lynn Marro)

- English muffins split in half
- A jar of pizza sauce or spaghetti sauce
- Pizza toppings of your choice (ground beef or sausage cooked and drained, chopped green or black olives, chopped onions, sliced pepperoni cut in ½'s, etc.
- Shredded mozzarella cheese
- Heat oven to 450.

Help for Severe Aortic Stenosis



Severe aortic stenosis is a narrowed aortic heart valve that doesn't open and close properly, reducing blood flow to the rest of the body.

Morton Plant Hospital is now enrolling eligible patients in the Medtronic Evolut R low-risk trial, which investigates the safety and effectiveness of a transcatheter aortic valve replacement (TAVR) system in patients with severe aortic stenosis who are at a low surgical mortality risk. TAVR is a minimally invasive alternative to open-heart surgery used to treat failing aortic heart valves in patients with severe aortic stenosis. Morton Plant Hospital was chosen as the first hospital in Tampa Bay to offer the TAVR procedure for patients with severe aortic stenosis who were at an intermediate or high surgical mortality risk. Our team has completed more than 700 TAVR procedures over the last five years.



Exploring the mysteries of an ancient codex

British and Dutch scientists have used high-tech imaging to uncover the secrets of an ancient Mexican manuscript, the eScience News website reports. The manuscript, known as the Codex Seiden, is strip of deer hide five meters long that's been covered with gesso (a white plaster composed of gypsum and chalk) and folded according style to make a document 20 pages long.

It dates back to approximately 1560, and was found in what's now known as the Oaxaca region of Mexico. Like other codices from that area and others, the Codex Seiden uses brightly-colored symbols to record history: wars, genealogy, and cultural information.

One intriguing discovery: The high-tech imaging found the image of an individual represented by a glyph of a twisted cord and a flint knife. The man or woman resembles a character found in other codices, and may be an important ancestor of two families connected to other archeological sites in Mexico.

Collision course

huge space cloud is on a collision course with our galaxy, but don't panic—it's not expected to reach us for another 30 million years. According to NASA's Science Mission Directorate website, Smith's cloud, as it's known, is composed of enough gas to create two million stars the size of our size, and is orbiting the Milky Way at 700,000 mph.

The collision won't have much impact for anyone still around, as the cloud is much smaller than our galaxy, but scientists are watching it closely anyway, seeking explanations for its origin as well as other secrets of the universe.

Big dinosaurs, big eggs, and hatching times

Tow long did dinosaur eggs take to hatch? Paleontologists know very little about dinosaur embryology, but with CT scanners and high-resolution microscopy, they're finding out more.

The SciNews website reports on a recent find: Non-avian dinosaurs likely took longer to hatch than their feathered counterparts, much as modern reptiles hatch at a later age than to-

day's birds. Scientists looked at the fossilized remains of two dinosaur embryos, looking at the formation of their teeth. Analyzing growth lines, they were able to determine that one dinosaur had died at three months, and the other at six months.

The difference in hatching times may have had an impact on the large dinosaurs' eventual demise. Because they require more food and other resources to live to adult size, larger reptiles were likely more vulnerable than smaller animals (amphibians, birds, and other mammals) to an extinction event.
