Tune is upon us and with that we all start paying a little bit more attention to the weather and the weatherman. It's HURRICANE season!!!! I know, I know we all went through it last year and yes, it was one of the scariest and most stressful times for all of us. I just want to provide some heads up information so we are better prepared this time.

- 1. Go to and bookmark on your computer, tablet or phone, www.pinellascounty.org/emergencymanagement
- 2. There is a preparedness guide with a wealth of info in it and it is about 20 pages. Here are some basics....
- 3. Get a notebook and keep this stuff together. List each person your plan will cover and their full contact information. Each person should carry their identification with them if you evacuate. Get a couple of large plastic totes to store stuff in that you will take.
- 4. List all supplies and equipment needed for each person. It may be 72 hours or more before help can arrive. Identify any health conditions or health related needs.
- 5. DECIDE WHERE YOU WILL GO IF EVACUATION IS NECESSARY. Plan your route and include alternates. Don't just follow the leader, they might not RE-ALLY have a plan! Remember a manufactured home park is always a level A, and is mandatory if officials say so.

- Make copies of your financial, insurance and medical records and keep them with 6. your emergency plan.
- Include your service animals and family pets in your plan.
- Only go to a shelter if you have nowhere else to go. You will have a roof over your 8. head but... It's not a pleasant place to go, as you will sleep on a cot or the floor and it's full of noisy kids, pets and scared adults.
- Shelters are in order of closest to farthest: Largo High School, Ross Norton Rec. Ctr., 9. Belleair Elementary, Pinellas Park H.S., High Point Elementary, Skycrest Elementary.
- 10. Keep your vehicle's basic maintenance up to date and refill your gas tank when it gets half full.
- 11. Pray that we don't have to use this information.



TRDP to FEDVIP Transition (Reminder)

1. The TRICARE Retiree Dental Program (TRDP) will end December 31, 2018. Retirees will be able to enroll in the Federal Employees Dental and Vision Insurance Program (FEDVIP) during Open Season this fall (Nov 12 - Dec 10, 2018). There is NOTHING that current TRDP enrollees need to do right now, but in order for them to continue with dental coverage for 2019, they MUST select a FEDVIP plan during Open Season; they will not automatically be rolled into a FEDVIP dental plan. There are up to 10 Dental Carrier options in FEDVIP from which to choose, one of which is Delta Dental who has administered the TRDP since 1998. New enrollments in the TRDP will be accepted until October 31, 2018 and current TRDP enrollees



should continue to use their TRDP benefits with confidence throughout the rest of the year.

VIET NAM VET IDENTIFIED AND BURIED

2. SAN ANTONIO — The remains of a <u>Green Beret</u> from Texas who was missing in action since 1971 have been recovered and a service will be held Friday for the Vietnam War veteran. The Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency on Monday announced the remains of 32-year-old <u>Army</u> Maj. Donald G. Carr of San Antonio are being returned to his family. Burial will be at San Antonio National Cemetery. Records show Carr on July 6, 1971, was on a reconnaissance flight when the plane crashed during bad weather. A ground team failed to immediately locate the crash site. Carr was declared missing in action. In April 2014, a Vietnamese citizen contacted U.S. officials about possible American remains found in Kon Tum Province. The wreckage yielded personal items from Carr, who also was identified through DNA.

Many Medically Discharged Vets Missing Out on Rating Upgrade

3. Hardeep Grewal was a 29-year-old Air Force computer operations specialist suffering a mild case of pneumonia when he deployed to Saudi Arabia and a series of other Southwest Asian countries in 2003. The staff sergeant stayed ill and returned to the United States "looking like a scare crow," he said. He was diagnosed with asthma, which would require two medications daily for the rest of his life. By December 2004, Grewal was medically discharged with a 10 percent disability rating and a small severance payment. The Air Force physical evaluation board "lowballed me," he recalled in a phone conversation Wednesday from his Northern Virginia home. "They were trying to get rid of people" from a specialty that, after offering an attractive reenlistment bonus, quickly became overmanned. Grewal promptly applied to the Department of Veterans Affairs for disability compensation and his initial VA rating was set at 30 percent. Full VA payments were delayed until Grewal's Air Force severance was recouped. Twelve years later, in August 2016, he got a letter inviting him to have his military disability rating reviewed by a special board Congress created solely to determine whether veterans like him, discharged for conditions rated 20 percent disabling or less from Sept. 11, 2001, to Dec. 31, 2009, were treated fairly. "I waited like almost two months to apply because I didn't know if somebody was pulling my leg," Grewal said. "I talked to a lot of people, including a friend at Langley Air Force Base, to find out if it was legit. He said other service members he knew who had gotten out were saying, 'Yeah, it's legit. You can look it up." Grewal had to wait 18 months but he received his decision letter from the Physical Disability Board of Review (PDBR) this month. It recommends to the Air Force Secretary that Grewal's discharge with severance pay be characterized to permanent disability retirement, effective the date of his prior medical separation. If, as expected, the Air Force approves a revised disability rating to 30 percent back to December 2004, Grewal will receive retroactive disability retirement, become eligible for TRICARE health insurance and begin to enjoy other privileges of "retiree" status including access to discount shopping on base. Congress ordered that the PDBR established

as part of the 2008 National Defense Authorization Act after a mountain of evidence surfaced that service branches had been low-balling disability ratings given to thousands of service members medically separated over a nine-year period through recent wars. The PDBR began accepting applications in January 2009. So far only 19,000 veterans have applied from pool of 71,000 known to be eligible for at least a disability rating review. All of them were medically-discharged with disability ratings of 20 percent or less sometime during the qualifying period. A bump in rating to 30 percent or higher bestows retiree status including a tax-free disability retirement and TRICARE eligibility. And yet only 27 percent of veterans believed eligible for a rating review have applied. Indeed, applications to the PDBR have slowed to a trickle of 40 to 50 per month.

