

Milton Hershey - The History of Hershey Chocolate

Illin Hershey was born on September 13, 1857, in a farmhouse near the Central Pennsylvania village of Derry Church. Milton was in the fourth grade when his Mennonite father, Henry Hershey found his son a position as a printer's apprentice in Gap, Pennsylvania. Milton later became an apprentice to a candymaker in Lancaster, Pennsylvania, and candy-making became a passion which Milton grew to love.

In 1876, when Milton was only eighteen years old he opened his own candy shop in Philadelphia. However, the shop was closed after six year and Milton moved to Denver, Colorado, where he worked with a caramel manufacturer and learned caramel-making.

In 1886, Milton moved back to Lancaster, PA and started the successful Lancaster Caramel Company.

In 1893, Milton Hershey attended the Chicago International Exposition where he bought German chocolate-making machinery and began making chocolate-coated caramels.

In 1894, Milton started the Hershey Chocolate Company and produced Hershey chocolate caramels, breakfast cocoa, sweet chocolate and baking chocolate. He sold his caramel business and concentrated on chocolate-making.

Hershey's Kisses chocolates were first introduced in 1907 by Milton Hershey, who trademarked the "plume" extending out of the wrapper in 1924.

25 Delicious Facts about ... Chocolate

- 1. Portuguese poet Fernando Pessoa once wrote, "There is no metaphysics on earth like chocolate."
- 2. Hershey's produces over 80 million chocolate Kisses every day.
- 3. The English chocolate company Cadbury made the first chocolate bar in the world in 1842.
- 4. In the film Psycho, Alfred Hitchcock used Bosco chocolate syrup for blood in the famous shower scene.
- 5. Although cacao originated in Central and South America more than 4,000 ears ago, now approximately 70% of the world's cacao is grown in Africa Cote d'Ivoire is the single largest producer of cocoa, providing roughly 40% of the world's supply.
- 6. Chocolate has traditionally been associated with magical, medicinal, and mythical properties. In fact, in Latin, cacao trees are called Theobroma Cacao, or "food of the gods."
- 7. Champagne and sparkling wine are too acidic to go well with dark chocolate. Red wine typically compliments it the best.
- 8. Reports predict that the global chocolate market will grow to \$98.3 billion in 2016 from \$83.2 billion in 2010.
- 9. Cacao trees can live to be 200 years old, but they produce marketable cocoa beans for only 25 years.
- 10. Nearly all cacao trees grow within 20 degrees of the equator, and 75% grow within 8 degrees of either side of it. Cacao trees grow in three major regions: West Africa, South and Central America, and Southeast Asia, Oceania.
- 11. Each Cacao tree can produce approximately ,500 beans. it takes a cacao tree four to five years to produce its first beans..
- 12. U.S. chocolate manufacturers use about 3.5 million pounds of whole milk every day to make milk chocolate.
- 13. It takes approximately 400 cacao beans to make one pound of chocolate.
- 14. German chocolate cake was named after Sam German, an American, and did not originate in Germany.
- 15. Approximately 70% of the nearly \$500 million spent on candy during the week leading up to Easter is for chocolate.
- 16. Approximately 71 million pounds of chocolate candy is sold during the week leading up to Easter. On 48 million pounds of chocolate is sold during Valentine's week. In contrast, over 90 million pounds of chocolate candy is sold in the last week of October leading up to Halloween.

- 17. Chocolate has evolved into such a massive industry that between 40 and 50 million people depend on cacao for their livelihood. Over 3.8 million tons of cacao beans are produced per year.
- 18. The first people to harvest chocolate were the Mokaya and other pre-Olmec peoples who lived in southeast Mexico around 1000 B.C. The word "chocolate" is derived from the Mayan word xocolati, or "bitter water."
- 19. People who feel depressed eat about 55% more chocolate than their non-depressed peers.
- 20. Chocolate became one of the earliest American exports when, in the sixteenth century, both Columbus and Cortez brought cacao beans beck to Spain.
- 21. The FDA is debating a proposal to allow candy makers to substitute vegetable oil for the traditional cacao butter.
- 22. Dark chocolate has been shown to be beneficial to human health, but milk chocolate, white chocolate, and other varieties are not. For dark chocolate to be beneficial, cacao or chocolate liquor should be the first ingredient listed, not sugar.
- 23. Once reserved for the elite, chocolate became available to everyone due to the technological advances of the Industrial Revolution. However, as chocolate became increasingly popular in Europe and America, thousands of people were used as slaves to produce cacao.
- 24. Quakers, such as George Cadbury, amassed a great fortune producing drinking chocolate as an alternative to alcohol.
- 25. In 1875, Swiss Daniel Peter discovered a way of mixing condensed milk, manufactured by his friend Henri Nestle, with chocolate to create the first milk chocolate.

Top 10 Facts About Sewing

n September 10, 1846, Elias Howe was granted a US patent for his invention of the sewing machine.

7. The first patent of all for a sewing machine was given to Thomas Saint of England in 1790; Elias Howe gave us the first modern sewing machine.

- 2. Howe's innovations included a needle threaded at its point, a shuttle to form a lock stitch and an automatic feed.
- 3. In 1851, Howe also patented his "Automatic, Continuous Clothing Closure" seen by many as the first zip, but he did not try to market it.
- 4. The earliest sewing needles were made of bone between 25,000 and 30,000 years ago.
- 5. Howe's invention enabled machinists to sew in an hour what had previously taken 14.5 hours.
- 6. In 1863, during the American Civil War, Howe prided himself on the facts that more than a million soldiers were "clothed, kitted and covered by fabric sewn on machines using my inventions."
- 7. Queen's College, Oxford, has an old tradition of presenting scholars with a needle and thread, telling them to "Take these and be thrifty."

