EDITOR'S CORNER: Honoring Veterans

¬ lorida has the third highest population of veterans in the country, with 1.5 million veterans; 66,683 in the 13th Congressional District, which includes Largo, Clearwater and St. Petersburg.

On November 11, we will pause to honor and acknowledge all veterans. Truly, there should be a monthlong acknowledgement, rather than one day.

November 11 is the anniversary of the signing of the armistice in 1918, which ended the World War I hostilities between the Allied nations and Germany. The first Armistice Day was in 1919, when President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed the

day should be "filled with solemn pride in the heroism of those who died in the country's service and with gratitude for the victory." The day eventually became known as Veterans Day to honor all those who served in the U.S. Military. In Canada November 11 is known as Remembrance Dav.

Some wars may not end in a declared victory. Still, our military members perform heroic deeds, not the least of which is to set aside their own lives to sacrifice themselves in service to our country. Many are young, and give up years and life passages that their non-veteran peers take for granted. Those years and experiences change them forever, sometimes robbing them of experiences they can never replicate in their lives. The time is gone.

For some, the effects of their experiences surface throughout their later lives, with many suffering lifelong health issues related to their service locations or exposures from their jobs.

Many experiences of service are unique and wonderful with veterans gaining lifelong friends, education, training and newfound careers. Some have mixed experiences. On the other end of that spectrum, many suffer through what is called the "horrors of war", when people are faced with killing or being killed, when "normal" is a distant memory, when isolation never goes away, when staying alive is the only goal at that moment. Not many of us stand on that precipice. Not many of us ever feel that loneliness, that danger, or the power of courage and action that propel a person to selfless heroism or simply to do what it takes to survive.

As a group, an estimate by the Veterans Administration indicates there are an estimated 18 million veterans alive today. More than 42 million men and women



have served since the first shots were fired April 19, 1775 in Concord and Lexington, MA, the start of military engagements in the Revolutionary War.

Add to that number all the mothers, fathers, spouses, children and relatives of those veterans. That is a significant portion of the U.S. population whose lives have been affected by military service – the loved ones and the veterans themselves who interrupted their lives to serve their country and to serve all the citizens of the United States.

If, for math purposes, we add another eight people minimum per veteran affected by his or her service – two parents, one spouse, two children, two siblings, that comes to 336 million people over the 245 years of our history. That is five million more people than currently live in the United States, the world's third most populous country. If you add eight other people to the 18 estimated million veterans alive today, that is 144 million people.

Yes, one day of acknowledgement each year is not enough.

This month, the cover of THE LINK features a statue of a Navy sailor at attention and in salute. This statue stands sentry in a driveway at a home in Palm Hill. Every time I see him, I reflect on the meaning of service and duty that this sentry represents.

Most of us know a veteran or have veterans in our families. Their stories are important, especially those who served during a war or in a combat situation or war theater, but all the stories are important.

We know many of those stories through films or from veterans who share their stories, or teach others about military service. But many stories are closed off to us because the veterans hold them tight, as the stories are sad, or the veterans are confused, ashamed or afraid to revisit those memories, or they just wish to keep those stories to themselves. Television documentaries show veterans in their 80s or 90s whose eyes tear, and whose voices tremble or choke up as they reflect on their service time many years ago.

The phrase "heroes walk among us" is meaningful when you look around yourself, and wonder who in your small area of the world was called upon to follow orders into danger, complete a mission, to save someone, to lead others into the unknown, to hurt or kill someone to save someone else, or to see a fellow soldier, sailor or airman die. They don't always talk about it.

At the Georgia Veterans Park in in Cordele, Georgia, not far from the national site of the Andersonville Civil War prison and cemetery, a small museum tells the story of all America's wars. With medals and maps, tatters of uniforms, flags (some with faded blood stains), weapons, photos and narratives, a visitor can start with the American Revolution and move through all the wars right up to the present.



The most impact comes from short stories of the Georgia veterans who were given the Medal of Honor. As you read the descriptions of what they did, you are at the scene with them, and wonder how they did what they did. Then, you turn to the other sections of the museum, war after war, through all the years of our country's history. And you sense the immense weight of the stories of the people who stepped in to serve during times of conflict and war.

Major Steven Pless received the Medal of Honor for his daring helicopter rescue of wounded Americans. Pless, a native of Newnan, Ga., was assigned to the First Marine Aircraft Wing. On Aug. 19, 1967, near Quang Ngai, Vietnam, he responded to an emergency call from a nearby beach. When he got there, he found over 30 enemy soldiers overwhelming a small group of wounded Americans. He proceeded to launch a devastating attack, the aircraft flying so low that it had to fly through the debris created by the explosions. Pless then used the gunship



as a shield to pick up the wounded. Dangerously overloaded, the aircraft bounced off the water four times before becoming airborne.