For this column, Greg Johnson, director of the PDRB, provided written responses to two dozen questions on the board's operations. Overall, he explained, 42 percent of applicants receive a recommendation that their original rating be upgraded. Their service branch has the final say on whether a recommendation is approved but in almost every instance they have been. To date, 47 percent of Army veterans who applied got a recommendation for upgrade, and 18 percent saw their rating increased to at least 30 percent to qualify for disability retirement. For the Navy Department, which includes Sailors and Marines, 34 percent of applicants received upgrade recommendations and 17 percent gained retiree status. For Air Force applicants the approval rate also has been 34 percent, but 21 percent airmen got a revised rating high enough to qualify for disability retirement. The top three medical conditions triggering favorable recommendations are mental health issues, including post-traumatic stress, back ailments and arthritis. As Grewal learned, decisions are not made quickly. The current wait, on average, is eight to 12 months, Johnson said. But that is faster than the 18-to-24-month wait that was routine in earlier years. Also, veterans need not fear that a new review will result in a rating downgrade. The law establishing the PDBR doesn't allow for it. Once received, applications are scanned into the PDBR data base and the board requests from the service branch a copy of their physical evaluation board case file. Also, PDBR retrieves from VA the veteran's treatment records and all documents associated with a VA disability rating decision. After paperwork is gathered, a PDBR panel of one medical officer and two non-medical officers, military or civilian, reviews the original rating decision. All panelists are the rank of colonel or lieutenant colonel (for Navy, captain or commander) or their civilian equivalents. The board has 34 voting members plus

support staff, which is more than PDBR had in its early years, Johnson said. The wait for a decision is long because of the time it takes to retrieve records, the thoroughness of the review and the complexity of the cases, Johnson said. About 70 percent of applicants have been Army, 20 percent Navy or Marine Corps veterans, 10 percent Air Force and less than one percent Coast Guard. PDBR notification letters have been sent to eligible veterans at last-known addresses at least twice and include applications





and pre-stamped return envelopes. Grewal said he had moved four times since leaving service which might be why he never heard of the board before the notification letter reach him in 2016. At some point Congress could set a deadline for the board to cease operations but it hasn't yet. The board advises veterans, however, to apply as soon as they can. The longer they wait, it notes on its website, "the more difficult it may be to gather required medical evidence from your VA rating process, your service treatment record or other in-service sources [needed] to assess your claim." If an eligible veteran is incapacitated or deceased, a surviving spouse, next of kin or legal representative also can request the PDBR review. Robert Behm, LTC (Ret)

Petersburg33702. It is open at 7am daily. Although it is listed as an island, it is accessible off Gandy Blvd. past Derby Lane to San Martine Blvd. until you come to Weedon Dr. It has 3,190 acres and offers a variety of recreational activities. Hiking is the biggest with several trails and a boardwalk and observation tower. The boardwalk is handicap accessible and extends over tidal flats and mangrove forests and saltwater ponds teeming with fish and birds. The Boy Scout Loop is a one mile loop that goes through pine flatwoods and maritime hammocks. There is additional trail that has picnic areas to stop and rest.

Next there is the Cultural and learning center and Gift Shop. It is open from 9to 4pm. The 3 story center has educational programs, and exhibits. The building was designed with the help if Native Americans and keeps with their traditions. It is free.

There were people that lived on this island 1,000 to 1800 yrs. ago. Many artifacts have been found here including a prehistoric canoe found more recently. Portions of the preserve are on the National Register of Historic Places. If you plan to hike, check out the suggested trail companions and trail rules. Go to Pinellas County.org, clic on parks and recreation, clic on list of county parks to find out more about Weedon Island.

Recipes from Lincolnshire

If you haven't roasted radishes before, you are in for a surprise. The sharp flavor mellows into a sweet earthiness that is completely family-friendly. Besides this wonderful recipe listed below to add flavor to a baked radish, you can also just put them in the oven with a little olive oil, salt, and pepper and roast for 20 minutes at 400 degrees. Enjoy!

Roasted Radishes with Green Goddess Dressing

1 lb. radishes, about 15, cut in half, lengthwise

2 tsp. olive oil

1/4 tsp. kosher salt

1/4 teaspoon black pepper

Green Goddess Dressing:

½ cp. low-fat plain Greek yogurt

1 tbls. Lemon juice

1 tsp. olive oil

½ cp. chopped green onion

1/4 tsp.minced garlic (about 1/2 clove)

1/4 cup roughly cut parsley

1 tbls. Fresh dill (or 1 tsp. dried dill)

1/4 tsp. kosher salt



Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Place the halved radishes, olive oil, and salt and pepper in a small bowl and stir to coat. Pour the radishes onto a parchment-lined baking sheet and roastt until tender, about 20 minutes. Meanwhile, place the dressing ingredients into a blender and blend just until mixed, but a few green flecks remain, about 20 seconds (The recipe makes extra.)

Serve the radishes warm or at room temperature with about half of the sauce – either drizzled on top or served in a small bowl as a dip.

Makes 6 servings.
