Especially since I just received a picture from my sister of all the snow at home. We held our scheduled RO meeting on Thurs. Nov. 9th. It was a lengthy meeting as there were many issues to discuss.

Our manager, Beth Carroll presented a long list of requests, such as: We need a large size bin for recycling as we have been told we can no longer take

our recycling to the City recycling area. The bin will be located by our maintenance shed.

We have hired a new pool maintenance company. We have equipment in the pool pit area that needs to be replaced. Other equipment will be removed as it is no longer used. 

Fred Wimmer announced that he has asked Steve Schultz to co-chair the Hurricane Preparation and Disaster Recovery Committee. We realized after Hurricane Irma passed we have a lot of work to do to prepare for future hurricanes. Fred, Steve and their committee will prepare a presentation for the Directors for our next RO meeting. Good luck to them as this is a big job and one of critical importance. They basically have to tear apart our old plan and start over again. All of the Directors agreed and gave the go ahead.

Susan Zerbe gave her report from the Swan Committee. Susan explained that as beautiful as swans are, with the information the Board has received we cannot recommend to replace the swans. Rita St Laurent read a letter from our Insurance company and the park's lawyer explaining why we shouldn't replace the swans. All of the Directors agreed.

Doug Stewart spoke on why we cannot use the security cart anymore and about the deputies patrolling our park and how that is working. Doug then spoke on the purchasing and installation of new security cameras to be located by the park directory. He also spoke on replacing the clubhouse security cameras as the current ones are outdated and the wiring damaged. The replacement cameras for the clubhouse will be compatible with the cameras located by the park directory. The Directors voted in favour of this project 6 to 1. HIGHLIGHTS NOVEMBER R.O. MEETING

Editors note, There were approximately 50 residents in attendance. Director Bergeron attended electronically.

- ✓ President Killham asked for a moment of silence to honor and remember Millie Frazier.
- ✓ An OPEN FORMUM time was offered, there were no speakers.
- ✓ Managers Report: ...newspaper and tin dumpsters will be removed. They are uneconomical, newspapers will still be picked up and tin will continue to be accepted in recycling barrels......# Pool equipment area will be upgraded, est. cost, \$2,600.00.#Former Security Cart shed is being converted to storage facility to include Christmas décor, medical loaner items and other essential park items. New doors for the storage facility have been donated.# Pool temperature is set at 84 degrees and will not change. That temperature is best for geothermal system.#The manager requested a new reserve study be undertaken in 2018, the Treasurer spoke in favor of this proposal. All study costs will come from Reserve Account.#.Manager spoke of the severe problem created by unsecured items during Hurricane force winds. Many seasonal residents leave items like barbecues and planters outside when they go away for the summer. If not properly stored, these items will be picked up and disposed of as soon as a resident leaves and their water is shut off. Director Wimmer suggested a fine of \$50.00 for residents who don't comply with this issue.#The area around the maintenance building has been enclosed with vinyl fencing.#new fencing is being added to the north property line. This will replace fencing blown down during Irma.#New vinyl fencing is being priced to replace wooden fencing along County Road .#1....
- ✓ Treasurers report, The new mortgage was finalized in June this year. The mortgage was set at \$930,000.00 with a 4.56 interest rate, fixed for 15 years. No maintenance fee increase is projected for 2018. Jefferson Bank has been sold and is now named Center Point Bank. When we last financed the appraisal came in at \$7,640,000.00 the appraisal done for the 2017mortgage came in at \$20,000,000.00. Continued on page 17



- ✓ <u>Sales and Marketing</u> report by Mary Lou Fraher, Currently there are two homes for sale in the park.
- ✓ <u>Disaster and Recovery</u>, Director Fred Wimmer reported he has added Steve Schultz to the committee. Together Fred and Steve are preparing a draft of the new D&R format to be submitted to the Board for approval. Many flaws in the old format were discovered during the recent Hurricane. He reported that volunteers were difficult to find during the emergency. The committee is pricing new L.P. generators to replace gas fired units, as per FEMA recommendations. The park needs a building either retrofitted or built to withstand 150 MPH winds. New D&R members are being solicited. Please call Fred if you wish to help.
- ✓ <u>SWAN COMMITTEE</u> Director Susan Zerbe's report stated that replacement swans are no longer being considered. Following advice from both our attorney and Insurance Company, legal and insurance problems prohibit keeping swans on the lake. The R.O. Board agreed unanimously, that there will not be swans on the lake in the foreseeable future.
- ✓ SECURITY COMMITTEE, Director Doug Stewart gave a comprehensive report on the benefits of installing new security cameras. Two park entrances will covered with license plate reader cameras and the clubhouse as well as the maintenance yard will have new digital cameras. The total cost to install this equipment will be approximately \$10,000.00. \$5,000.00 for the plate readers and \$5,000.00 for the clubhouse etc. There was considerable discussion on the Board and also from the residents about wanting or needing the cameras. The Board of Directors finally voted on a motion to install the license plate reader cameras, the motion passed unanimously. They then voted to install new cameras in the clubhouse and maintenance area, this motion passed 6 to 1. Also reported were the potential legal problems of using untrained volunteers to operate the security cart. After looking at a number of security options it was decided to use COMMUNITY POLICING provided by the Sheriff's Dept. (Editor's Note, see article titled PARK SECURITY elsewhere in this issue). Finally, it was reported that the park is still active in the Neighborhood Watch program. If you observe suspicious activities call 582-6177. For Immediate Emergencies call 911, Report a crime to Sheriff's Dept. 582-6200
- ✓ <u>NEW BUSINESS</u>, Our pool temperature is set automatically by the geothermal system. This is the best temperature for efficient chemical use. Please don't call the office asking for different pool temperatures.





