RUDY'S PET KREWE

There are various reasons, some I can't help, like age, but others I didn't completely know about and so I am trying to inform myself to keep my new dog Sadie, as healthy as possible so she can have a long life. I will try in the next issues to tell you about what I have learned.

Selecting Good Commercial Dog Food

There are about 4 types of dog food these days; Kibble, Canned, Freeze dried and fresh cooked and preserved. Of the 4, the freeze dried is the best, the fresh cooked like Fresh Pet is next best but expensive. You buy it almost anywhere in a standalone refrigerated display. Next comes canned and last the dry kibble. My Rudy and many of the pets we know and have loved have gotten cancer from the food they eat and the environment they run on outside. This time I will discuss the different types of canned and dry dog food. I know there are people who make a raw diet for their dogs but, but consider this. There are a lot of safety concerns these days. There were over 20 recalls in 2018 of contaminated raw meat sold to humans. Would you like to feed raw meat to your family these days?

So let's look at how to find some good safe food for your pet. Talk to your vet. They are constantly seeing and learning about their profession and will give good advice. But look yourself. Read and become informed. Do not make decisions based on on-line ratings. Most are rated more by marketing than science. Be skeptical. What kind of research goes into their brand? What kind of testing have the dog food companies done? Do they even feed to any dogs before selling it?

Look at the back and sides of the dog food package or can. Know the most important info on the label. It's called the Nutritional Adequacy Statement. How is it stated?

- 1. Formulated to meet all life stages. Adult, over weight, Senior can be bad. Because if you continually feed the same food over time the pet will develop deficiencies.
- 2. Animal Feeding tests for life stages. Some companies like Purina keep kennels of pets to test feed their product.
- 3. Intended for intermittent or supplemental feeding. As I said earlier, you don't want to put your pet on food like weight loss forever. They will develop deficiencies that can lead to health problems.

The second piece of good info on the package is contact information. Call and ask some of the questions I've posed.

There are strict guidelines companies should follow, but it is all done on the honor system. Go to 2 web sites that show the guidelines, World Small Animal Veterinarian Association and Pet Foodology.com. That's all for this time.. Have much more for next time.

Immediately after the Annual meeting, the Board of Directors will meet to elect officers (President, Vice President, Treasurer and Secretary.) The Board of Director and Officer listing is maintained, on the bulletin board located in the laundry, along with notices of Board and Membership meetings. They are also placed in the "Voice". Attending Member meetings is the best way to keep updated on current issues and ask questions. Members may also attend Board of Director meetings.

The membership will have also voted to amend the Association's By-Laws, amending one Article that changes the deadline for submission of an intent to run for Directorship from 15 days to 20 days prior to the annual meeting. This change allows the Board to create election *Continued on page 28*



A Nurse's Toolbox #9

ast month I went over how civilizations have determined by where they are located, governed with cultural pressures what is available to eat, its quantity, its quality, the abundance and lifestyles.

There are 4 pretty basic actions that occur in how we use our food (sugar.) What we eat, how much we eat, when we eat (a newer issue) and the last important one which is what we do with the food (movement.) I really don't like the word "exercise." Bet you don't either.

1. <u>What we eat.</u> Each food group has a sugar load. Some call it "carbs." Each food group has its own<u>time</u> to become sugar, pass into our blood stream and meet "insulin" made fresh daily and hourly in our pancreas that escorts the sugar in to each and every cell. Candy the fastest (seconds) and meat the longest (almost an hour.)

2. <u>How much we eat</u>. Eating more than recommended in each food group means too much sugar will be available immediately or an hour from now when you really need some right now. Which makes our body "make" sugar even though you just ate. Oh boy! Or you get the sugar when you aren't going to use it. Another Oh boy!

3. <u>When we eat</u>. May be a new one for most of us. We were designed to get fresh food (sugar) every 3-4 hours after getting up at DAWN. Yes DAWN. All day until dusk. When we don't follow this there is metabolic chaos and confusion. We don't get food when our body first needs it (skipping breakfast) and eating at the end of the day when things are winding down. The end result is no fresh food (sugar) when our system is looking for it and then food (sugar) when not needed. Our body has to make sugar when it has been denied (yes denied.) and store sugar when it isn't being used (fat.) If our pancreas could talk to most of us it would be screaming for calm. It would tell us to eat what we were designed to eat, the quantities we were designed to find during the day and when, along our daily trail we would find it.

4. <u>Movement.</u> Formerly "exercise" for me. Simple. We ate and moved to eat, ate and moved until dusk when we found safety to sleep. Started all over the next day. If the average time the sugar is available to us is 30 minutes after we swallow then do something and move. Walk, vacuum, ride a bike, move!! Our muscles use the most sugar!!! I mean it.
