Paradise Island 2015 Co-Op Annual Meeting

The Paradise Island Co-Op held its annual meeting in the clubhouse on the evening of January 21, 2015. Over 122 members attended either in person or by proxy. The four candidates up for reelection were unopposed and therefore reelected. Subsequent election of board officers yielded the following results: Keith Knowles, President; Pat Humphries, Vice President; Janyce Cruse, Treasurer; and Ron Anderson, Secretary.

Keith Knowles announced that it is a pleasure to report on the state of the Corporation.

- First, he stated that we closed out our books for 2014.
- In the past, some members have asked about the number of homes in default. We currently have 23 homes in default and we expect to collect the money owed us in the great majority of those cases.
- We have a vacancy rate of approximately 5%. The industry average vacancy rate for parks like ours is 10%. Having a low vacancy rate positively affects the price that people are able to get on their homes when they choose to sell.
- We are selling share properties as vigorously as we are selling non-share properties in this park.
- Pres. Knowles called the attention of the members present to the poster board before them that displayed a design concept for our new road sign. The situation with the current sign is that it is falling apart and must be replaced. In order to do so, according to the city of Largo, we must go to a monument-type sign that adheres to all of the regulations the city of Largo has placed on signs of this type. The designer submitted two sign concepts with the board choosing the one before the members as the one that best represents this community. We plan to have a smaller sign at the south end of the property to alert drivers of our location, eliminating the complaint of northbound drivers that say our present sign is not easily seen when traveling in that direction. Negotiations with the city of Largo are continuing.
- Nancy Perry, Park Manager, made a presentation on current projects around the park.
- The road repaying project is completed for the entire park.
- A contractor has been engaged to repair the floor in the clubhouse ladies room. New tiles have been ordered and work is scheduled to be performed in the near future.
- Speeding and failure to stop at all STOP signs continue to be a problem. Park residents are the main culprits. If you see a neighbor violating the driving rules please ask them to comply with the reasonable regulations. If your neighbor fails to do so, please come to the office and file an anonymous complaint and the office will send that person a letter and can escalate the matter to sterner solutions if necessary.
- Nancy thanked all those who extended their condolences on the passing of her mother.

Pres. Knowles opened the floor for questions and answers from the members present.

Q: What can be done about people parking on the sidewalks?

A: We admonish people not to do that but it is difficult to police. It was pointed out that park-

ing in the street reduces the ability of emergency vehicles to maneuver when entering the park. Q: Are garage sales allowed in the park?

A: Garage sales are not allowed in the driveway but they are allowed in a residence home.

Q: Has the limit on the size of dogs changed?

A: Keith repeated that whenever we see an oversized dog we should report the owner's lot number to the office. Keith responded to a follow-on question about whether or not we check for the size of dogs when new residents come into the park. He answered yes, we do, but they lie. Nancy added that we will soon require a veterinarian's weight certificate for any pet before a prospective resident can bring an animal into the park. It was noted that service animals are allowed in the park regardless of weight. Another follow-on question asked if guests can bring in large dogs for a short visit. The answer is: no — no dogs over 40 pounds.

Q: Are the cameras at the entrance to the park working?

A: The cameras are working but the computer is not. This issue will be addressed as soon as possible.





SCAMMERS on the Internet

ithin the last few months I received at least four fraudulent contacts claiming to be from financial institutions. Two had the recognizable logo of Wells Fargo, with whom I bank; and two from other financial institutions. Each said that there had been multiple attempts to access my account which may have been fraudulent, please sign on with my correct name and password. I did not do so, but contacted the bank, got the toll free number of their fraud department and forwarded the e-mails to them for their action. Needless to say, I did not respond to the others. I just want folks to be aware that this is happening. Many times I get e-mails from legitimate contacts that say something like; Hey, thought you'd be interested in this... then show a link. NEVER CLICK ON ONE OF THOSE LINKS! These are phishing scams. If you click on the link they will infect your computer and access everyone on your mailing list. Just be aware and protect yourself, your data, and your finances. These scammers also call by phone. They claim to be from Microsoft, Dell or other computer related companies. They say that your computer is in danger and you must turn control of your computer over to them immediately or it will crash. NEVER ALLOW THEM TO TAKE OVER YOUR COMPUTER. These companies do not make unsolicited calls, those making the calls are also phishing scammers.




