
We still play our silly game of "Horsecollar" on <u>Tuesdays</u> and <u>Thursdays</u> (weather permitting).

MANAGEMENT NOTES

MESSAGE FROM THE MANAGER

HAPPY INDEPENDENCE DAY TO ALL!!! Enjoy a day of picnics and celebration.

The Community Office will be closed Tuesday, July 4th..

Please prepare for Hurricane Season ahead of time if you are leaving Ranchero for vacation or any other reason. Make sure everything is picked up around your home. That includes fruit off the ground, lawn furniture, grills, and any other loose objects that could be blown around by the winds.

The county is alerting us that mosquitoes only need a quarter of an inch of water to breed in. Please check around your home and eliminate any containers that collect water.

During this busy summer season, please remember to check in and out with the office when you leave or return to Ranchero. Even short trips need to be documented in case of emergency.

When away residents must have someone care for weeding and trimming of flower beds and bushes. If you need names of residents that do this, call the office and we can give them to you.



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OATES ENERGY WATER BILLING

We have been informed by Oates Energy that the water will increase from \$4.78/1000g to \$5.44/1000g, starting with the June billing.

ROAD CLOSURES

Please be aware that some roads may be closed due to repairs and tree removal. Please use alternate roads. DO NOT ATTEMPT TO GO THROUGH CONES OR AROUND WORKERS. Please do not talk to the workers. If you have questions, call the office.

CURRENT WATER RESTRICTIONS

Please note that Southwest Florida Water Management District issued an emergency Modified Phase II Severe Water Shortage which restricts lawn watering to one-day-per-week. Copies of the new schedule are available in the office or you can go on-line to <u>PinellasCounty.org/utilities for more information</u>.

UPDATE YOUR INFORMATION

Please make sure you have notified the office when any of your information has changed: mailing address, phone numbers, and email address. Also, be sure to sign in and sign out at the office. This is very important when we have a mailing or need to contact you in an emergency. Thanks!

PARKING

All cars are to fit in your carport. Do not park on the sidewalks, grass, or in between homes. If you must park on the street temporarily, do not block other driveways. Be courteous and park in front of your own home. If you have overnight guests and need additional parking, please contact the office. Please DO NOT park in your neighbors carport even if you know they are away without their written permission.

Do not block entrances in the maintenance yard. The City of Largo can come in anytime to empty or remove dumpsters, roll offs, or the compactor.

MOTORCYCLES

All motorcycles need to be registered and updated with the office. A new Ranchero Village vinyl decal will be given out. If you do not fill out the motorcycle form and return it to the office by July 15th we will remove your name from the motorcycle list. If you no longer have a motorcycle, please let us know.

TREE PERMITS

If you have requested a tree permit to take down a citrus tree or any other tree (permits from the City of Largo are required for all trees over 4" in diameter) please let the office know when



the tree has been removed. We must contact the City of Largo Arborist to come out and sign off on the permit in order to close it out with the City. All those orange permits in the office window are waiting to be finalized!

GOOD NEWS

One source of help that isn't a scam is through the Emergency Home Energy Assistance for the Elderly Program provided through Pinellas County Health and Human Services Department. Qualifying seniors can receive assistance through this program to pay power bills or receive vouchers for cooling fans. Assistance with heating costs is also available through this program. GUESTS

Guests staying more than 1 week MUST be registered in the Community Office.

Guests MUST display Ranchero Village ID tags when at the pools. Residents should be accompanying their guests while at the pool or other location and are responsible for the behavior of their guests. Please review your Rules and Regs and acquaint your guests with the rules also. Children under 16 must be accompanied by an adult who shall assume full responsibility for their safety and conduct. No running, jumping or diving into the pool.

Guest are not permitted to bring pets into the Park with them.

GOLF CARTS

Golf carts are to only be driven by persons 18 years of age or older per Ranchero Rules and Regulations.

It is the responsibility of the homeowners to make sure that any additional occupants

RENTERS

in their homes are properly registered with the park. If you are planning to rent out your home or have someone stay with you, review your Ranchero Rules and Regulations first. PET RESTRICTIONS MUST BE OBSERVED BY ALL AND APPROVED BY MANAGEMENT BEFORE A PET CAN BE BROUGHT INTO THE COMMUNITY. Additional occupants and renters must be registered with the office and a background check performed prior to their arrival. It is the Homeowners responsibility to meet all the requirements. There is an application fee to cover this expense. Applications are available in the Office. They must be accompanied by two legible forms of identification for each person. For international applicants, copies of passports and driver's licenses are required. These should be submitted at least 30 days in advance of the person's arrival. Renters are to check in at the office upon arriving in the community.

IF YOU ARE A RENTER OR ADDITIONAL OCCUPANT and haven't done the





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above, please come to the office immediately and get properly registered. Thank You!

SOLICITORS

<u>mmediately</u> if you see solicitors and please let the management office know after you have called the police. We have been trying to catch and trespass them. If we can even get a license plate number it would help immensely. Management has been working with the police in an attempt to stop these offenders. Ranchero is a plainly posted No Soliciting Community; no one should be coming to your door. These people are very bold and brazen; please help us stop them and any other solicitors before they take advantage of anyone else in our community.

The office NEVER gives anyone permission to solicit in the Park.

<u>GLASS BOTTLES</u> – It's time to enjoy the pool and the beautiful Florida sunshine. PLEASE REMEMBER that no glass of any kind is allowed around the pool area. We are getting reports of beer bottles around the pool. If glass is broken, you have the potential of people getting cut. If glass is broken in the pool, it can be quite expensive to clean out.

<u>Food and drink are not allowed in the pool/hot tub</u> – People have been seen eating on the side of the pool and having their drinks inside the pool and hot tub. Please do not do this.

<u>Hot tubs</u> – these are for the use of <u>adults only</u>. No one under 18.

<u>No smoking at the pools</u> – please adhere to the new No Smoking Rules at the pools and smoke only away from the pool area in the designated areas. This includes vapor and e-cigarettes.

HOME SITE ALTERATIONS

If you are making any changes or additions to your home site or the exterior of your home please come to the office and submit a completed request form. Paint colors must be approved and a permit obtained from the office. The same applies to alteration requests; this includes plantings. Submit your written request and wait until you have received approval and a permit before proceeding with any work. Also, be sure to obtain any required City permits.

DOGS- DOGS- DOGS

There is so much to be said about dogs. We encourage everyone to review your <u>Rules and Regulations</u> manual to update yourself on all the <u>rules</u>. Among many of the rules in section VII. <u>PETS</u>, you will find it states: "Guests and visitors are to be advised not to bring their pets into the Community, with the exception of <u>trained working dogs</u>." This means that you must alert your guests that their pets are NOT allowed to visit in the community.

Also, "No pets are allowed in the community recreation center or common areas at any time." Please come to the community office for a dog section map if you are not sure of the dog section. Dogs can only be walked in the areas indicated and on the side of the street designated



"Dog Section'. Keeping these rules makes for happier neighbors...and management too!

Service and medical dogs are to have their jackets on at all times when outside the owner's home to identify them as working dogs.

And, of course, all pet owners are to have a litter bag with you at all times to pick up and properly dispose of pet litter.

Dogs must be walked on a leash and should not be running free.

If you have a service dog and you are not in the Dog Section, please only walk them on your property only.
