

This month I kept having thoughts of my doll collection which brought so many happy memories, but one doll was always a favorite "Kewpie". This is the perfect month to talk about Kewpie dolls. The name is derived from the name "Cupid" (how appropriate). Name was chosen because of the resemblance to the Roman God of Love!



Kewpie first made its appearance in 1909 in illustrations drawn by Rose O'Neill and printed in "Ladies Journal". Rose O'Neill



was ahead of her time when she designed the doll "less is more", so simplistic yet so complex in detail. Kewpie has three tufts of hair molded as part of the head, naked, chubby cheeks, quaint little smile, makes you wonder what the kewpie is thinking and large, round eyes. Collector's can look for O'Neill's signature on the bottom of one of the feet. This little doll is such a delight!

Also, The Kewpie hamburger restaurant also chose the Kewpie for its name and logo in 1923. The logo features a Kewpie doll wearing a chef hat and holding a spatula. The restaurant, still in existence, was named an all-American icon. I don't remember this restaurant - do you?



News for Florida Hearing Impaired

alking on the phone can be a challenge for the hearing impaired, but Florida offers free amplified telephones to those who qualify.

"It's been going on for 20 years, and people just don't know about it," said Fred Schott, an outreach coordinator for the Deaf Service Center.

The center gives away the phones throughout each month by appointment. They go to about eight locations, giving the phones to those who have certifiable hearing loss or speech impairment. To be eligible, one must be a permanent Florida resident, and income is not considered.

The Florida Legislature created the free phone program in 1991 and set up a statewide nonprofit to handle it. Everyone with a landline pays for the program through surcharges on their monthly phone bills, currently set at 11 cents.

To take advantage of the program just call: Family Center on Deafness Phone #: 399-9983. They're on 62nd St. It took us 15 min. to get there. Fl. residents who suffer hearing loss can receive free amplified phones. You must be Florida. resident, not a snowbird. It's worth a call.




