## EDITOR'S CORNER

**M**illions of words will be written about this year; thousands of digital video hours will document it.

But just for a few moments, let's look backward 100 years to 1920, when women won the right to vote.

It was a time of high anxiety and civil unrest.

The Spanish flu of 1918 was still raging and eventually killed 675,000 in the United States. World War I had just ended. The Bolshevik Revolution in Russia was inflating the "Red Scare" and the country was suffering through violent labor strikes and race riots. Prohibition was in full swing.

That June, anarchists had sent mail bombs to important people in seven U.S. cities. The bombs – within 90 minutes of each other – rocked New York, Boston, Pittsburgh, Cleveland, Washington, D.C., Philadelphia and Patterson, N.J. It was thought the bombs were sent by U.S.-based anarchists whose allegiance was attributed to Luigi Galleani, a radical anarchist who advocated violence as a means to effect change and rid the world of laws and capitalism. The bombs failed; none of the targets were killed.

With that backdrop, in 1919 and 1920, the long road for women's rights finally came to a pivotal legal and legislative moment. The 14th Amendment ratified in 1868 granted citizenship rights and the protection of the Constitution to all those born in or naturalized in the U.S. The 15th Amendment guaranteed the right to vote for black men. After decades of intense activism, in May and June of 1919, the issue of women's suffrage came before the U.S. House of Representatives and the Senate as the 19th Amendment. Congress passed the Amendment on June 4, 1919.

Three-fourths of the states had to ratify it. Some states already allowed women to vote in local and state elections, some states granted women partial voting rights. The ratification of the 19th Amendment by three-fourths of the states would give women across the country the

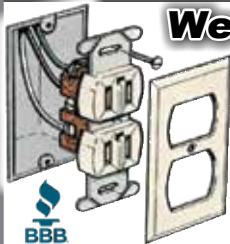

right to vote, guaranteed by the Constitution.

Michigan and Wisconsin were the first states to ratify on June 10, 1919. More than a year later, on Aug. 18, 1920, Tennessee became the 36th state to ratify (49-47 vote) and that sealed the deal: the 19th Amendment giving women the right to vote became the law of the land. The 1920 election became the first U.S. presidential election in which women in every state were permitted to vote. (Warren Harding won.)



Florida was slow on the uptake. In 1920, many Florida politicians and newspaper editors were against women's suffrage. It was not until May 13, 1969 that Florida showed its support for women's suffrage by ratifying the 19th Amendment.

Even though some states did not ratify the amendment in 1919 or 1920, women in those states were able to vote once the 36-state threshold of ratification was passed and the 19th Amendment became law.

### **Persistence and Perseverance – Susan B. Anthony**

Reviewing the timeline presented by the National Park Service shows the variances by regions and dates in how women's rights were interpreted.

The timeline starts on January 21, 1648: "As an unmarried woman with property, and serving as the lawyer for Lord Baltimore, Margaret Brent demands but is denied a vote in Maryland's colonial assembly." Thus, began the journey.

Under the law, women "merged" into their husbands' lives; all property they held, even their citizenship. If they married a "foreigner" they forfeited their citizenship. In some instances and states, married women had fewer legal rights than single women.

In 1848, 200 women met in Seneca Falls, N.Y. to discuss women's rights. Not all agreed on the right to vote, but the women adopted a resolution to push toward that "sacred right". The Seneca Falls Convention was the formal beginning of the women's suffrage movement in the United States.

Fast forward to the 1870s, women were enfranchised in frontier Wyoming Territory in 1869 and in Utah in 1870. In 1872, women's rights advocate and suffragette Susan B. Anthony was arrested for voting in the presidential election. She was indicted, tried, convicted and fined \$100. While women were citizens under the Constitution in 1872, citizenship did not convey the right to vote in the presidential election, a court ruled. The suffrage movement then focused efforts on the passing of a Constitutional Amendment. It would take 48 years before women throughout the country would have the right to vote guaranteed by the U.S. Constitution.

