

- 1. Kitchen and household waste:
 - a. Garbage should be placed in plastic bags not to exceed 25lbs, tied, and placed at the street for pick up by 8:00 a.m. Monday and Friday. If a holiday should fall on any pick-up day, that pick up will be lost and not made up.
 - b. NO garbage or recycling should not be placed on the street overnight.
- 2. Trimming/yard waste and construction debris:
 - a. This waste will be collected Monday and Friday after 8:00 a.m. MUST be bundled or bagged and less than 25 lbs. and not over 3 feet in length.

b.Two "roll off" dumpsters are available in the maintenance yard at the west end of 3rd St. for residence use only. Contractors doing work in the community should not use the community dumpster.

3. Recycling:


a.Wednesday is recycling collection, place containers at the street by 8:00a.m.

RENTERS

states in 3. Pet regulations. (d) Dogs must be on a leash no longer than six (6) feet at any time the pet is outside of Resident's home.

Residents are walking dogs with long leashes that allow the animals to wander up into the yards of their neighbors. Please observe the pet leash rule for the consideration of your neighbors and the safety of your pet.

Do not walk your dog on your neighbor's property. Pets are not to be tethered outside at any time. All dog waste is to be picked up immediately. There is no reason any of our maintenance or lawn crew should be stepping in this!

Landscaping and Mowing

If you have any problems with the landscaping or mowing, please contact the Ranchero office and not the mowing crew. The office will contact their managers and get the situation resolved as quickly as possible.

GUESTS

Guests staying more than 1 week MUST be registered in the Community Office.

Guests MUST display Ranchero Village ID tags when at the pools. Residents should be accompanying their guests while at the pool or other location and are responsible for the behavior of their guests. Please review your Rules and Regs and acquaint your guests with the rules also. Children under 16 must be accompanied by an adult who shall assume full responsibility for their safety and conduct. No running, jumping or diving into the pool.

GOLF CARTS

Golf carts are to only be driven by persons 18 years of age or older per Ranchero Rules and Regulations.

SOLICITORS

DO NOT let them into your home! Call the Largo Police Department (587-6730) immediately if you see solicitors and please let the management office know after you have called the police. Ranchero is a plainly posted <u>No Soliciting Community</u>; no one should be coming to your door. These people are very bold and brazen; please help us stop them and any other solicitors before they take advantage of anyone else in our community. **GLASS BOTTLES** –

PLEASE REMEMBER that no glass of any kind is allowed around the pool area. We are getting reports of beer bottles around the pool. If glass is broken, you have the potential of people getting cut. If glass is broken in the pool, it can be quite expensive to clean out.

<u>Food and drink are not allowed in the pool/hot tub.</u> People have been seen eating on the side of the pool and having their drinks inside the pool and hot tub. Please do not do this.

<u>No smoking at the pools</u> – please adhere to the new No Smoking Rules at the pools and smoke only away from the pool area in the designated areas. This includes vapor and e-cigarettes.


