Our next Member meeting is March 17. There are 4 available Director positions as the current 3 Directors are not up for re-election until 2021. If you are interested in being on the board, please submit your intent in writing to myself or Marilyn Grubb, Lot 1218, before the March meeting.

One Member has filed an intent to run for one of the 4 available Director positions this year. There has not been an actual Director election for 6 years as the number of Members requesting consideration matched or was less than the positons available. All current Directors were seated by appointment. The 3 and 4th if seated as a Director will continue to be committed to their responsibilities and state mandates. As a result Members wishing to join the board will be appointed by the Board. The HOA does pay for the one day training for Directors (invaluable.) A Nurse's Self Care Toolbox #21

ast month I went over how civilizations have determined that by where they are located, and governed with cultural pressures of what is available to eat, it's quantity, quality, and the abundance and lifestyles effects. There are 4 pretty basic actions that occur in how we use our food (sugar.) What we eat, how much we eat, when we eat (a newer issue) and the last important one which is what we do with the food (movement.) I really don't like the word "exercise." Bet you don't either.

- 1. What we eat. Each food group has a sugar load. Some call it "carbs." Each food group has its own time to become sugar, pass into our blood stream and meet "insulin" made fresh daily and hourly in our pancreas that escorts the sugar in to each and every cell. Candy the fastest (seconds) and meat the longest (almost an hour.)
- 2. <u>How much we eat</u>. Eating more than recommended in each food group means too much sugar will be available immediately or an hour from now when you really need some right now. Which makes our body "make" sugar even though you just ate. Oh boy! Or you get the sugar when you aren't going to use it. Another Oh boy!
- 3. When we eat. May be a new one for most of us. We were designed to get fresh food (sugar) every 3-4 hours after getting up at DAWN. Yes DAWN. All day until dusk. When we don't follow this there is metabolic chaos and confusion. We don't get food when our body first needs it (skipping breakfast) and eating at the end of the day when things are winding down. The end result is no fresh food (sugar) when our system is looking for it and then food (sugar) when not needed. Our body has to make sugar when it has been denied (yes denied.) and store sugar when it isn't being used (fat.) If our pancreas could talk to most of us it would be screaming for calm. It would tell us to eat what we were designed to eat, the quantities we were designed to find during the day and when, along our daily trail (movement) we would find it.
- **4.** <u>Movement</u>. Formerly "exercise" for me. Simple. We ate and moved to eat, ate and moved until dusk when we found safety to sleep. Started all over the next day. If the average time the sugar is available to us is 30 minutes after we swallow then do something and move. Walk, vacuum, ride a bike, move!! Our muscles use the most sugar!!! I mean it. Use them no matter how small the muscle it is using sugar. Then have something to eat 3 hours later.

changes are cuts to medical billets and for those of you that use the base or an MTF cuts in the formularies used at the Pharmacy's. Some of the MTF's are even telling people over 65 to get their routine procedures done at regular hospitals.

There was no increase TRICARE for Life enrollment fees or deductibles in 2020. While Congress enacted no new programmed TRICARE, fee increases in the FY 2020 defense bill, several previously scheduled fee increases took effect Jan. 1:

- Enrollment fees for retirees who entered service prior to Jan. 1, 2018. TRICARE Prime: \$300 (single)/\$600 (family), up from \$297/\$594; TRICARE Select: No fee.
- Enrollment fees for retirees who entered service after Jan. 1, 2018. TRICARE Prime: \$366 (single)/\$732 (family), up from \$360/\$720; TRICARE Select: \$471 (single)/\$942 (family), up from \$462/\$924.
- **Retail pharmacy fees.** \$13 for 30-day supply of generic, \$33 for brand name, \$60 for nonformulary (up from \$11, \$28, and \$53, respectively).
- **Mail-order pharmacy fees:** \$10 for a 90-day supply of generic, \$29 for brand name, \$60 for non-formulary (up from \$7, \$24 and \$53, respectively).

Although, there are no fees for 30-90-day supplies for generic and brand-name drugs from military treatment facilities (MTFs). Non-formulary prescriptions are generally not available at MTFs. Anybody utilizing MacDill AFB now knows how difficult they are now making it to get your scripts. If you call the script in you can go to the window to get your refill as in the past. The big change is now you have to go to the Main Building and drop a new refill script off and then have to go back to the base the next day to pick it up at the drive thru where the lines are twice as long now. We have also found out without any advance warning that they are just routinely dropping what they use to cover. They have dropped my wife's Insulin, Nexium and Bystolic blood pressure medication. Since you cannot go until they are nearly out you have to scramble to either get them by Preferred Scripts (who have raised their prices) or at Walgreens. So, although there were no increases in Tricare for Life we are



now paying out of pocket for these items. They also told us there will probably be more items dropped in the future. As I stated above If you have experienced any of these issues you should also be contacting your politicians to make them aware of them.
