Co-op Corner

SOME IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING CONTRACTORS

The first and most important fact that most people are not aware of is that it is the homeowner's responsibility to be sure that they only hire contractors that are licensed and insured. This fact is important for several reasons:

- The County holds the homeowner legally responsible if they hire an uninsured and unlicensed contractor.
- The homeowner is responsible for any damage to their home or the property of others caused by an uninsured contractor.
- If any uninsured contractor gets injured while working for the homeowner the homeowner will be responsible for their medical bills.
- Never hire a contractor that is unlicensed and uninsured.

All work done by contractors has be done only Monday through Friday between the hours of 8:00 am and 5 pm. Inside work can be done at other times as long as it does not create a disturbance. Remodeling or construction material waste should be removed either by the contractor performing the work or by the homeowner. Maintenance staff will reject large pieces of furniture, rugs, or appliances, etc. set out for removal. Residents must then make other arrangements to remove these materials from the community.

There are individuals in the park with police records that are providing services to our residents. Despite our best efforts, we have been unable to remove these individuals from the community. You can help do that by asking any individual seeking to work for you if they have a police record and if you are uncertain of their answer check the police department yourself or call the office for information.

If someone comes to your door seeking to do work for you, send them away. This action is in your best interest for two reasons: First, there is no soliciting allowed in Paradise Island; second and most important: THEY WILL CHEAT YOU!

Memorial Day, May 25. Remember those men and women who gave their lives in the service of the country.



Lupus is an autoimmune disease in which the patient's immune system attacks healthy parts of his or her own body, resulting in inflammation, swelling, and pain, among other symptoms.

What can make lupus dangerous is when it attacks vital organs such as the heart, lungs, or liver. It is more likely to affect women than men, as well as people of non-European descent. However, if caught early, those affected by lupus have a good chance of living normal and healthy lives.

Symptoms of lupus include the following, and if it seems like many apply to yourself, you may want to visit your doctor:



- Joint and muscle pain. Arthritis is another common side effect of lupus. Almost three-fourths of all patients report joint and muscle pain to be the first sign that they have lupus. Look for arthritis in the wrists, small joints of the hands, elbows, knees, and ankles.
- Skin irritation. Many lupus patients wind up with skin rashes, especially on the face. Sores, flaky red spots, and scaly rashes are also possible, and can be located on the face, neck, back, hands, and arms.
- Chest pain. The disease can cause inflammation of the heart and the lungs, which can result in very strong chest pains that can put people at an increased risk of a heart attack or a stroke.




