Our team has completed more than 700 TAVR procedures over the last five years.



There will be activities here in the park and also tributes in other locations such as Bay Pines Veterans Hospital.

Due to this holiday on <u>Monday May29th our community office will be closed</u> but there will be GARBAGE PICK UP that day. Please only put out trash, not any big items.

In case of a park related after hours emergency please call 727-346-4819 TRASH

If you are using a trash can, please only put out 1 trash can and make sure all trash is in bags and tied. No loose trash will be picked up. Trash must be out by 8:00am but not overnight. **MOTORCYCLES**

If you have a motorcycle, the new Ranchero Village vinyl clings are now available in the office. Please fill out the Motorcycle Information form that was delivered to you last month if you haven't already done so and bring it to the office. If you have already dropped the form

off, please stop by and pick up your new number. All motorcycles are to be registered and the new # displayed.

<u>STOP SIGNS</u> – Just your monthly reminder to please stop at all STOP signs in the Park. Cars, and bicycles, continue to roll through them and someone could easily get hurt one day. Just please pay attention.

DRIVEWAYS – When backing out of your driveway, please stop and look before entering the street. There have been several 'close calls' with residents backing out and not looking.

<u>I strongly urge residents</u> to obey the one way arrows in the roads, especially around the clubhouses. Those following the correct direction of the arrow are not looking for those going the wrong way. We have seen many instances where someone has almost gotten run over because of someone going against the arrows.

<u>WEEDS</u> – As our northerners go home, please remember to make arrangements to have your home cared for in your absence. The weeds grow during the summer and will need to be pulled while you are away.

SEASONAL TIPS

Sewers and sinks can be kept flowing and in good condition by the addition of enzymes available at nearby home improvement stores or hardware stores. Enzymes poured down the sink periodically will help to break down the grease and gunk that build up in the plumbing. Only a couple ounces a month will do the job. For the sewer a twice per year treatment flushed down the toilet is also available. This kills off the roots and growth that get into the sewer line. These small investments can prevent costly plumbing bill.

Another seasonal tip is to remind our gardeners to pull out the little oak seedlings that are popping up all around the homes from fallen acorns. Some of these "seedlings" have grown into rather large plants already and are up against homes. They might not seem like much now but trees in Florida grow fast....VERY FAST! The park cares for the currently established large oak trees but does not plant new oak trees nor take responsibility for any that residents plant or allow to grow from acorns or seeds. We really recommend that homeowners remove these plants while they are still able. As many know, oak trees can cause great damage to homes. Once the tree reaches 4" in diameter the city requires a permit to take it down. **RENTERS**

It is the responsibility of the homeowners to make sure that any additional occupants in their homes are properly registered with the park. If you are planning to rent out your home or have someone stay with you, review your Ranchero <u>Rules and Regulations</u> first. <u>PET RESTRICTIONS MUST BE OBSERVED BY ALL AND APPROVED BY</u> <u>MANAGEMENT BEFORE A PET CAN BE BROUGHT INTO THE COMMUNITY.</u> Additional occupants and renters must be registered with the office and a background check performed prior to their arrival. <u>It is the Homeowners responsibility to meet all the</u> requirements. There is an application fee to cover this expense. Applications are available in the Office. They must be accompanied by two legible forms of identification for each person.

For international applicants, copies of passports and driver's licenses are required. These should be submitted at least 30 days in advance of the person's arrival. Renters are to check in at the office upon arriving in the community.

IF YOU ARE A RENTER OR ADDITIONAL OCCUPANT and haven't done the above, please come to the office immediately and get properly registered. Thank You! **SELLING YOUR HOME**

Please make sure that the new buyers have been approved by the Park before you finalize the sale even if they are living in the Park or have previously lived here.

Landscaping and Mowing

If you have any problems with the landscaping or mowing, please contact the Ranchero office and not the mowing crew. The office will contact their managers and get the situation resolved as quickly as possible.

GUESTS

Guests staying more than 1 week MUST be registered in the Community Office.

display Ranchero Village ID tags when at the pools. Residents should Guests MUST be accompanying their guests while at the pool or other location and are responsible for the behavior of their guests. Please review your Rules and Regs and acquaint your guests with the rules also. Children under 16 must be accompanied by an adult who shall assume full responsibility for their safety and conduct. No running, jumping or diving into the pool.

