DID YOU KNOW?

Buying and Selling Your Home

I'm sure that most owners like myself didn't think too much, if any, on selling our coach after we first moved in or for a good deal of time thereafter. We looked forward to years of winter vacations and for a few owners year around living. Perhaps an investment for the future too.

Many are surprised that our coach is registered with the Florida DMV like a vehicle or historically a trailer home. Coaches similar to ours used to have a front hitch, axles and could be moved. Today those are called RV's and homes here are called coaches, manufactured or park homes. Even the pedestal (posts with electric meters) found in the original section of the Lincolnshire Park support 4 coach homes are reminders of past mobility of trailers. Visit an RV park and you will see newer versions of the pedestal. The newer part of our park has transformers (distributors of electricity) and meters on the rear of the coach. Lots have both potable (house) and non-potable (well) water access. The risers and spigots coming out of the ground in the back usually between 4 lots is non-potable well water. Some owners have added water lines to the coach for irrigation too.

All States have statutes (laws) that pertain to all different types of dwellings and Florida is not any different. The Florida Statutes that govern our 55+ rental mobile home park are found numerically under 723. Below are specific provisions under Chapter 723 on the rights to sell our homes. I won't give the whole provision as available online.

A. Florida Statute Chapter 723.058, was enacted in 1984 provides that: "No mobile home park owner of subdivision developer shall make or enforce any "Rule, Regulation or Rental Agreement" which denies or abridges the right of any mobile home owner or owner of a lot in a mobile home subdivision to sell his or her mobile home The park owner of subdivision

developer shall not exact a commission or fee with respect to the price realized by the seller unless the park owner or subdivision developer has acted as agent

B. Florida Statute Chapter 723.061(2) (e): Failure of the purchaser, prospective tenant, or occupant of a mobile home situated in the mobile home park to be qualified as, and to obtain approval to become a tenant or occupant of the home, if such approval is required by a properly promulgated rule.

A Nurse's Toolbox #6

Defully everyone has survived the first dose of holiday parties and dinners with much more to come here in Lincolnshire. I may have stretched the metal spring on my classic style bathroom scale a little bit.

In the November issue I had promised to begin laying out over the next several months on how our bodies were designed in the first place relating to food and exercise (movement.), next on what has seemingly gone wrong causing weight gain and diabetes, frustration, and finally some practical help on how to gain some control. At the end my goal is help you understand how we were designed, how that compares to our lives now and lastly how to start a change to better habits. Easy and hard at the same time.

It perhaps wasn't one single day in time but between 200-250,000 years ago we as humans (Homo sapiens) finally rolled off the assembly line of life. That assembly line had actually begun eons before we landed. I wasn't there.

So what were we and the world like then that would sustain us? Our brand new body (all of it) was specifically designed to survive each and every day. Geez not a very simple task at all. Basically we were male and female, thin or muscular depending on the abundance of food and amount of movement needed to find food each and every day. Our skin was purposely dark in the beginning to limit the amount of a necessary vitamin (D) produced with help by the sun. We were very strong, could climb trees and walk for miles. We also didn't speak much because there wasn't a language. Language was simple and to the point I would think. We were built to survive and did.

Food was very abundant and mostly year round. Food is really packaged sugar that becomes energy for every cell in our body to do a specific job (including fat believe it or not.) Next month we look at what has gone wrong for many of us. I ask each of you to see how your day compares to what was described above. Do you eat in the early morning, relax, move for 3-4 hours and eat a small meal again? Just think about how closer you can get to how we were designed to live. Until next month, chew well my friends.

How to safely transport your pet in the vehicle

Whether going to the park, traveling on a road trip or just taking a drive – our pets are often passengers in our vehicles. As we buckle our seatbelts, it's important to keep in mind that pets must also be constrained in the car for safety. Dr. Sonja Olson, a senior clinician in emergency medicine with BluePearl Veterinary Partners, provides safety tips for transporting your pets in a vehicle.

In most cases, your pet is safest in the backseat of the car. It's important to have a form of confinement to prevent your pet from flying forward during an accident or sudden stop. For cats and dogs under 15 pounds, it's recommended they are crated. Any type of crate is fine – just be sure to secure it behind either of the front seats rather than in the middle. For medium and large dogs, consider a barrier such as a car hammock or grate to keep them confined to the back seat. I use a seat belt attached to his harness.

Keep in mind one of the most dangerous ways to transport a pet is by having him in your lap. Not only is this distracting, but it can also cause crushing damage to the pet if the airbag deploys.

You should never leave your pet alone in a car. Even if it doesn't seem terribly hot or cold outside, temperatures can be extreme inside. This is a surprisingly common and totally preventable cause of many medical emergencies treated in Blue Pearl hospitals.

To sum up: Confine your pet in a crate or a barrier, don't place your pet in your lap or in the truck bed and don't leave him alone in the vehicle. In an accident, you want to be as safely prepared as possible.



Digital Records Will Lead to Faster Disability Claims Decisions, VA Says

3. The Department of Veterans Affairs has completed a major effort to replace millions of paper files on benefits and disability claims with easily scannable electronic records in the ongoing battle to cut the backlog of cases. In a release Tuesday, VA officials said that a "significant modernization effort" over the last 21 months led to the removal of 7.8 million paper files from 60 locations within the department in the switch to electronic claims processing systems. "This will lead to faster claims decisions for veterans," the release said. In a statement, VA Secretary Robert Wilkie said the effort "will not only improve VA's claims process, it will also lead to quicker decisions for veterans because millions more records will be available electronically." Once the paper files are inventoried, officials sav they will be scanned into the VA's Veterans Benefits Management System. Officials said in the release that going from paper to digital will also save money, citing the removal of millions of paper files from the Records Control Division (RCD) of the Records Management Center (RMC) in St. Louis. The VA is now working with the General Service Administration, which owns the complex that houses the Records Management Center, to return the leased warehouse space for the paper files to the GSA, according to the release. The move, officials said, will save nearly \$1.8 million per year. The VA's announcement on the removal of the paper files followed on a report last month from the VA's Office of Inspector General which found that VA officials had "significantly understated the number of claims awaiting decisions for over 125 days." In early September, the VA estimated the number of backlogged claims and benefits cases at about 86,000, but the IG's report said that the VA's estimate only covered about 79 percent of the cases that should have been listed as backlogged, or awaiting decisions for more than 125 days. "Ineffective oversight and training due to lack of national performance and training plans for Claims Assistants resulted in inaccuracies that also affected the backlog," the IG's report added. In response to the IG's report, VA officials said they were "reviewing how best to supplement or adjust reporting on the ratings-related backlog."

active-duty troops at the southern border, military and Customs officials said Monday. Several hundred troops from Fort Knox and Fort Campbell in Kentucky are already on the move into southern Texas, said Air Force Gen. Terrence J. O'Shaughnessy, commander of U.S. Northern Command. "By the end of the week, we will deploy over 5,200 soldiers to the southwestern border," he said. O'Shaughnessy said the plan is to

deploy the additional troops first to Texas and then to Arizona and California in support of U.S. Customs and Border Patrol. The troops will be in a support role, limited only because of the Posse Comitatus Act. They will be able to assist with Logistics, Surveillance ETC. Although they will be armed they cannot legally shoot, detain or arrest but can assist the border patrol.
