



Many defenses against heebie-jeebies exist, but what the heebies really fear is action. Almost any kind of action. Fear thrives on our inaction. Such as lying there trembling. Victory begins with even the simplest step, such as brushing your teeth, feeding your pet and yourself.

Then you can really get going. Write down every heebie-jeebie you can think of in a notebook. Cross off the ones you've defeated in the past. Pin point those fears, in detail. Then try a trick that they loathe, the total relaxation of their intended victim. Loosen every muscle and brain cell you own.

Then call your heavy troops: the blessings that have defeated the heebie-jeebies in the past. Most of these troops are the people in your life, faith, family, friends, and neighbors. Others include books that have been written by anti-heebie-jeebie veterans. One of them is "How to Stop Worrying and Start Living" by Dale Carnegie. It contains dozens of accounts of people who were saved by taking a simple but powerful step-changing their thinking.

YOU NEED TO KNOW! YOU WANT TO KNOW? Responsibilities of a home owner.

Il homeowners have received the 90 day notice from the park owner concerning rent increase, compactor fee and the property tax pass-on charge. The property tax pass-on is allowed by Florida statutes for rental mobile home parks like Lincolnshire. This has been in existence for several years. Each homeowner is responsible for 1/464th of the total difference in the property tax paid from the basis year of 2006 to 2018. Our park owner makes the charge to each homeowner once a year along with the rental increases. Other park owners may blend it into the rental increase or have 12 month installments. Property taxes are based on the value of the property (including the land) owned and is assessed by local or municipal governments. Resident owned parks also see increases and those charges are seen in increased maintenance fees. The Board is consistently surprised by the number of new homeowners who have no knowledge of this pass-on tax until they receive the notice. Unlike when we purchased a home with the land all the taxes, fees etc. are disclosed at the "closing." Your Board of Directors ensures that this pass-through is calculated correctly each year by obtaining the tax record from Pinellas County of what amount was assessed and the tax paid.

Certainly disconcerting to a new owner finding out they are paying a pass-on tax from the previous year. The seller should make the new owner aware of this tax plus give the new owner the "Prospectus" which is the contract by which we live here.

The Board will also exercise the right by Florida statute to schedule a meeting with the park owner or his representative concerning the rental increase notice and other issues deemed important to affected homeowners. This meeting must occur before the rental increase takes effect.

The Board of Directors has an opening for a Director. This is an excellent way to serve your community and appreciated by the Members. Please speak to a Director for more information. Training is a requirement and paid for.

If you are reading this and are not a Member please take the opportunity to join. Ensure your voice can be heard and also have a vote. The 2021 membership drive starts October 1st and ends on December 31st for the next year. Dues are \$15 The Association's strength is in its membership and let's always maintain that.

Board meetings do occur monthly though due to the Covid virus they are not available to members due to very limited seating. Board and Member meetings will be held when safety can be assured. If you have an issue please call a Director or the President to discuss. Contact information is in the front of this Voice. As a reminder LHOA is a tenet association and doesn't own or manage the park.

A Nurse's Self Care Toolbox #27

ast month we took a look at the basics of skin cancer. This month, a quick look at the longer range issues that skin cancer can cause.

Why be so concerned about skin cancer. Our skin is our most protective outer organ, yes it is an organ. The skin's responsibility is defensive and holds us together. Our outer skin cells fall off and the layers underneath move out. Happens 24/7/365 non-stop. Much like the cells of our gastrointestinal track.



As we age and have exposure to nature's elements like the sun and other chemicals, some of our skin cells begin to get confused or out of control. Why we get more dry skin, skin tags and those ugly barnacles. When those cells begin to alter their structure and reproduce rapidly then cancer is a primary cause. These cancerous cells can also travel to other areas of our bodies both in the skin and internally. Our body is a vast network of turnpikes, freeways and back roads.

So, our primary doctor doesn't like what they see and send us to a dermatologist. They will decide if a biopsy is needed or topical medications are wanted first. There are creams that are also chemotherapeutics that can destroy the abnormal skin cells. Usually these can be done by us twice a day or once using a "blue light" to activate them. Our skin gets a bit irritated by these chemo creams so know it may itch etc. Creams are only used if the abnormal skin cells are on the surface. There are also creams that simply dry up the skin cells within a week.

