His shot landed about second hole. three feet from the hole and trickled in. The crowd went wild. A hole-in-one is something every golfer dreams of scoring. Most never do. I am one of them. Watching this reminded me of a couple of these thrilling shots from my past as a member of the Nashua (NH) Country Club (NCC). It is a remarkable feat regardless of the conditions under which a golfer is playing. A notable one took place one Friday early evening during the club's "Mickey and Minnie Mouse," couples' only, weekly golf outing. It was a nine hole fun event that was always followed by a cocktail hour and dinner in the clubhouse dining room. On this evening, my wife, Cheryl, and I were paired with Bruce and Jane Gilbert. The second hole was a 146 yard, par 3, with an elevated tee box and about a 60 degree drop to a green surrounded by sand traps and woods. Bruce hit a very high floating shot that fell quite short of the green. The ball took a high bounce, rolled between the traps, and continued to roll across the green and fell into the hole. It was amazing to witness and a momentary thrill for Bruce. I say momentary because his wife, Jane, was quick to announce, "Good honey, now you get to buy the drinks for everyone." I thought Bruce was going to pass out. (For those unaware, when a golfer scores a hole-in-one the drinks are on him or her) It can be quite costly. Fortunately, Bruce had invested in a Hole-in-One insurance policy. Smart man! On another occasion, I was playing in a Rotary Club charity event at NCC with a group of friends. The ninth hole, a short 133 yards, was a very interesting one surrounded by water. Here, the Rotarians were holding a raffle for a brand new shiny red Buick for anyone scoring a hole-in-one. Anyone interested could take a swing at winning the car for a \$10 entry fee. Of course, everyone participated. Who wouldn't pay \$10 for a new Buick? There was an alternate prize of three new golf balls if the tee shot landed on the green, so it made the investment fair to everyone, especially the Rotarians. My playing partner, Brad Thorp, mentioned that his wife, JoAnn, was in the market for a new car and winning her a free one would make her very happy. He paid the fee, teed up the ball, took his best swing, and hit his shot into the water. Because it results in a one stroke penalty, Brad had to tee up again and take another swing. Well, as luck would have it, he hit his ball over the water, onto the green, and into the hole. Someone shouted out, "A hole-in-one!" I responded, "No, it's a hole-in-three." The entire group of onlookers went nuts with laughter. Brad stood there dumbfounded. "How am I going to explain this to JoAnn," he shouted. I turned to Brad and said, "I know, Brad, but think of the story you will be able to tell your grandchildren." To this day, Brad and I talk and laugh about the day he almost won the new car. Finally, there was the interesting golf story about the priest who decided to take a Sunday away from the congregation to play nine holes of golf. On the fourth hole, he scored a hole-in-one. He was thrilled to think he had finally scored an ace. Unfortunately, he was upset because couldn't tell anyone. Afterwards, the greenskeeper approached him saying, "I saw you score that hole-in-one, Father Bill." The priest replied, "That's good, Wally, but when you die you will go directly to Hell if you tell anyone."


