Interesting USA Trivia

n this day in 1776, the Declaration of Independence was approved by the Continental Congress, starting the 13 colonies on the road to freedom as a sovereign nation. As always, this most American of holidays will be marked by parades, fireworks and backyard barbecues across the country.

Patriotic Places

31

Number of places nationwide with "liberty" in their name. The most populous one is Liberty, Missouri (29,149). Iowa has more of these places than any other state: four (Libertyville, New Liberty, North Liberty and West Liberty).

- Eleven places have "independence" in their name. The most populous of these is Independence, Missouri, with 116,830 residents.
- Five places adopted the name "freedom." New Freedom, Pennsylvania with 4,464 residents, has the largest population among these.continued on page 9



- There is one place named "patriot" Patriot, Indiana, with a population of 209.
- And what could be more fitting than spending the day in a place called "America"? There are five such places in the country, with the most populous being American Fork, Utah with 26,263 residents.

Fourth of July Barbecue

As with many holidays, the 4th of July celebration includes food, drink and the realization of how fortunate we are as a nation.

More than 81 million

Number of Americans who said they have taken part in a barbecue during the previous year. It's probably safe to assume a large number of these events took place on the Fourth.

Although we do not have a fixed menu for the celebration of the Fourth, you can almost count on traditional favorites such as hamburgers and hot dogs, chicken, ribs, garden salads, potato salad, chips and watermelon. Following is a summary of where these foods come from.

- There's a 1-in-6 chance the beef on your backyard grill came from Texas. The Lone Star State is the leader in the production of cattle and calves.
- The chicken on your barbecue grill probably came from one of the top broiler-producing states: Georgia, Arkansas, Alabama, North Carolina and Mississippi.
- The lettuce in your salad or on your hamburger probably was grown in California, which accounts for nearly three-quarters of USA lettuce production.
- Fresh tomatoes in your salad most likely came from Florida or California, which, combined, produced more than two-thirds of U.S. tomatoes. The ketchup on your hamburger or hot dog probably came from California, which accounts for 95 percent of processed tomato production.
- As to potato salad or potato chips or fries, Idaho and Washington produces about one-half of the nation's spuds.
- For dessert, six states California, Florida, Texas, Georgia, Arizona and Indiana combined to produce about 80 percent of watermelons last year.
- And the apples in your apple pie? They most likely came from Washington or New York, the two top apple producing states.

Fourth of July Fireworks

\$190.7 million

The value of fireworks imported from China, representing the bulk of all U.S. fireworks imports (\$197.3 million) in 2010. US. exports of fireworks, came to just \$37 million in 2010, with Japan purchasing more than any other country (\$6.3 million).

U.S. Flags

\$3.2 million

The dollar value of U.S. imports of American flags in 2010; more than half of this amount (\$2.8 million) was for U.S. flags made in China.

Other places where American flags are flown continuously include Fort McHenry in Baltimore, Maryland; the United States Marine Corp Memorial (Iwo Jima) in Arlington, Virginia; on the Battle green in Lexington, Massachusetts; and over the White House in our nation's capitol.

State Park Lakes & Beaches

66 million

Number of visits in a recent year to U.S. national parks - a particularly scenic locale for a July 4th picnic. There were 766 million visits in a recent year to another popular picnic venue - state parks or recreation areas. Those in California (80 million), Ohio (58 million), New York (56 million), Washington (48 million) and Illinois (44 million) recorded the highest number of visits.

You may or may not be able to picnic there, bu a visit to a national historical site is a particularly fitting way to celebrate our nation's heritage. In a recent year, about 72 million people flocked to national historical sites and 24 million to national monuments.

Coming to America

33.5 million

The number of foreign-born residents in the United States in 2003. They accounted for 11.7 percent of the nation's total population.

- More than 1-in-3 foreign-born residents were naturalized U.S. citizens.
- Among the foreign-born population, 63 percent were born in Latin America, 25 percent in Asia, 14 percent in Europe, and the remaining 8 percent in other regions of the world, such as Africa.

Things You May or May Not Have Known About July 4th

The Fourth of July is a spectacular day: fireworks, picnics and music all in the name of our country's freedom. So while you're out having a great time with your family and friends, here is some trivia to share:

It's well known that John Adams loved the Fourth of July, but he wrote we actually declared our independence from Britain on July 2.

The Second Day of July 1776, will be the most memorable Epocha, in the History of America, Adams wrote on July 3, 1776. It ought to be solemnized with pomp and Parade, with Shews, Games, Sports, Guns, Bells, Bonfires and Illuminations from one End of this Continent to the other from this time forward forever more.

Here's an interesting fact, three of American's first five presidents died on July 4.

Bitter rivals John Adams, the second president, and Thomas Jefferson, the third, died hours apart on July 4, 1826, the 50th anniversary of the Declaration. Adams was 90 and passed away in Massachusetts and Jefferson was 83 and died in Virginia.

The fifth president, James Monroe, died on the Fourth in 1831.

But enough talk of death on a day for celebration. Calvin Coolidge, the 30th president, and Malia Obama, daughter of the 44th, were born on the Fourth.

Even though the Fourth of July is America's birthday, we're not the only ones who celebrate it, surprisingly enough, Denmark began celebrating our Independence Day in 1912 after thousands of Danes immigrated to the USA, ABC News stated.

The Fourth of July wasn't a legal federal holiday until Congress declared it to be so in 1941.

Happy Independence Day! To add to today's celebrations, here are some interesting and fun facts about the 4th of July.

1. The first Independence Day celebration took place in Philadelphia on July 8, 1776. This was also the day that the Declaration of Independence was first read in public after people were summoned by the ringing of the Liberty Bell.

2. The Declaration of Independence was first presented to Congress on June 28, 1776, after more than a year of trying to appeal the practice of taxation by England without

representation in the English Parliament.

