Pool Improvement Club

The season is scurrying by so quickly! It especially does that when you arrive early in December and you set your feet to running in six different directions at once!

After the car was emptied, Al and I went over the Pool Improvement Club books since the April 4th meeting. Our dear neighbor, Lou Lowery, took care of everything the pool needed while we were gone. He had the straps replaced on all the lounges throughout the summer, that were ready to adorn the beautiful deck that was re-done at the approval and direction of the Board of Governors this October. It looks absolutely fantastic!

There have been a few cracks showing up on the deck, but the company that did the work guarantees the job and will epoxy and fix them as needed. The deck is guaranteed for 10 years without the need to be painted over. That should be a major plus for the pool club.

Lou continued to look after the aluminum cans collected and took them to be recycled through the summer and fall months in my absence. "Thank you Lou, that is a rough job!" Especially when the cans still have beer and pop in them and they spill out and get sticky and attract the bees!

Please try to recycle clean empty cans and crushed if possible. WE have a hand crusher that Bob Burns has volunteered to install on the Aluminum Can shed. If anyone cares to, you can crush your cans.

Thanks to Roy MacKenzie for helping to keep his hands on the cans this season. He has been a great help to our PIC! His wife Debbie is our new Secretary! thank you both for stepping up to our needs, you are most appreciated.

Don Crouteau will also be doing the cans throughout the warm season, he has been very generous to setup up, especially since our dear friend and pillar to our Club, Bob D'Ascoli along with his wife, Carol, have moved this winter to assisted living. God bless them! Bob served for years as the PIC Treasurer and official "Can Man." I thank him from the bottom of my heart.

The Pool rules and regulations had to be updated just before Christmas because a new inspector from Largo failed us. Upon his inspection, we did not have the proper signage, a "NO DIVING" or "NO JUMPING" sign in four inch lettering, also "NO GLASS IN THE POOL AREA" needed to be posted.

It is important for everyone to acquaint or reacquaint yourselves with the rules posted and all the new signs.

The rule for "No food and drink within 4 feet of the wet deck area" is LAW according to our Largo Inspector. that means that the areas around the pool on the North, south and East are "no-no's" due to the insufficient footage. You are permitted to use the umbrellas tables and all chair and lounges west toward the pavilion for your plastic covered drinking vessels. No Alcohol is allowed in the pool area. Food and alcohol as an unwritten rule was always taken to the pavilion area for consumption.

Remember you need to apply "Sunscreen Lotions" at least 15 to 30 minutes before going into the sun. No sunscreen is to applied in the fenced in pool area. Never wear "Suntan Oils" into the pool; this can gunk up the pool filter, soil the rim and damage the chairs and lounges.

Another unwritten rule is no large floatation devices permitted in the pool. We must have respect for all the other bathers basking in the sunshine. If you want to do laps the length of the pool, go under the ropes, do not remove the ropes, that is a safety violation.

Please remember to shower before entering and after exiting the pool. Clean up after yourselves when you or your guess use the pool. Return your chairs and lounges to the proper location and positions. Take all your belonging when you leave.

If anyone vomits or does feces or bleeds int eh pool or areas within the fence, everyone must exit the pool and call a Governing Board Member to close the pool until the matter is removed and thoroughly cleansed. please do no to into the pool if you or your guests feels ill or if you have an open wound. Spare everyone the heartache.

Common sense and common courtesy play a "HUGE" role in our rules and regulations. If it sounds to you of disrespect or a violation, then please do not do it.



I was only given the ok to use the Shuffle area to the East side of the courts only, which was understandable due to Shuffle Fun Day held the week after the Yard Sale. Still no space for Furniture. You cannot image my heart and my disappointment.

As the WES approached closer and closer, I still could not find someone that wanted our exces. I hung on to different leads as long as I could. It was suggested that possibly "Down Yonder" wanted what we had left. Could it be" They would have liked it very much, but alas, NO, they did not have the facility to hold it over. So as I was getting pushed to have that signed contract to the office, I called At Junk back to get the contract. Never ever thinking it would be insufficient for our needs. Not just one load, not two loads, but 3 loads was their capability of the truck they brought! Thank God for Bob Burns negotiating to take it all for \$800.00 dollars. I felt so sick and defiled! After working so hard for so long then coming to this point, I was numb. Raped of all the good that was done and that I had let all of you down. I'm very sorry we all had to go through all of this.

