

E xercise and physical activity are good for just about everyone and very important in older adults. There are four main types and each type is different. Doing them all will give you more benefits.

- Endurance, or aerobic, activities increase your breathing and heart rate. Brisk walking or jogging, dancing, swimming, and biking are examples.
- Strength exercises make your muscles stronger. Lifting weights or using a resistance band can build strength.
- Balance exercises help prevent falls
- Flexibility exercises stretch your muscles and can help your body stay limber

Simply walking has major health benefits. Park Royale is a perfect venue to accommodate those who want to perform this exercise daily. Sidewalks, wide streets, decreasing temperature and lower humidity assists in your success of performing this exercise consistently. I love observing everyone's foliage and landscape as I pass by very early in the morning. Occasionally meeting others along my way is met with a greeting that brightens my day.

Regular brisk walking can help you:

- Maintain a healthy weight
- Prevent or manage various conditions, including heart disease, high blood pressure and type 2 diabetes

- If you have not been active, you can start slowly and work up to your goal. How much exercise you need depends on your age and health. Check with your health care provider on what is right for you.

<u>Perfect Pumpkin Pie:</u> Ingredients

- 1 (15 ounce) can pumpkin
- 1 (14 ounce) can EAGLE BRAND(R) Sweetened Condensed Milk
- 2 large eggs
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon


- 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 (9 incĥ) unbaked pie crust

- Directions
- 1. Preheat oven to 425 degrees F. Whisk pumpkin, sweetened condensed milk, eggs, spices and salt in medium bowl until smooth. Pour into crust. Bake 15 minutes.
- 2. Reduce oven temperature to 350 degrees F and continue baking 35 to 40 minutes or until knife inserted 1 inch from crust comes out clean. Cool. Garnish as desired. Store leftovers covered in refrigerator.