GOLF CARTS

Golf carts are to only be driven by persons 18 years of age or older per Ranchero Rules and Regulations. They are also required to obey street signs.

SOLICITORS

DO NOT let them into your home! Call the Largo Police Department (587-6730) immediately if you see solicitors and please let the management office know after you have called the police. We have been trying to catch and trespass them. If we can even get a license plate number it would help immensely. Management has been working with the police in an attempt to stop these offenders. Ranchero is a plainly posted No Soliciting Community; no one should be coming to your door. These people are very bold and brazen; please help us stop them and any other solicitors before they take advantage of anyone else in our community.

GLASS BOTTLES – PLEASE REMEMBER that no glass of any kind is allowed around the pool area. We are getting reports of beer bottles around the pool. If glass is broken, you have the potential of people getting cut. If glass is broken in the pool, it can be quite expensive to clean out.

No smoking at the pools – please adhere to the new No Smoking Rules at the pools and smoke only away from the pool area in the designated areas. This includes vapor and e-cigarettes.

HOT TUB ETIQUETTE – these are for the use of **adults only.** No one under 18. Food and drink are not allowed in the pool/hot tub. People have been seen eating on the side of Continued on page 33

POOL RULES

If you have any oils or lotion on, please rinse off in the shower before going into the pool. This will help prevent the black greasy ring around the water line.

TREE PERMITS

Permits MUST be obtained from the City of Largo for the removal of any tree with a trunk larger than 4" in diameter. Certain trees will require a fee before the permit can be obtained. The community office must submit the request to the City.

If you have gone through the permit process and have removed a tree please contact the community office and let us know so we can have the permit closed out with the City. The City arborist tells us there are a number of unfinished permits on the books and they'd like to get it cleaned up.

HOME SITE ALTERATIONS

If you are making any changes or additions to your home site or the exterior of your home please come to the office and submit a completed request form. Paint colors must be approved and a permit obtained from the office. The same applies to alteration requests; this includes plantings. Submit your written request and wait until you have received approval and a permit before proceeding with any work. Also, be sure to obtain any required City permits.

All requests and complaints should all be put in writing and signed. Anonymous reports will not be addressed. Forms are available in the office for your convenience

HANDICAP CHAIR LIFT

If you need assistance to go into a pool, we have a Handicap Chair Lift available at the Hacienda swimming pool.

It only takes a few minutes of your time to register on the National DO NOT CALL List. Call 888-382-1222 and follow the directions. You must call from the phone number you want to have blocked. Or go to *donotcall.gov* to register on-line.

Eating more fish may help prevent Alzheimer's

Izheimer's, a disease that afflicts some 5.1 million Americans, is a type of dementia that affects a person's memory, thinking, and behavior. Although at this point no cure exists, you can take measures to reduce your chances of suffering from this debilitating condition.

New evidence suggests that eating more fish—as long as it's not fried—may help to protect your brain from the shrinkage and decline associated with Alzheimer's. Researchers from the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center tracked the diets of 260 people with normal cognitive



function for more than 10 years. Using magnetic resonance imaging (MRI), they measured the brain volume and function of each participant at the beginning of the study, and again at the end. The results: The 163 subjects who ate fish on a weekly basis (the majority consuming it one to four times a week) had a larger orbital frontal cortex and hippocampus (two areas of the brain that are known to shrink in Alzheimer's patients) and better memory function that those who ate less fish.

The researchers determined that the risk for Alzheimer's and mild cognitive impairment was lowered fivefold within the five years following the brain scans. So start eating more fish today.

Follow this 'Golden Rule' to reduce cancer risk

ant to cut your risk of developing cancer? Check the color of your food—particularly your toast and potatoes. Scientists in the United Kingdom day that cooking those two items too long can increase levels of a naturally occurring chemical called acrylamide, which has been linked to cancer in rats.

Acrylamide is formed when starchy foods like potatoes and root vegetables are cooked at over 120 degrees. To reduce it in your foods, follow these guidelines:

- **Cook until golden.** Whether you're making toast, roasting potatoes, or baking vegetables, cook until the food is gold-colored, not brown.
- Check the instructions. Follow instructions for baking or frying packaged vegetables like fries or parsnips.
- Keep raw potatoes fresh. Don't put them in the refrigerator if you're going to roast or fry them. Colder temperatures can increase acrylamide levels.