3. The flag was adopted on June 14, 1777.

4. 0 flags are flown 24 hours a day at the Washington Monument.

- 5. Originally, the stars on the flag were arranged in a circle to denote the equality of all the colonies.
- 6. Setting off firecrackers formed part of the early Independence Day celebrations. This made the horses miserable.
- 7. Thomas Jefferson died on the 50th anniversary of the declaration of Independence. So did John Adams who also signed the Declaration.
- 8. Iowa has more places with "liberty" in its name than any other state (there are 31 places nationwide). There are also places with 'freedom,' 'Independence,' and 'patriot.'
- 9. According to one article, if Benjamin Franklin had had his way, the turkey would have been the animal on the flag instead of the bald eagle.
- 10. Only John Hancock actually signed the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776. All the others signed later.

11. President Calvin Coolidge was born on July 4, 1872.

- 12. Bristol, Rhode Island has been celebrating independence continuously since 1785.
- 13. Only 2.5 million people lived in the U.S. in 1776, about 314 miooion live here now.
- 14. The 4th of July only became a national holiday in 1941.

15. The White House held its first 4th of July party in 1801.

- 16. Barbecue is big on Independence Day, with more than 74 million Americans planning one. We eat around 150 million hot dogs and buy around 700 million pounds of chicken.
- 17. Fireworks are traditional on July 4th, but these were actually invented in China. The U.S. imported \$232.3 million worth of fireworks in 2011.
- 18. The U.S. imports about \$3.6 million American flags each year, most of them from China.

19. In 1954, the words 'under God' were added to the Pledge of Allegiance.

20. The tune of the National Anthem was originally used by an English drinking song called "To Anacreon in Heaven."

Fun Fruit Pizza

If you don't want to go to the work of making your own 'crust' ... get a full of 'sugar cookie dough' and press it out on the pizza pan. Bake at 350 degrees for about 15 to 18 minutes and top with the cream cheese mixture and fruit!

Ingredients:

2 cups all-purpose flour

1/2 cup confectioners' sugar

1 cup cold butter

1 (8 ounce) package cream cheese, softened

1/3 cup sugar

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

2 cups halved fresh strawberries

1 (11 ounce) can mandarin oranges, drained

1 cup fresh blueberries



Glaze:

1 cup unsweetened pineapple juice

1 teaspoon lemon juice

Directions:

In a large bowl, combine flour and confectioners' sugar. Cut in butter until crumbly. Press onto an ungreased 12-in. pizza pan. Bake at 350 degrees F for 12-15 minutes or until very lightly browned. Cool on a wire rack.

In a small mixing bowl, beat the cream cheese, sugar and vanilla until smooth. Spread over crust. Arrange the strawberries, oranges and blueberries on top.

For glaze, in a small saucepan, combine sugar and cornstarch. Stir in pineapple juice and lemon juice until smooth. Bring to a boil; cook and stir for 2 minutes or until thickened. Cool slightly. Drizzle over fruit. Refrigerate until chilled.





How many people signed the Declaration of Independence on July 4th? (Two)

The Old Coot Is A Hotdog Connoisseur

went into a national chain grocery store to get some hot dogs the other day. I like hot dogs; they were a food staple when I was a kid. We'd hike into the woods outside our neighborhood with WW-II Army surplus knapsacks on our backs. metal canteens hanging from our belts, high-cut boots on our feet and decked out in jeans (which we called dungarees in those days) and white T-shirts, the only color available. They were undershirts after all, and back then, white was the mandated color for underclothes.

We hiked for 15 minutes, a steep climb up South Mountain, came to a level spot on the first of three unpaved roads that crossed the face of the hill and collapsed to the ground. We were one-quarter of the way to the top; it was 9 o'clock in the morning and, "Time for lunch!" We gathered leaves, made a pile, set it on fire, found a stick, speared a hot dog and stuck it in the flames, quickly turning it from pretty pink to charred black. A slice of bread served as a hot dog bun and mustard from a jar we'd smuggled from the house combined to craft a gourmet meal.

It was with that memory in mind that I strolled up to the packaged meat cooler to grab some hot dogs to take home and blacken. That's where my trip down nostalgia lane screeched to a sudden halt. I couldn't figure out what to buy, what might taste like those hot dogs of my youth. There were too many choices. All-beef franks, skinless franks, chicken, pork, turkey dogs. Every combination thereof. Plus: long dogs, plumping dogs, short dogs, skinny dogs, bun size dogs. Dogs, dogs, dogs.

It's like that in every aisle. Too many choices! Talk about complicating your life. Even staples like milk, eggs and cereal are complicated. A quart of milk was all we had in my day. No consternation at the milk cooler. Not today: quarts, gallons and half gallons are the first layer of choices. Then comes the fat content: whole milk, 1 percent, 2 percent, no fat, skim. Does it really make that much difference? Probably not. Egg choices are just as bad: medium eggs (which is another way of saying small eggs), large eggs, extra large and jumbo. Eggs from hen house chickens, free range chickens or cage free chickens. White eggs, brown eggs, green eggs (though not at the supermarket) and other colors too. Which is the best? I wouldn't dare answer; it's kind of like stepping into the middle of an argument between Republicans and Democrats or Sunnis and Shites. No middle ground. Then there are the "sort-of-eggs:" egg whites, eggbeaters, egg mates and smart cups. It makes my head spin. Want a box of regular Cheerios? Good luck. The cereal aisle is 80 feet long and 6 feet high. More variations of the two or three cereal grains than an old coot can comprehend.

We've become food paranoid, and yes, quite finicky. But, in spite of the challenge I did finally make a hot dog buying decision. I used the old coot method and bought the cheapest ones. It really doesn't matter when you burn them to a crisp.




