





Please "catch up" on any hurricane/tornado news that you may have missed. We are being pro-active this year and saving all our paper-



work, including the monthly bulletin articles regarding disaster relief. We've had our Saturday Morning Disaster TIPS just about every week. We did this to keep our paperwork together in our KIT for years to come. Take a "Surviving the Storm" pamphlet or use one from a previous year, it has ALL the facts we've talked about and it really doesn't change, so keep it packed year to year. TODAY'S TIP is regarding RESTROOM FACILITIES: Improper disposal of human waste can lead to outbreaks of cholera, dysentery and other diseases. TIPS FOR SEWER OUTAGE:

* When instructed, do not use or flush your toilet. Powered sewer loft stations may be out of order, which could lead to a sewage back-up into homes.

* Use a chemical toilet if one is available.

* Create an emergency toilet by using your toilet bowl or a five gallon plastic bucket with a tight fitting lid. Line with a heavy duty trash bag and use household bleach as a disinfectant. If using your toilet bowl, first turn off water and flush one time to empty before lining with a trash bag. * DO NOT use kitty litter in your emergency toilet. This cannot be flushed after the sewage system is operational.

* Once given the OK, dispose of the emergency toilet's contents into your household commode. * Thoroughly sanitize your emergency toilet with bleach before storing.

* Wash hands thoroughly with soap and water after handling the emergency toilet.
