Hurricane Preparedness

urricane season starts June 1st and Largo Fire Rescue wants you to be prepared! Living in a manufactured home means you are in evacuation zone A. This means that in the event of a significant storm, you will be asked to evacuate your home and seek shelter in a NON evacuation zone.



You have a few options for evacuation.


- Stay with a family member or friend in a NON evacuation zone. 1.
- 2. Stay in a hotel in a Non evacuation zone. Call your local hotels to find out what zone they are in.
- Stay in a public shelter. 3.

There are general shelters, special needs shelters, and pet friendly shelters throughout Pinellas County.

A special needs shelter has medical staff on site and provides electricity for medical equipment such as CPAP machines, and refrigeration for insulin. To register for a special needs shelter, call Pinellas County Emergency Management at (727) 464-3800 to receive a form by mail. Then mail the form to



If we are told that we have to evacuate, we MUST GO, we cannot stay for any reason.

- 1. Let your family know where you are going.
- 2. Do not return to your home unless there is power.
- Call the management office to ask if it is safe to return to the 3. community.



If you chose to go to a shelter, do not leave until you are told that your home is safe and 4. it is OK to do so. Once you leave the shelter, you cannot return. Make sure you bring: a blanket, a pillow, toiletries, towels and washcloths, change of clothes for 7 days with you to the shelter and whatever food/drinks you want. During Irma the shelters were running very low on food and drinks and ran out of cots.

- ▶ Should have food and water to last each person for at least 3 days. In Pinellas County, it is a good idea to plan for up to 10 days of food and water per person in case the county would be cut off from the mainland for some time.
- ▶ Have all your needs on hand: fill your prescriptions, radios, batteries, phone chargers, flashlights and first-aid kits. Battery operated radio or weather Alert Radio and battery operated fans these can be purchased at Walmart or Amazon are also good ideas.
 - ► Gas up your vehicle.
 - ► Make sure you have extra cash on hand. ATM machines might be out of order.

Put everything in a box - all your important documents in a waterproof pouch (ex: extralarge ziplock bags) and keep them in a safe place. If you evacuate take them with you. Ex: car and home insurance info. / car and home titles / passports / a copy of your medication list and medical condition you are being treated for, etc.

Preparing to leave:

Bring in all outside items (grills, planters, lawn objects, furniture, etc.) Clean out your refrigerator/freezer. Shut OFF water and electrical breakers in your panel box.




The Men's Club is remaining low key with the hope that the fall season will be much safer and we can all meet again in our normal fashion. Until then, try to stay safe and stay healthy.



MULCHING

ulch is any material that is spread over the soil as a covering. Reasons for applying mulch include conservation of soil moisture, improving fertility and health of the soil and reducing weed growth. In nature, plants that require mulch will grow where mulch, such as leaf litter, is available, and plants that don't need mulch will grow where mulch is absent. Generally, healthy yards don't need mulch. But, as a landscaper you often have to work with an unnatural situation: sun loving grass planted under trees, or woodland plants in dry and compacted soil. Some issues can be solved with the use of mulch. tires

The first choice for a planting bed are good plants, good soil and compost and if available natural mulch like fall leaves. Commercial mulches can be good solutions for pathways, playgrounds. Used hay or wood chips from a cut tree can be used as well. If you have nutritionally depleted, poor or compacted soil, but you have no compost available to amend the soil, then mulches can be a good temporary solution to create protection and to restore the soil.

Some industries produce wood chips as a by-product, so wood chips are easily available. The biggest problem with wood chips and other heavily applied mulches is that, not only do they prevent weeds, but they also smother plants with soft stems, and prevent plantings from spreading. The abundance of the use of wood chips has resulted in an omnipresent landscaping feature: trees and shrubs surrounded by wood mulch but absent of plants and flowers. This type of landscaping isn't very appealing, but more important, it offers very little opportunity for pollinators or insect-eating birds.

Military Commissaries Limit Meat Purchases Amid Supply Chain Worries

Citing supply chain strains and anticipated shortages as a result of the novel coronavirus pandemic, the agency that manages military commissaries says some stores will start limiting how much fresh meat customers can purchase. Starting May 1, commissaries within the 50 states and in Puerto Rico will limit purchases of fresh beef, poultry and pork, the Defense Commissary Agency announced Thursday evening. For fresh beef, pork, chicken and turkey, customers will be limited to purchasing two items per visit, according to the announcement. "There may be some shortages of fresh protein products in the coming weeks," Robert Bianchi, a retired

Navy rear admiral and the Defense Department's special assistant for commissary operations, said in a statement. "Enacting this policy now will help ensure that all of our customers have an opportunity to purchase these products on an equitable basis."

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) has recently updated several of their health apps and made them available for those who use mobile devices which are manufactured by companies other than Apple. Two of the more popular applications recently updated for Android phones are the iBlueButton app and the MyLinks program. The iBlueButton app lets you download all of your VA, Tricare and Medicare health records onto your mobile device, allowing you to view all your medical information in one place and share it with whomever you wish, including civilian doctors, and family members. You have 24/7 access to a listing of all of your medications, vital signs, medical conditions, allergies, immunizations, lab results, diagnostic tests, medical history and more, all in an easy to navigate application. The app also gives you personalized health warnings and care guidelines, lists possible drug side effects and interactions and lets you add documents and remarks to your record as you wish. To download the iBlueButton app, visit the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store on your mobile device.

The MyLinks program allows you to share your personal medical information from civilian providers as well as personal information from fitness trackers, wearable or mobile devices with your VA medical care team. While the number of civilian doctors participating in the program is somewhat limited, it is expanding on a daily basis. You can also share data from wearable devices such as Fitbit, Samsung, Google or Apple; and data contained in fitness applications on your phone such as Google Fit or Apple Health directly with your doctor, assisting them with diagnoses and treatments. You must have an active MyHealtheVet account to use these programs. To share your information, you need to authorize access to their health information using a VA-approved authentication method before an app can access any of your data. You can cancel your participation and remove your data from these programs at any time.






In Memoriam






