#### **SELLING YOUR HOME?**

Please notify the office as soon as you know you will be selling your home. All homes are inspected and must be brought into compliance before a sale will be approved. All buyers, renters or additional occupants must complete an application and be approved prior to sale or moving in.

The following letter is being mailed to realtors, sales agents, and homeowners who are selling a home in Ranchero:

We are updating our records and requesting that all sales associates selling homes within Ranchero Village to provide to this office, within ten (10) days from receipt of this letter, copies of the broker's license for the share homes and the dealer's license for the land lease homes.

As I am sure you are aware, a broker can only show/sell a share home and a dealer can only show/sell a lease home (Florida Statue 320.77).

Effective February 1, 2020

- Realtors or Homeowners may not sell their home or transfer their home title without first notifying Management in writing.
- There will be an Administrative Fee of \$200 due from the realtor/agent (homeowner if sold by owner) for each sale, payable to RANCHERO VILLAGE CO-OP., INC. This fee is payable when the prospective buyer is approved for residency and a signed contract/bill of sale is presented.
- 3. Once the Ranchero Village office has been notified of a sale, the home will be inspected to be sure the home is in compliance with park standards; which include cleaning or painting if needed, flower beds weeded, bushes trimmed, all loose debris removed and any unapproved alteration such as fences and golf cart pads. All unapproved alterations must be removed, and property returned to original condition.
- 4. Two (2) attractive "For Sale" signs, not more than 12" X 16" may be placed inside the home or in the flower bed in front of the home (not in the grass). "For Sale" signs are limited to the home only. "Open House" signs for the purpose of home sales will be permitted during the hours of the open house, by either Residents or anyone representing Residents.
- 5. Pets Ranchero Village Pet Rules must be read, signed and approved by Management before a sale is final. There is not to be more than one (1) pet per house. Dogs must be in the authorized dog section and a 30-pound limit. No exceptions!!
- The Real Estate Agent must be sure the proposed resident has been approved PRIOR to buying, or the transaction cannot be completed.

If an agent allows anyone to buy in our community without an approved application for credit/background check, the Real Estate company will not be allowed to sell in this community and the resident will be an unauthorized resident.

#### BACKGROUND CHECKS FOR RENTERS AND RESIDENTS

Both long term and short term occupants of a home, whether a renter, an owner, or an additional occupant are required to have a credit and background check run. Anyone staying in Ranchero Village as a guest for more than 15 days up to twice a year is required to submit an application. This rule applies to everyone. If you have been here before but have had an absence of over two years you will be required to have a current background check run. These rules apply to everyone no matter what your past occupation may have been.

#### **GUESTS**

#### Guests staying more than 1 week MUST be registered in the Community Office.

Guests MUST display Ranchero Village ID tags when at the pools. Residents should be accompanying their guests while at the pool or other location and are responsible for the behavior of their guests. Please review your Rules and Regs and acquaint your guests with the rules also. Children under 16 must be accompanied by an adult who shall assume full responsibility for their safety and conduct. No running, jumping or diving into the pool.

#### **HOT TUB USE** is for adults only.

No one under 18. Food and drink are not allowed in the pool/hot tub. The hot tub is only meant for short sessions, no longer than 15 minutes. The use of alcohol combined with

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the relaxing heat of the hot tub can be a dangerous combination. A person can easily slip under the water unnoticed and tragedy can strike quickly. <u>Never</u> swim alone, use the buddy system for safety.

Also, for the health and well being of everyone, please do not go in the Hot Tub or Pools if you have wounds or open sores.

Do not put soap in the hot tub.

<u>STOP SIGNS</u> – please stop at all STOP signs in the Park. Cars, golf carts and bicycles continue to roll through them and someone could easily get hurt one day. Just please pay attention. We have had several close calls.

<u>**DRIVEWAYS**</u> – When backing out of your driveway, please stop and look before entering the street. There have been several 'close calls' with residents backing out and not looking.

#### **Landscaping and Mowing**

If you have any problems with the landscaping or mowing, please contact the Ranchero office and not the mowing crew. The office will contact their managers and get the situation resolved as quickly as possible.

#### **ALL CONTRACTORS**

Do not talk or hover around contractors. If you have questions about what is being done, please call or stop by the office. They are trying to do a job and do not need to be interrupted and you may be causing a safety hazard.

<u>GLASS BOTTLES</u> – PLEASE REMEMBER that no glass of any kind is allowed around the pool area. We are getting reports of beer bottles around the pool. If glass is broken, you have the potential of people getting cut. If glass is broken in the pool, it can be quite expensive to clean out.

<u>No smoking at the pools</u> – please adhere to the No Smoking Rules at the pools and smoke only away from the pool area in the designated areas. This includes vapor and e-cigarettes.

#### **ALTERATION REQUESTS**

Driveways, siding, roof-overs, windows, painting, planting, you name it! If you are making any type of change to the outside of your home, please come into the office first to apply for a permit. Submit your written request and wait until you have received approval and a permit before proceeding with any work. If work is started without the proper permits, management will put a stop to the work. Don't put yourself or your contractor through the inconvenience of interrupted work just because you failed to follow the rules. Also, very important, be sure to obtain any required City permits.

#### <u>PUT IT IN WRITING!</u>

All requests and complaints should be put in writing and signed. Anonymous reports will not be addressed. Forms are available in the Hacienda Clubhouse just inside the front door by the office for your convenience.