EVACUATION STORIES

ere are just two stories of the many from Lake Highlander who had to evacuate their homes as HURRICANE IRMA bore down.....

Irma created an emergency situation that demanded a MANDATORY EVACUATION of all Lake Highlander residents. The City of Dunedin provided storm safe shelters where Dunedin residents could stay until the storm passed. Long time year round residents of Lot # 89, Pat and Bob Reynolds packed up a few essentials and rode out the hurricane at the Palm Harbor high school. Here is their story;

The news came over the TV, all mobile home parks in Pinellas County MUST evacuate!! Pat and Bob put together some personal items and headed North on County Road One to the Palm Harbor High School Building, a designated shelter for Senior Citizens. All who arrived were signed in on forms stating they were eligible as seniors.

Pat and Bob were assigned to a classroom with 10 other senior citizen evacuees. Student desks and chairs were available to rest on. They spent two fairly quiet evenings while the Hurricane got closer and closer to Dunedin. The Reynolds had their own bedding and slept on the floor during their stay. The building is soundly built and the only time they heard the storm noise was when they poked their head out side for a quick peek. Evenings were quiet and they did not encounter any difficulties. As IRMA closed in, the shelter admitted many last minute evacuees who arrived with children and pets and had no other safe place to go. The last minute people had to spend the night in the halls as the building was overflowing with people and pets. Police were present and school staff stayed the entire time to provide 3 meals each day. No one was turned away and all were fed and able to stay safe. Washrooms were kept tidied up and after two days of anxious waiting Pat and Bob came home to find their home at #89, safe and sound.

Pat and Butch Partington, Lot #103 had a somewhat different evacuation but were equally pleased with the well organized program. Butch and Pat spent 3 days in the new elementary school on Union and Patricia. This shelter was designated for people with special needs. They were given individual cots and clean linen and new blankets for their stay. The school staff stayed in the building along with the evacuees and provided 3 meals daily and janitorial

services. The Partington's were also very happily surprised with the efficiency and thoughtfulness of the city, county and state professionals who set up the centers. They also came home to the park to find only a few bumps and bruises on their home. All's well that ends well, it sure is comforting to know that evacuating during a hurricane is not as bad as we thought it might be.

NEW PARK MORTGAGE PROJECT, HUGE SUCCESS

As most of you know, a pay down account was started using payments produced from residents who were financing their notes. Previously, all these monies were placed into our operating account and spent pretty much as it came in. A study group identified this source of revenue as a possible way to assist us in reducing the mortgage when it came due. Given this suggestion the R.O. Board started a long range assessment of how best to implement the ideas of the study group. Many projections were worked on and a final financial solution was agreed upon. Note repayment monies were placed in the pay down account and this account grew year by year. Finally, projections indicated the time had come to refinance. Using the entire pay down account of \$854,924.00 and other savings of \$33,823,00 our negotiators had a hefty down payment against a new mortgage, including all the costs associated with the loan. The new \$930,000.00 mortgage interest rate went from 6.5% to 4.565 % and the rate is fixed

Even those of us who don't completely understand the complexities of mortgage finance can appreciate what has been accomplished.

for a term of 15 years. Our monthly mortgage payments went from \$18,658.00 per month to \$7,143.00 per month. The extra money will help us fully fund our reserve account each year.

Many thanks to all the folks who wrestled through the years with this complex deal, its completion will favorably impact all our finances through the next 15 years.

