The Hurricane Preparedness article in this month's Link summarizes the high points of the presentations made during Largo Fire Rescue's annual hurricane preparedness event. There were only a few Palm Hill residents at the event -- perhaps a half-dozen -- so it seemed to us important to provide at least the key points most applicable to Palm Hill.

Presentations were made by eight key city and county officials and by Mike Clay, Bay News 9's chief meteorologist, who we all will rely on -- plus members of his staff -- in the event of a hurricane.

One sub-theme that ran throughout the presentations was that going to one of the public shelters should be a last resort. Presenters referred to them as places where each person might have little more than a 2-by-5 foot space, where restrooms become odorous and unkept, behavior unregulated, noise uncontrolled, etc. An oft-repeated phrase: "A shelter is a lifeboat, not a cruise ship."

Presenters repeatedly cited the desirability of finding refuge in what we mobile home dwellers sometimes refer to as a "real house." Or, if that's not possible, perhaps a local church or civic organization can be found. Or, leave the area.

If the decision is to leave the area, presenters emphasized that the departure should be made before any formal evacuation order is issued. They pointed to the horrendous traffic jams last year when Irma was expected to slam into us with major force; many people made last-minute decisions to leave, and highways became parking lots.

Your Editors can testify to the validity of that last point. We left the area early and drove north on Interstate 75 in traffic that was normal. Only a day later, we sat comfortably in our hotel in Atlanta and saw on TV bumper-to-bumper traffic jams on I-75. Not everyone is going to leave, but if you are, leave early.

A final point emphasized by the presenters: If you choose to seek safety in a local hotel/ motel, make sure it is not in an evacuation zone, lest you move once, then must move again. And, ask whether it has emergency electrical power. Many, the presenters said, don't, so when the electricity goes out the air-conditioning disappears, TV is useless and there's no way to charge cell phones or any other devices.

Last month's appeal for the identities of "Palm Hill Pioneers" drew some immediate response. Your Editors are now in the process of interviews, and hope that the proposed series can begin soon. Meanwhile, please continue to identify yourselves or others. We don't want to begin the series until we're reasonably confident that the first person/couple featured really will be the the one/ones who have lived here the longest.











HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS

wealth of information was presented at Largo Fire Rescue's recent Hurricane Preparedness Event. Here are some highlights, with particular focus on the particular needs and concerns of Palm Hill.

One of the major points made by presenters is that when any mandatory evacuation order is issued, the order applies to all mobile homes, so Palm Hill always is included.

Along with that point, presenters made clear that while "mandatory" doesn't mean that authorities are going to force anyone to leave their home, the mandatory order does have great significance. It means that anyone who chooses to stay in place despite the evacuation order needs to understand that if they need help from fire or police, that help might not be available.

For example, presenters said that when winds reach between 30 and 35 miles per hour, transportation to general shelters and to special needs shelters stops. And when winds reach 45 to 65 miles per hour, the fire department and the police are unable to answer calls for assistance.

One of the pieces of information presented that applies particularly to Palm Hill is that there is specific assistance available for those with special needs, such as oxygen concentrator use, limited mobility such as wheelchair use, moderate/middle stage memory impairment, adult incontinence, or other needs.

There are three special needs shelters in Pinellas County, apart from the general public shelters, and the assistance available includes transportation to those shelters.

In addition to providing transportation to special needs shelters, transportation also is provided to residents who require transportation to a general shelter.

Presenters emphasized that those who have special needs must register to get the help that the program provides. And, they emphasized, people should register now, not wait until a hurricane is headed our way or is forming and could head our way.

Also, those without special needs but who need transportation to a general shelter must register before a hurricane is upon us.

To register, go <u>www.pinellascounty.org/emergency</u> or call Pinellas County Emergency Management at 727-464-3800. Once registered, you will find out -- ahead of time -- whether you qualify for the special needs program.

Also of particular interest for those Palm Hill residents who have pets: Pets are allowed in only a few shelters, but it may be possible to get help for pets if the pet owner makes prior arrangements. More information about that can be found at the website and phone number cited in the paragraph above.

The day's theme could be summed up like this: Help is available, but it must be asked for ahead of time.

HURRICANE REMINDERS

In the event of a hurricane, remember that the first priority of our maintenance staff is to ensure that the Palm Hill common areas -- the clubhouses and other facilities -- are secured. Items outside homes that could become airborne in high winds should be secured by homeowners.



If circumstances permit, the staff will pick up small items that have been left outside homes, such as plants, statues, tool, lawn furniture, etc. The staff will take those items to the maintenance area, but they cannot be responsible for the items' fate.