- 9. Electric sewing machines were invented in 1899.
- 10. A survey in the USA has reported that 51 percent of machinists own three sewing machines.

Chocolate Eclair Cake!!!

- 1 cup water
- 1/2 cup butter
- 1 cup flour
- 4 large eggs
- 1 (8 ounce) package cream cheese, softened
- 1 large box (5.1 ounces) vanilla instant pudding
- 3 cups milk
- 1 8 oz. container cool whip (you won't use the whole container) or one batch of homemade whipped cream
- chocolate syrup or homemade chocolate sauce

Instructions:

Preheat oven to 400. Lightly grease a 9"x13" glass baking pan.

Eclair Crust: In a medium saucepan, melt butter in water and bring to a boil. Remove from heat. Stir in flour. Mix in one egg at a time, mixing completely before adding another egg. Spread mixture into pan, covering the bottom and sides evenly.

*If the sides of your pan are too greased you won't be able to get the mixture to stay up the sides so make sure to just lightly grease.

Bake for 30-30 minutes or until golden brown (mine only took 25 minutes). You may want to check it occasionally - you don't want to overcook the crust, it will ruin the cake! Remove from oven and let cool (don't tough or push bubbles down).

Filling: Whip cream cheese in a medium bowl.

In separate bowl make vanilla pudding. Make sure pudding is thick before mixing in with cream cheese. Slowly add pudding to cream cheese, mixing until there are no lumps. Let cool in fridge.

When the crust is completely cooled, pour filling in. Top with layer of cool whip however thick you want it and serve with chocolate syrup.

*If you want to make this even better use homemade whipped cream.

Sapphires are truly the royalty of colored gems, one of the most admired and cherished since ancient times. A symbol of wisdom, intuition, purity and fidelity, sapphires have long been attributed with a transcendent spiritual quality - perhaps because of their heavenly blue color.

The name comes from the Greek "sapphirus" or blue stone, and the even earlier Hebrew "sapphir" meaning "beautiful."

Important sources are Australia, certain regions of India (including the island of Ceylon and the mountains of Kashmir) and Madagascar.

Sapphires come in a wide range of tranquil blues (although fancy sapphires are available in many colors like pink and orange). They can vary from pale to inky and can be slightly violet, green, or gray.

What is the most desirable color?

Typically, sapphires appear as blue stones, ranging from very pale blue to deep indigo, due to the presence of small amounts of titanium and iron within the crystal structure. The most valued shade of blue is the medium-deep cornflower flue. Sapphires also occur in other natural colors and tints - colorless, gray, yellow, pale pink, orange, green, violet and brown - called fancy sapphires. These different colors are caused by color from ferric iron, and colorless gems have no contaminants.

Most sapphires are heat treated to enhance their brilliance. This does not damage the quality or value of the stone - however untreated stones are so rare that their value is dramatically higher. Because sapphires are extremely hard, they're a resilient and timeless choice that requires little maintenance. Remember to give your sapphire jewelry the "royal treatment" every now and then - a professional cleaning will keep these heavenly gemstones looking their best.

Star sapphire is a rare variety of sapphire that exhibits a rare asterism under specific lighting. When viewing star sapphire, a six-rayed star will appear to float across the surface of the stone. The effect is best viewed under a direct light source and while tilting and rotating the stone from different angles. Star sapphires can range in color from blue in various tones to pink, orange, yellow, green, lavender, gray or black. The most desirable color is a vivid, intense blue. Most star sapphire exhibits a white star, but star sapphire from Thailand is famed for its gold color asterism.


- 1. There are two equinoxes annually, vernal and autumnal, marking the beginning of spring and fall. They are opposite for the northern and southern hemisphere.
- 2. The autumnal equinox happens the moment the sun crosses the celestial equator, which is an imaginary line in the sky that corresponds to Earth's equator. Every year this occurs on September 22, 23, or 24.
- 3. From hereon, the days get shorter until the winter solstice in December, when the light will begin its slow climb back to long summer days. Winter solstice is technically the shortest day of the year, while the summer solstice in June boasts the most sunlight. Hence, our four seasons.
- 4. Because it takes the Earth around 365.25 days to orbit the Sun and why we have a leap year every 4 years the precise time of the equinoxes varies from year to year, usually happening around six hours later on successive years. On leap years, the date jumps back an entire day.
- 5. This year, the autumnal equinox arrives precisely at 10:21 a.m. (EDT) on Thursday, September 22. Unlike an event like New Year's midnight that follows the clock around the time zones, equinoxes happen at the same moment everywhere.
- 6. "Equinox" comes from the Latin words "equi" meaning "equal" and "nox" meaning "night." This implies that there will be equal amounts of daylight and darkness; however such is not exactly the case.
- 7. This year, the sun will rise at 7:19 a.m. EDT on the equinox and will set at 7:26 p.m., giving us 7 minutes of day over night Although the sun is perfectly over the equator, we mark sunrises and sunsets at the first and last minute the tip of the disk appears. Also because of atmosphere refraction, light is bent which makes it appear like the sun is rising or setting earlier.
- 8. Exactly equal day and night won't happen until September 26 with sunrise at 7:20 am. EDT and sunset at 7:20 p.m.
- 9. For the astrology-minded, the morning of the autumnal equinox is when the sun enters Libra ... the sign of balanced scales. Equal day and night, balanced scales, seeing a connection here?
- 10. As for the other celestial orb we obsess on, the full moon near the autumnal equinox is called the harvest moon for the luminosity that affords farmers the ability to work late. This year's harvest moon will fall on September 16.