LOOKING BACK 10 YEARS (Piper articles from Dec. 2007)

- **Norm Gordon of Lot #124 arranged for his Barbershop Quartet to perform following the last Pot Luck supper. It was a nice evening of old favorites.
- **New park landscaping has been completed. We now have a new stone wall between the Clubhouse parking area and the lake. New shrubbery was also added in front of the new wall.
- **Hobby Club announced they will meet the first and third Monday of the month, rather than each week
- **Social Club announced the 2007 Christmas Luncheon tickets will be \$18.00 per person. The event will be held at Island Way on Clearwater Beach causeway.
- **At the November 2007 R.O. meeting, Treasurer, Ed Hughes gave an in-depth review of our finances. He reports we continue to be in very good financial shape. Also reported was the fact that there will be no increase in the maintenance fee for 2008.
 - **The park is looking into refitting our pool to make it a constant depth.
- **The Social Club donated \$300.00 for new Christmas decorations. Many of the old strings of lights have been discarded. **Sales and Marketing Lil LaFever reported that twelve homes were sold during 2007

or a variety of reasons, local volunteers no longer man the SECURITY CART with its flashing yellow lights and friendly waves from neighbors doing their rounds. We now have a new and very professional security patrol. The Pinellas County Sheriff's Department. Park Management has arranged to allow the Sheriff Patrol to use our office Board Room for patrol bookwork and job breaks during the evening. The Sheriff in return, patrols the park on a regular basis and raises security visibility by parking in front of the office while using the facility.

The PIPER spoke with Park Manager Beth Carroll and asked her how this new system was working. She replied that it is up and running wonderfully well. The Sheriff cars are parked at the office, often in the middle of the night. They have access to a key and open the building using the Board Room table to do up reports that would otherwise be done in their car. The washrooms are also available and the police report that this is much better than using gas station washrooms and having to keep looking over their shoulder to see who was behind them. When asked if "clean up "was a problem, Beth replied that all the rooms used by the police men and women are left SPOTLESS! They even straighten out the tea towels after washing and drying kitchen items. All in all, the entire program has been very successful. The added bonus of having a middle of the night police presence in the part is just terrific.

Beth also mentioned that she and Sharon occasionally leave home baked goodies for the sheriff deputies. Sure sounds like another successful venture spearheaded by Park Management.

**Veterans Can Now Salute During The National Anthem

**Veterans Can Now Salute During The Pledge Of Allegiance

Traditionally, members of the nation's veteran's service organizations have rendered the military salute during the national anthem and at events involving the national flag only while wearing their organization's official head-gear.

The National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) of 2008 contained an amendment to allow un-uniformed service-members, military retirees, and veterans to render a hand salute during the hoisting, lowering, or passing of the U.S. flag. A later amendment further authorized hand-salutes during the national anthem by veterans. The initial amendment in the NDAA of 2008 amended Section 9, Title 4 related to "Conduct By Members Of The Armed Forces And Veterans Out Of Uniform During Hoisting, Lowering, Or Passing Of United States Flag" by striking "all persons present" and all that follows through the end of the section and inserting the following: "all persons present in uniform should render the military salute. Members of the Armed Forces and veterans who are present but not in uniform may render the military salute. All other persons present should face the flag and stand at attention with their right hand over the heart, or if applicable, remove their headdress with their right hand and hold it at the left shoulder, the hand being over the heart. Citizens of other countries present should stand at attention. All such conduct toward the flag in a moving column should be rendered at the moment the flag passes."



Book Recommendation:

Here Vultures Fly

by Rudy Rodrigues

This is the narration of the personal experiences of the author, Rudy Rodrigues, during his ten years of service with the United Nations in Afghanistan, where he was engaged in emergency relief and later rehabilitation programs in close collaboration with the Communist government, the mujahideen, the Taliban, and the post-Taliban government.

The author was responsible for opening the first UNICEF office in Kyrgyzstan soon after the collapse of the Soviet Union in a unique environment and culture. During this time, he was working with a government unfamiliar with the United Nations and its goals and objectives. In addition, the Kyrgyz population was traumatized by this sudden period of transition and uncertainty. A major focus of the author's work was gaining the



confidence of the government in Uzbekistan and to ensure the building of meaningful partnership programs for women and children.

This book also covers the adventures, romance, and thrill of being born and raised in Kenya; serving as an officer in the army; the challenges of working in Papua New Guinea; and having the glorious opportunity of working in the UN in different parts of the world with a multiethnic/multicultural community.

About the Author

Rudy Rodrigues was born and raised in Kenya. He graduated from the Royal Military Academy Sandhurst and the British Army Staff College. He was commissioned and served as an officer in the Kenya Army in both command and staff appointments. Resigning after sixteen years of active service, he then immigrated to Canada with his wife and three children.

Later, Rodrigues was appointed country director of a Canadian NGO in the Sudan, with a mandate to provide leadership, strategic planning and the delivery of UN (WFP) emergency relief supplies to the more than three million starving people displaced by the famine of 1985. He did so using a fleet of 350 cargo vehicles and a staff of over 3,000 people. This trucking operation was later taken over by the UN, and Rodrigues served as its Director.

In 2006 Rodrigues ended his career, and moved from Afghanistan, where he was last working with the United Nations. He retired to Winter Park, Florida where he lives today, and enjoys traveling, writing and spending time with his family, children and grandchildren.
