Recycling In Palm Hill Update

- Several years ago, Palm Hill resident Les Ciesemier took it upon himself to see if Palm Hillers could shift their behavior and recycle more, because it was the right thing to do, and still is. Les would be amazed and proud of the recycling efforts of Palm Hill today.
- Back then, many residents will remember the "trash trains", six or seven 6-cubic yard dumpsters that collected trash four days a week in Palm Hill. The City of Largo came into Palm Hill and emptied these dumpsters full of uncompacted trash three times per week. The annual cost billed to Home Owners of Palm Hill for this collection was about \$38,000.
- Much research and discussion resulted in the 2011-12 HOPH Board approving the implementation of Palm Hill's own recycling program which began October 1, 2011. In ...continued on page 10

Year One, we laid out almost \$26,000 in capital costs to get the program started, and in Year Two we purchased two compactors for an additional \$40,000. The \$66,000 in capital costs are amortized over seven years, that is, expensed annually at about \$9,500 in the Palm Hill books. We are now in Year Five of the program.

- The data which follows was provided by the City of Largo Recycling Coordinator in the Public Works Department.
- In the past two years, Palm Hill has recycled over 575,000 pounds (288 tons) of what would have been hauled away as trash at very considerable expense. The recycled materials that the City of Largo picks up from our sanitation area are done so at no cost to us. That means that for these two years alone, we have saved \$10,786.88 that we would have had to pay if the recycled materials had been hauled away as trash.
- One of our compactors is now used to compact our trash collections and is emptied at least once a week (more during the Snowbird months). City of Largo estimates that our haulaway-trash charges have now been reduced to about \$4,671.97 annually.
- In addition, for the past four years, we have had a team of tireless volunteers recycling cans and metals that are taken to the sanitation area. Prior to that, these items were taken away as trash, an added expense. This team found buyers for what they were salvaging, and to date have added some \$22,250 to Palm Hill's income, income that we never had before. They have also taken more than 1,000 old television sets to Pinellas County recycling. We cannot thank these volunteers enough!
- We have all made this recycling program work, because we have worked together to do so. Let's all continue to do our part: Sort and recycle. <u>It is the right thing to do.</u>
