EDITOR'S CORNER: July 4 – Independence Day, 2020

n July 4, Independence Day, Americans reflect on the sacrifices, character and courage that propelled the 13 colonies to set aside their differences and unify to fight for a common goal – independence from Great Britain.

In honor of the nation's celebration, the Editor's Corner will reprint a story from the National Archives website describing the creation of the Declaration of Independence.

THE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE: HOW DID IT HAPPEN?

The Revolution Begins

In the early 1770s, more and more colonists became convinced that Parliament intended to take away their freedom. In fact, the Americans saw a pattern of increasing oppression and corruption happening all around the world. Parliament was determined to bring its unruly American subjects to heel. Britain began to prepare for war in early 1775. The first fighting broke out in April in Massachusetts. In August, the King declared the colonists "in a state of open and avowed rebellion." For the first time, many colonists began to seriously consider cutting ties with Britain. The publication of Thomas Paine's stirring pamphlet Common Sense in early 1776 lit a fire under this previously unthinkable idea. The movement for independence was now in full swing.

Choosing Independence

The colonists elected delegates to attend a Continental Congress that eventually became the governing body of the union during the Revolution. Its second meeting convened in Philadelphia in 1775. The delegates to Congress adopted strict rules of secrecy to protect the cause of American liberty and their own lives. In less than a year, most of the delegates abandoned hope of reconciliation with Britain. On June 7, 1776, Richard Henry Lee introduced

a resolution "that these united colonies are and of right ought to be free and independent states." They appointed a Committee of Five to write an announcement explaining the reasons for independence. Thomas Jefferson, who chaired the committee and had established himself as a bold and talented political writer, wrote the first draft.

Writing the Declaration

On June 11, 1776, Jefferson holed up in his Philadelphia boarding house and began to write. He borrowed freely from existing documents like the Virginia Declaration of Rights and incorporated accepted ideals of the Enlightenment. Jefferson later explained that "he was not striving for originality of principal or sentiment." Instead, he hoped his words served as an "expression of the American mind." Less than three weeks after he'd begun, he presented his draft to Congress. He was not pleased when Congress "mangled" his composition by cutting and changing much of his carefully chosen wording. He was especially sorry they removed the part blaming King George III for the slave trade, although he knew the time wasn't right to deal with the issue.

Declaring Independence

On July 2, 1776, Congress voted to declare independence. Two days later, it ratified the text of the Declaration. John Dunlap, official printer to Congress, worked through the night to set the Declaration in type and print approximately 200 copies. These copies, known as the Dunlap Broadsides,



were sent to various committees, assemblies, and commanders of the Continental troops. The Dunlap Broadsides weren't signed, but John Hancock's name appears in large type at the bottom. One copy crossed the Atlantic, reaching King George III months later. The official British response scolded the "misguided Americans" and "their extravagant and inadmissable Claim of Independency".

COOL DESTINATIONS: Myakka River State Park, Sarasota, Florida https://www.floridastateparks.org/parks-and-trails/myakka-river-state-park Address:13208 State Road 72, Sarasota, FL 34241-9546

If you visit this wonderland of old Florida, plan to stay at least one overnight. About 55 miles or just over an hour's drive from Largo, Myakka is a vast expanse of unspoiled wetlands, prairies, hammocks and pinelands. A birding paradise, at Myakka you will see herons, pelicans, spoonbills, storks and more. The majestic Myakka River, designated as one of Florida's wild and scenic rivers, flows through 58 square miles of one of Florida's oldest and largest parks. Fishing, birding, hiking, kayaking, bicycling and climbing around a board walkway high in the tree canopy, and viewing alligators are all activities

to be enjoyed. For the adventurous, a five-mile hike to the Alligator Hole promises an alligator viewing experience of a lifetime. Not all amenities are open now, so put this one on your list for fall or next winter. (A spring/May visit offers the beautiful blooming of the yellow flowers on the prairie, and seeing newborn Sandhill cranes.)

Air-conditioned cabins (built by the Civilian Conservation Corps early in the 20th century) and a campground are available. Photos are from a May 2019 visit by Palm Hillers Susan and Gary Kerr. If you are headed to an overnighter in Sarasota and don't mind a bit of roughing it, try to snag one of these cabins, it will cost you less than a Sarasota hotel and you will only be minutes from your destination.

Florida's State Animal



The Elorida Panther (Felis concolor coryi) became the State Animal following a state-wide vote of school students in 1982. The Florida panther is a large (six feet or longer), long-tailed, pale brown cat. Its habitat is usually the same as that of the white-tailed deer, its main food. Panthers have been persecuted out of fear and misunderstanding of the role these large predators play in the natural ecosystem. Human population growth, however, has been the main threat to the panther.

The panther has been protected from legal hunting in Florida since 1958. It has been on the federal endangered species list since 1967 and on the state's endangered list since 1973. Only with support will the Florida panther remain a part of our unique wildlife community.

MOCKINGBIRD - the Florida State Bird and Palm Hill Resident

The 1927 legislative session designated the mockingbird as the Florida State Bird. The

common mockingbird (Mimus polyglottos) is a superb songbird and mimic. Mimic means that it imitates (mocks) the songs of other birds. Its own song is pleasant, varied, and repetitive. Often it will sing all night long, especially in bright springtime moonlight.

Mockingbirds are about 10" in length, with a 15" wingspan. They have grayish upper portions, white undersides, and white patches on the tail and wings. The females have slightly less whiteness.

The male and female work together to make the nest. It is a bulky, open cup of grass, twigs, and roots carelessly arranged in a dense tree or bush. The 3-6 eggs per nest are pale blue-greenish with

brown spots. This year-round Florida resident is known for its fierce defense of the family nest.