Sgt. Rodney Davis (1942-1967) born in Macon, Georgia. Davis was awarded the Medal of Honor for giving his life by throwing himself on a hand grenade to save his comrades. Davis, assigned to the First Marine Division, was directing the defense of his platoon near Da Nang on Sept. 6, 1967.

Walking recently through that museum in Cordele, Georgia, it struck me that every community or at least every state should have such a museum to remember their heroes and keep alive the memories of all the sacrifices made during our wars, and to honor all who serve.

These museums show us an essential truth: Freedom isn't free.

To every veteran: Thank you for your service.

(The Veterans History Project within the Library of Congress' American Folklife Center collects, preserves, and makes accessible the personal accounts of American war veterans so that future generations may hear directly from veterans and better understand the realities of war. 

A SOLDIER'S STORY: IS THIS REALLY SPRING By John Caputo, of Palm Hill and Boston, United States Army Retired, Vietnam Veteran

Feeling cold under my camouflage blanket Missing my family and friends back in the real world Wondering if this Spring will erase my memories of The things I've done in Nam

Crying and praying for those who died beside me That beautiful Spring day with the birds chirping Knowing that I will never be the same person That naïve kid from Southie who just didn't know That war is hell on earth even in Spring

(The above was taken from a poem, "Is This Really Spring", that is part of a collection of writings by John Caputo: "It Ain't Nothing", Thoughts from Vietnam; Stories, Poems and a Few Laughs. John is a part-time Palm Hill resident from Boston, and spent many years trying to heal from the experiences and injuries he endured during his military service in Vietnam. Thinking, writing and talking about his experiences have helped him and many others whom he has guided in his careers as a teacher, counselor, coach and school administrator.)

DID YOU KNOW?

While the six branches of the military whose emblems are depicted above are often considered our full armed military force, it may not be widely known that two other branches are also part of the eight branches of the U.S. Uniformed Services whose officers are called upon in times of war or crisis. They are the **U.S. Public Health Service (PHS) and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA)**. Both branches are made up entirely of commissioned officers who are eligible for the same or similar veterans benefits as the veterans of the armed forces. NOAA is the smallest of the uniformed services, with just 321 officers, 16 ships, and 10 aircraft. The Public Health Service has 6,000 officers.



While the PHS and NOAA officers are labeled noncombatants, they can be lent to the Armed Services and they wear Navy or Coast Guard uniforms and hold

Navy or Coast Guard ranks. The PHS mission, whose head is the U.S. Surgeon General, is to deliver public health and disease prevention expertise at home and abroad as well as to disaster areas and areas affected by U.S. military operations. NOAA is a rapid response force, shuttling experts where they need to be in quick succession while supporting peacetime research.

FAMOUS EVENTS THAT HAPPENED IN NOVEMBER

ov. 9, 1989, The Berlin Wall was opened up after standing for 28 years as a symbol of the Cold War. The 27-mile wall was constructed in 1961.

Nov. 10, 1775, The U.S. Marine Corps was established as part of the U.S. Navy. It became a separate unit on July 11, 1789

Nov. 10, 1942, Following the British victory at El Alamein in North Africa during World War II, British Prime Minister Winston Churchill stated, "This is not the end. It is not even the beginning of the end. But, it is perhaps, the end of the beginning."

Nov. 11, 1918, The Armistice brought an end to the fighting of World War I. In many places in Europe, a moment of silence is still observed to honor the fallen soldiers.

Nov. 11, 1938, Irving Berlin's God Bless America was first performed. Written for radio performer Kate Smith, the song became her most requested song.

Nov. 11, 1972, The U.S. turned over its military base at Long Binh to the South Vietnamese, symbolizing the end of U.S. participation in the Vietnam War.

Nov. 11, 1973, Egypt and Israel signed a cease-fire, sponsored by the U.S.

Nov. 28, 1943, The Teheran Conference began, attended by President Franklin Roosevelt, British Prime Minister Winston Churchill, and Soviet Premier Josef Stalin. Among the major topics discussed, a second front in Western Europe, resulting in D-Day, the seaborne invasion of Normandy in northern France on June 6, 1944.

Nov. 29, 1989, Forty-one years of Communist rule came to an end in Czechoslovakia following a 12-day revolution.