(You have to love Wyoming. When Wyoming applied for statehood, Congress balked regarding the existing state law allowing women to vote. The Wyoming Legislature allegedly retorted back by cable to Congressional Leaders: "We will remain out of the Union one hundred years rather than come in without the women." Congress eventually relented, and before the turn of the century, there were four women's suffrage states – Wyoming (the first state), Utah, Colorado and Idaho. By 1918, women had the right to vote in 15 states.)

## Uphill Battle

According to Wikipedia, The New York Times, after first supporting suffrage, reversed itself and issued stern warnings. A 1912 editorial predicted that with suffrage women would make impossible demands, such as, "serving as soldiers and sailors, police patrolmen or firemen... and would serve on juries and elect themselves to executive offices and judgeships."

Heaven Forbid.

It took a while to crack the highest court of the land. In 1981, President Ronald Reagan fulfilled his campaign promise to nominate the first female to the U.S. Supreme Court. Sandra Day O'Connor became the first female Supreme Court Associate Justice. She had already achieved a prior "first", serving as the first female Majority Leader of a state senate as the Republican leader in the Arizona Senate. Equal rights for both genders under the law was still a work in progress.

The story of women and men fighting to achieve the Constitutionally guaranteed right for women to vote and to obtain equal status under the law is immense in its scope and continuing impact on the political, economic, legal and cultural history of the United States.

On August 18, 2020, 100 years after the ratification of the 19th Amendment, President Donald Trump pardoned women's rights pioneer and advocate Susan B. Anthony for her "crime" of voting in the 1872 presidential election.

Throughout 2019 and 2020, celebrations and exhibits to honor the Centennial of the Women's Right to Vote had been planned, but the Covid 19 pandemic interrupted the ability of people to attend.

Still, there are many resources available online to dive in to the history and learn more.

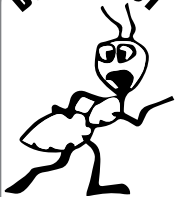

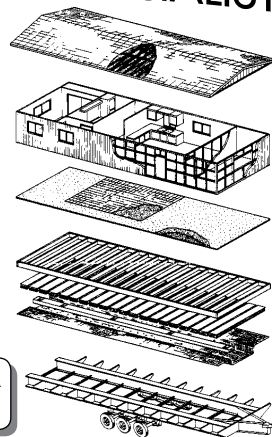

“Sheltering in Place” is another way to say “Left Alone in my Space” for the last six months! While I was anticipating the park being less than half full, I wasn’t prepared for a monastic existence.

When it was still Spring, I enjoyed the outdoors but as the Dog Days have trotted in, I find myself (like most everyone here in Palm Hill) looking for ways to entertain myself. I tried baking (making eight Cake Mix Doctor recipes), read 10 books, organized my closets twice, and cleaned the upholstery on two couches and chairs. Fortunately, when we entered Phase One, I could take brief excursions wearing my mask and gloves.

Once or twice a week I visit my 97-year-old grandfather. I became his caregiver three years ago. He moved from a single-family home to a senior adult apartment tower in Dunedin with a Gulf view. As a man, he was in the minority – one of 40 males among 200 females. Not that he complained!


His complex was locked down three months ago and the dining room closed. Residents now receive meals left at their apartment doors twice a day. Fraternization is frowned on so he relies on email, calling his friends and daily mail runs downstairs. So, what does he do with the other 23 hours?

For entertainment, his lady friends introduced him to mail order catalogs targeted to the senior population. One in particular has items useful even if you didn’t know you needed them. About 200 pages long, it advertises “must haves” such as Snapless Adult Bibs (stop struggling with snaps and fasteners), and what they call “transport chairs.” Everyone else calls them wheelchairs!

Some products are more esoteric. I never realized there was a need out there; where have I been? Headstone Cleaner (deep cleans and renews!). But does it raise the dead? A Cane Keeper (hangs your cane from the table); and a booklet, “Old Jokes for Old Folks (the funny side of aging).