We did make money. Even though we did not have as much merchandise as last year, we did have a lot of quality items. We did sell \$3,494.27 worth of goods. After the expenses of \$1,143.32, we scored \$2,350.95. Giving five clubs a total of \$470.19 each. For this I am most grateful to all of you and your labors. God bless you all and God bless Ranch Mobile Home Park.

Reuben Casserole

- 3/4 cup cubed rye bread
- 2 ($10\frac{1}{2}$ ounce) cans of cream of mushroom soup
- 1-1/2 cups milk
- 1/2 cup finely chopped onions
- 3/4 pound deli sliced corned beef, chopped or leftover corned beef brisket, sliced and chopped
- 1-1/2 teaspoons dry mustard
- 1 tablespoon granulated sugar
- 32 ounces sauerkraut, drained
- 2 medium baking potatoes, thinly sliced
- 2 cups shredded swiss cheese
- 2 tablespoons butter, melted.
- 1. Heat oven to 250 degrees. Arrange bread cubes in a single layer on a baking sheet. Toast in the oven until dry. Crush or process cubes in a food processor until you have medium crumbs; set aside.
- 2. Increase oven temperature to 350 degrees. In large bowl, mix together cream of mushroom soup, milk, onion, corned beef, dry mustard and sugar. Set aside.
- 3. Spread sauerkraut evenly in bottom of a lightly greased 9x13" baking dish. Place potatoes in single layer, slightly overlapping, over 'kraut.
- 4. Spoon soup mixture over potatoes and top with cheese.
- 5. In small bowl, combine melted butter with rye bread crumbs, and sprinkle mixture over cheese. Cover and bake 50 minutes. Remove cover and bake 10 minutes more.

Saw something the other day, so rare, it startled me. Two kids were riding down the sidewalk on a single bike! One on the seat, peddling, the other sitting sidesaddle on the crossbar. This was a common mode of travel when I was growing up. Not everyone could afford a bicycle, so you bummed a ride with a friend. I can still feel the pain from the bar when the bike hit a bump. Ouch! It's probably why so many of us old coots need our hips replaced when we get old.

Sometimes we ferried two passengers, one on the crossbar facing sideways, the second facing forward, his but perched on the handlebars, his feet resting on the front fender. It was a shaky, jerky ride. The peddler had all he could do to keep the bike upright and in a straight line, not to mention the endurance to move the weight of three kids any significant distance. Visibility wasn't so hot either, with two squirming bodies swaying back and forth across the line of sight.

The ultimate "ride share" came when a third interloper hopped on the back, straddling the fender, handing on to the coil springs under the seat, his legs dangling inches from the spokes in the back wheel. This was usually done as a playground stunt, but sometimes it was for real, the only way for four kids to get home on one bike.

I lived on a hill. My heavy, single gear, fat tired bike kept me fit. I could only make it to my house by working my way up the grade in a continuous "S" pattern, peddling back and forth across the street. It was probably quicker to hop off and push it up the hill, bu I have an image to uphold.

Bikes were our whole life back then, our freedom, the keys to the world beyond the block. We were our own mechanics. The bikes were simple. No complicated derailleurs, no brake and shifter cables to mess with. Just a frame, pedals, two wheels, a chain and handlebars. It's how we learned to use wrenches, change tires, patch tubes and put things back together after taking them apart. We went to bike shops for accessories and parts, but not for repairs. Except when we'd had a wreck and bent the front wheel. We didn't have the skill (or the patience) to "tune" the wheel, by tightening the spokes in a random pattern until they all had the same tension (and played the same note when they were plucked). At least I didn't.

So here I am, three score + years after I first hopped on a bike)using the curb to get started), still peddling around town and out of town (and still using the curb). People look, and see an old man moseying along. What they don't know, it's really a 12 year old kid (in his mind) enjoying the freedom only a bike ride can bring, the wind blowing through his hair, watching the world pass by at a speed just perfect to enjoy the journey, It ain't so bad, this old coot thing.