Nov. 30, 1782, A provisional treaty was signed between Great Britain and the United States, heralding the end of America's War of Independence - the final battle in the Revolution to become a free country. The final treaty was signed in Paris on Sept. 3, 1783. It declared the U.S. "...to be

NEWS ON REOPENINGS

November 1: North Clubhouse and Shuffleboard centers reopen November 15: Tentative golf pro shop opening

Please see the information about specific activities that will be allowed, (days/hours, and restrictions), later in the LINK on both North and South clubhouses, the shuffleboard centers and previously reopened activities.

NEW CLUBHOUSE HOURS

Monday through Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 8 p.m., both North and South clubhouses.

However, there are exceptions for events or activities that have been approved to be held outside the posted days and hours at the clubhouses, including:Coffees may start earlier than posted recreation hall hours

- Bingo, in the evenings, Tuesday in North (resumption date will be announced); Thursday in South (resumed)
- Sunday service at the North Clubhouse (new, details to be announced at a later date)
- Yoga, begins at 8 a.m., Wednesdays, North Clubhouse

Remember to wear Palm Hill badges when you attend events and enter recreation halls. Fobs are required to enter recreation halls.

No outsiders are permitted at scheduled events.

Mask wearing and social distancing should be followed.

PROTOCOLS FOR GRADUAL RE-OPENINGS AT PALM HILL AS OF LINK DEADLINE:

- Residents or visiting families and guests who do not follow the guidelines below are subject to having their FOBs deactivated and denied access to any of the park amenities.
- Please do your part to follow the guidelines for each amenity at Palm Hill.
- Sign-in sheets will be at all activities. Please sign in.
- Hand sanitizer, wipes, will be available in the laundries, billiard rooms and pool areas.
- Masks will be available inside the South Clubhouse entrance.
- Residents are encouraged to carry their own hand sanitizers as they use the park amenities.

VISITING FAMILY MEMBERS AND GUESTS:

- MUST REGISTER with the office with photo i.d. (ex. driver's license or passport) before they can make use of any park amenity.
- State self-quarantine order for out-of-state guests from New York, New Jersey, Connecticut and Louisiana has been dropped as of August 6, 2020.
- GUEST BADGES: must have and display their guest badges when using any amenity (as permitted re. restrictions as noted in guidelines).

POOLS

RESIDENTS ONLY HOURS: 8:30 AM TO 11 A.M. AND ALSO BETWEEN 2 P.M. AND 10 P.M.

HOURS FOR RESIDENTS AND THEIR GUESTS AND FAMILY MEMBERS: 11 A.M. to 2 P.M.



Number of people allowed in pool areas is limited – check signs at each pool and numbers of people present before using facility (and see number limits below). Residents have priority use if the pool numbers hit maximum. Sign-in required. Bring your own chairs; the number of Park chairs will be limited.

A limited number of chairs and loungers will be available and spaced to comply with the social distancing requirement of six (6) feet. Chairs and loungers should not be moved. Residents and guests should bring a towel to sit on and should sanitize any common use furniture before and after use.

<u>CAPACITY FOR THE POOLS</u> NORTH POOLS – 26; NORTH SPA – 3 (Total 29) SOUTH POOL – 26; SOUTH SPA – 10 (Total 36)

The spa numbers are for people actually in the spa.

The total numbers of 29 for the north and 36 for the south are the total number of people inside the fenced area.

Daily sign-in sheets are required to be filled out.

Residents enjoy priority of use as compared to visiting family members and/or guests in the event pool capacities are being filled.

GOLF COURSE AND PRO-SHOP

The pro shop has a tentative reopening date of November 15.

The playing surface of the golf course is open and play will be conducted as posted on April 25, 2020. the rules have not changed with this update.

- No common use furniture will be located on the pro shop porch.
- Daily sign-in sheets on the table on the porch will continue to be used.
- Course open only for golfing with distancing restrictions between golfers and behind the players in front of you. Wait for players to leave the greens before teeing off. Do not use water fountains. One person to a cart unless household member. (Closed to walkers, bicyclists.)

<u>SHUFFLEBOARD CENTERS: Tuesdays and Thursdays, reopened as of</u> <u>November 1</u>

North and South shuffleboard courts: available for social shuffle from 1 to 3 p.m.

- Masks required
- Play limited to every other lane, allowing for 12 players in each facility and social distancing of six feet.
- Discs and sticks to be sanitized before/after each use.

NORTH AND SOUTH LAUNDRY

The North laundry will be accessible between 8:30 a.m.to 8 p.m. daily.

The South laundry will be accessible between 8:30 a.m. to 8 p.m.