When the Dermatologist recommends a biopsy of the area or definitely is concerned they will recommend a biopsy, either small or include an area well outside the lesion. If the biopsy finds cancerous cells the repeat surgery will be much wider attempting to remove all cancer cells. Often those cancer cells will migrate. Cancer cells don't ask permission to travel.

Simply be prepared to have a larger area removed then you can see!

Cancer cells can migrate and hitch a ride almost anywhere in the body. Chemotherapy/radiation may be required if there are multiple internal and external areas affected. "Staging" of the cancer is simply where it is and the effect on our body.

My simple message is this: exam your skin with help from a partner, spouse or friend.







VETERAN'S CORNER

he Senate overwhelmingly approved an addition to its defense policy bill to expand the Department of Veterans Affairs' list of diseases considered related to exposure to Agent Orange, adding bladder cancer, hypothyroidism and Parkinsonism. The measure's passage sets up a debate between the House and Senate over the issue when the two chambers reconcile the differences in their respective versions of the defense bill. In last-minute discussions this week, a similar provision was omitted from the House bill. The Senate passed the amendment



94-6. Members are set to vote on the entire bill later this week. Sen. Jon Tester of Montana, the ranking Democrat on the Senate Armed Services Committee who sponsored the bill, said Tuesday that justice for these veterans "was long overdue." "Our sacred duty is to care for those who are wounded. We have refused to cover illnesses such as bladder cancer, hypothyroidism and Parkinsonism. [The VA] doesn't seem to think that exposure to these toxic chemicals in Vietnam is a cost of war. Let me tell you, they are wrong," he said in a speech on the Senate floor before the vote. If signed into law, the provision would expand VA health care eligibility and disability benefits to roughly 22,000 affected veterans. Former service members with these illnesses have been waiting since 2016 for a decision from the VA on whether the department would expand its list of 14 conditions to include the three new ones. That year, the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering and Medicine found that there is suggestive or sufficient

evidence that the three diseases are associated with exposure to herbicides used during the Vietnam War.

In 2018, the Academies concluded that "sufficient evidence" also exists linking hypertension and related illnesses in veterans to Agent Orange and other defoliants. The proposal that passed the Senate did not include hypertension, however. The condition is common among the elderly and, if it had been included, may have added more than two million veterans to VA disability rolls in the next 10 years, at an estimated cost of \$11.2 billion to \$15.2 billion, according to the VA. The decision not to include hypertension in the legislation this time was a compromise, and lawmakers and advocacy groups have pledged to keep pushing for it to be included. In 2017, then-VA Secretary David Shulkin expressed support for including bladder cancer, hypothyroidism and Parkinsonism on the list of presumptive diseases, but he never formally announced his decision. According to internal VA documents, Shulkin had been on the verge of including the three conditions when the Office of Management and Budget and other White House officials objected, citing what they called "limited scientific evidence" and cost. Meanwhile, thousands of veterans have waited. "The fact of the matter is that this administration -- the Trump administration -- has refused to expand the list of presumptive health conditions associated with Agent Orange," Tester said. He sponsored the legislation in the Senate. On the House side, the amendment was promoted by Rep. Joshua Harder, D-California. It passed the House Armed Services Committee but was struck from the bill by the House Rules Committee, which decided that it did not include a requisite way to cover its cost, called a "pay-for." A source close to the process said that the Congressional Budget Office provided an informal assessment of the cost of Harder's amendment that was in the "tens of billions," while the assessment given to Tester's office was "\$10 billion." The source questioned the \$10 billion price tag. "The cost is not going to increase. We are losing these people every day. There may be some spousal benefits, but the sad thing is, they also are of an age where they are going too," said the source, who spoke on background as he was not authorized to discuss the issue.

VA Secretary Robert Wilkie told lawmakers late last year he wants the results of two studies -- the Vietnam Era Health Retrospective Observational Study, or VE-HEROES, and the Vietnam Era Mortality Study -- to be reviewed for publication before announcing a decision on whether to broaden the presumptive list. The VA began recognizing diseases associated with herbicide exposure in Vietnam in 1991, naming 14 diseases as presumed to be linked to exposure, including Hodgkin's disease, multiple myeloma, non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, early-onset peripheral neuropathy, porphyria cutanea tarda, prostate cancer, respiratory cancers, soft-tissue sarcoma, chloracne, type-2 diabetes mellitus, light chain amyloidosis, ischemic heart disease, chronic B-cell leukemias, Parkinson's disease.