A quick look in his closet will confirm he has been an avid customer. There's a Handy Grabber (does away with reaching and bending), Click N' Go Belt (wish there were more holes in your belt?), and one for me: Magnetic Jewelry Clasps (stop struggling with tricky jewelry fasteners). Shopping from home has never been easier. Thank you, Amazon!

Going to the doctor is easy because I drive him to appointments and we wait in the car until they come to get him, masked and gloved. While his health is fragile, this 97-year-old has an astounding memory and entertains nurses by telling jokes. Every receptionist knows his name and is glad to see him. They ask if he has any "comic cards" for them.

Several years ago, he found the business card template in his word processor and types a joke into each square. He has more than 700 cards now. Two of his favorites include the sayings, "Be nice to nurses – They keep doctors from killing you," and "Do you want to talk to the Doctor in charge, or the Nurse who knows what's going on?"

Some show he hasn't lost his sassy attitude:

- When a woman says, "What?" It's not because she didn't hear you. She's giving you a chance to change what you said.
- You can tell a lot about a woman by her hands. For instance, if they're placed around your throat, she's probably ticked off.
- Good judgment comes from experience, and a lot of that comes from bad judgment.
- Yeah, I've got O. C. D. – Old, Cranky, and Dangerous.
- One of the disadvantages of wine is that it makes a man mistake words for thoughts.
- I can only please one person per day. Today is not your day. Tomorrow doesn't look good either.
- Today's To-Do List: Get out of bed, find coffee, pretend to be human.

So, between his love of catalogs and his sense of humor, he has spent hours entertaining himself and others during the lockdown. And for that I am grateful. When I think of him, a smile spreads across my face and I look forward to the next batch. I hope you've chuckled at least once while reading this. As Stanley would say, "Don't make me use my 'before coffee' voice!"

# SEPTEMBER DAYS OF ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

- **September 7, LABOR DAY:** It was President Grover Cleveland who decided the first Monday of every September would be set aside to celebrate Labor Day, honoring all workers for their contributions to the development and achievements of the United States. ### Cattle and Cracker Cowboys in Florida

Hundreds of years ago, long before tourists or even cities, there was another Florida. When the Spaniard Ponce de León discovered it in 1513, Florida was mostly wide, green spaces. In 1521 when he returned, he brought horses and seven Andalusian cattle, the ancestors of the Texas Longhorns. He knew he'd found pastureland. Spanish explorers turned Florida into America's oldest cattle-raising state.



The early cattle-raising days were rough for Spanish settlers. The St. Augustine missionaries who raised beef also fought Indian raids and mosquitoes. Despite the cattle fever ticks, storms, swamps and snakes, before 1700 there were already dozens of ranches along the Florida Panhandle and the St. Johns River.

### SEAL COATING THE STREETS

Seal Coating the seven miles of streets as well as repainting of stop bars at stop signs, handicap parking space striping, and parking lot striping and stops was completed in early August.

Several road sections were saw cut and then patched with new asphalt prior to the seal coating.

The Board originally approved the use of coal tar sealant on May 6, 2020. After reconsideration, on May 18, 2020 the Board rescinded that decision and approved the use of the polymer-based sealant by TarSeal, with a project cost not to exceed \$79,000 with a 10% contingency of \$7,900 bringing the total approved to \$86,900. Final cost for the project with the additional 757 square feet of asphalt repair (\$4,163.50) and the City of Largo permit fee (\$862.50) was \$84,026.00.

The road drainage grates have also been repainted a bright yellow. Avoiding driving over the grates will help preserve the drainage pipe system.

### **GOLF COURSE AND PRO-SHOP**

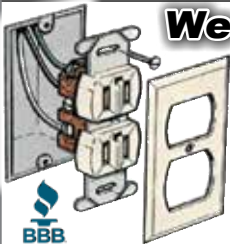

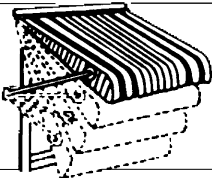