Florida has quite a history with hurricanes. Because it is near the tropics and westerly winds blow off the African coasts along the equator, Florida is vulnerable.

What does the word hurricane mean?

The word hurricane probably comes to us by way of the Spanish explorers. They picked up the term from the Taino Indian* word huracan (evil spirit). The word likely came to the Taino from the Maya word Huraken (God of Storms or bad weather).

What are hurricanes?

Hurricanes are severe tropical storms that form over warm ocean waters—usually starting as storms in the Caribbean or off the west coast of Africa. As the storms drift slowly westward, they gather heat and energy through contact with warm ocean waters. Evaporation from the seawater increases their power.

Warm, moist air moves toward the center of the storm and spirals upward. This is similar to the "dust devils" that form on a hot afternoon along a sandy beach. Hurricanes rotate in a counter-clockwise direction around an "eye." The most violent part of a hurricane is at the edges of its eye, called the eye wall.

How are hurricanes named?

Since 1953, Atlantic tropical storms have been named from lists produced by the National Hurricane Center. The Atlantic is assigned six lists of names, with one list used each year. Each name on the list starts with a different letter. The first hurricane of the season starts with the letter "A," followed by "B," and so forth alphabetically. When an unusually destructive hurricane hits, that hurricane's name is never used again.

How are hurricanes classified?

Hurricanes are classified into five categories, based on their wind speeds and potential to cause damage.

- Category 1: Winds 74-95 miles per hour
- Category 2: Winds 96-110 miles per hour
- Category 3: Winds 111-130 miles per hour
- Category 4: Winds 131-155 miles per hour
- Category 5: Winds greater than 155 miles per hour

What are some of Florida's worst hurricanes?

1906

The worst hurricane in 170 years killed one hundred railroad workers in the Keys. The eye passed over Miami. At least 34 people were killed when it reached the Pensacola area.

1909, 1910, 1919

A series of bad hurricanes hit the Keys. They damaged the Seven Mile Bridge and caused major damage in Key West.

1921

The last major hurricane to hit Tampa and the Florida central west coast caused over a million dollars in damage. The storm passed across the state and exited at Jacksonville.

1926

The eye passed over Miami. Wind gusts were estimated at 150 miles per hour. Most buildings in Dade and Broward Counties were damaged or destroyed. There was major flooding of all coastal sections, downtown Miami, and downtown Ft. Lauderdale.

1928

Okeechobee Hurricane

The eye of the hurricane moved ashore near Palm Beach causing widespread destruction. Nearly 2,000 people died when the dikes broke on Lake Okeechobee, causing massive flooding.

1935

Florida Keys Labor Day Hurricane

This was the strongest storm ever to hit the United States. The winds were estimated up to 250 miles per hour. This small but intense storm (category 5) caused significant damage. Hundreds of World War I veterans who had been sent to the Keys to build the Overseas Railroad were killed. The storm surge floated an entire train away.

1960

Hurricane Donna

This hurricane had 150 mile per hour winds. It caused major damage in the Keys.

1992

Hurricane Andrew

This hurricane hit Miami. At \$27 billion in damages, it was the most costly natural disaster to hit a United States city in modern times until Katrina in 2005, which cost \$125 billion in damage.

2005

Hurricane Wilma was the most intense tropical cyclone ever recorded in the Atlantic basin, and the second-most intense tropical cyclone recorded

in the Western Hemisphere, after Hurricane Patricia in 2015. Wilma was part of the record-breaking 2005 Atlantic hurricane season, which included three of the ten most intense Atlantic hurricanes ever (along with #4 Rita and #7 Katrina). At least 62 deaths were attributed to Wilma, and damage totaled to \$27.4 billion, of which \$19 billion occurred in the United States.

After Wilma, no hurricane struck the state of Florida until Hurricane Hermine did so nearly 11 years later in 2016, and no major hurricane struck Florida until nearly 12 years later when Hurricane Irma made landfall in early September 2017.

2017

Hurricane Irma (\$77.2 billion in damages) caused widespread and catastrophic damage throughout its long lifetime, particularly in the northeastern Caribbean and the Florida Keys. It was also the most intense hurricane to strike the continental United States since Katrina in 2005, the first major hurricane to make landfall in Florida since Wilma (2005), and the first Category 4 hurricane to strike the state since Charley in 2004 (\$16.9 billion). The word Irmageddon was coined soon after the hurricane to describe the damage caused by the hurricane; 44 died directly from the storm, and another 85 indirectly due to circumstances surrounding the storm preparation and aftermath.

If you are in Palm Hill this summer:

Reminders:

- Hurricane Season is from June 1 through November 30.
- If an evacuation order is issued, Palm Hill is a mandatory evacuation zone as are all mobile home communities.
- Should you choose to remain in the park and need medical or emergency assistance, the authorities will not respond as they will be dealing with other emergencies and you were advised to heed the evacuation order.
- The nearest shelter is Largo High School at 410 Missouri Avenue North; this is a pet friendly shelter but will probably fill up quickly.
- The two Clubhouses here in Palm Hill are not rated as hurricane shelters and therefore cannot be used by residents as a shelter.
- Due to liability issues both Clubhouses will be locked down when an evacuation order is issued.
- Ensure that your gutters are cleaned out and any pots, chairs, planters or anything that may become airborne are stored either in the shed or inside the mobile. Maintenance is responsible for ensuring that the common areas are secured. If time allows, maintenance will pick up items that were not stored and remove them to the sanitation field.



- Consider putting it in a conspicuous place, perhaps taped to your refrigerator door, which will make a handy grab if you have to leave your home for medical care or are ordered to evacuate your home in an emergency.
- Email the document as an attachment to your own email so you always have accessible in your cell-phone.
- (Hurricane plans would include quick access to critical documents/information that you may need for any extended relocation.)
