Your Board's (CO-OP and HOA) have agreed with all components of the deal and we have listened to our community and delivered a fantastic deal for virtually all or most to benefit from this agreement.

An overwhelming majority of our community has been waiting for relief of high cable bills for a long time and relief is finally coming.

This is non-negotiable and everyone is going to be billed for the service.

All the legal tasks and hoops are completed including Tallahassee's sign-off

\$15.26 including tax will be included in your Monthly Maintenance (similar to the way we charge sewer)

As we get closer to rollout more information will be available and we will keep you posted. These rates will hold for a year and have a 5% cap from the 2nd to the 5th year.

All additional Optional products can be put on seasonal hold at no additional fee and if you have a Spectrum phone it will be \$4.99 a month to hold your telephone number.

If you have DirecTV or Dish and in a contract – Spectrum will buyout your contract HOWEVER you need to call them and go to the triple play (cable/phone/internet) and tell them you want them to buyout your contract.

For existing users of Spectrum – you will receive a notice in the mail (note- no Spectrum mail will be forwarded to Canada residents from what I have been told). Canadians can sign up as they return in the fall.

Look to next month's monthly media for additional instruction as the implementation date gets closer.

Please stop by the office and Check In upon your return to the community. We need to make sure we have you noted as "IN" for delivery of the mail, Monthly Media, and any other notice. Also, if you have an updated drivers license please stop by the office so we can make a copy for your file.

RANCHERO VILLAGE – GARBAGE & RECYCLING :

******ALL TRASH AND RECYCLING WILL NOT BE PICKED UP IF IT IS MORE THAN 1 FOOT FROM THE ROAD. *******

- 1. Kitchen and household waste:
 - a. Garbage should be placed in plastic bags not to exceed 25lbs, tied, and placed at the street for pick up by 8:00 a.m. Monday and Friday. If a holiday should fall on any pick-up day, that pick up will be lost and not made up.
- b. NO garbage or recycling should not be placed on the street overnight.
- 2. Trimming/yard waste and construction debris:
 - a. This waste will be collected Monday and Friday after 8:00 a.m. MUST be bundled or bagged and less than 25 lbs. and not over 3 feet in length.
 - b. Two "roll off" dumpsters are available in the maintenance yard at the west end of 3rd St. for residence use only. Contractors doing work in the community should not use the community dumpster.
- 3. Recycling:
 - a. Wednesday is recycling collection, place containers at the street by 8:00a.m.
 - b. "NO PLASTIC BAGS OF ANY SORT". Container can be all "mixed recycling",

including: mixed paper, flattened carboard, aluminum foil trays, tin or steel food cans, glass bottles and jars, milk and juice paper cartons and all plastic #1-7 (on the bottom of the container), these include butter tubs, fruit containers, take out plates, plastic cups, yogurt containers, plastic clam shell containers, etc... any plastic with a recycling sign. PLEASE ... NO PLASTIC BAGS OF ANY SORT! ALL CARDBOARD BOXES JUST BE BROKE DOWN.

c. Expansion to the recycling program will be implemented as approved by the City of Largo.

- 4. General:
- a. No burning of trash, leaves or other material is allowed in the park.
- b. Trash and recycling containers should be marked with the house number.
- c. No dumping of any refuse in any area of the community except for the containers in the maintenance yard at the west end of 3rd St.
- d. Residents who bring their garbage, trash or recycling, to the maintenance yard should place the waste in each of the proper receptacles as clearly marked.

BACKGROUND CHECKS FOR RENTERS AND RESIDENTS

Both long term and short-term occupants of a home, whether a renter, an owner, or an additional occupant are required to have a background check run. Anyone staying in Ranchero Village as more than a guest of 15 days up to twice a year is required to have a background check. This rule applies to everyone. If you have been here before but have had an absence of over two years you will be required to have a current background check run.

SEASONAL REMINDERS

Fall is here and it's time to check the batteries in your smoke alarms.

It is also the time to put the Root Kill down the sewer to keep roots from plugging up your plumbing. Cooper Sulfate, available at local hardware stores, should be used twice a year: once in spring and again in the fall.

PRECAUTION

The park the manager is urging all residents to come to the office and register their goflcarts and bicycles. Registration forms from the City of Largo Police Dept. are available for registering bicycles. A sticker is then placed on your bike which will help in returning it to you should you become the victim of a theft.

Let's take all steps possible in preventing these thefts. Be sure to keep bikes and golfcarts securely locked up or chained. If you see suspicious activity call the Largo Police Dept. at 727-587-6730 and also alert the park office.

DOG WALKING

All dog walkers be sure to walk your pet only in the dog section and only on the side of the street designated as dog section. Many streets are designated "dog section" on one side of the street, but the other side is not in the dog section. Keep your neighbors happy and obey the pet



rules. And, of course, don't forget the 'Litter" bag. If you have a service dog in the non-dog section, please be respectful and use your lawn only.

DOOR TO DOOR SALES Call the Largo Police Department (727-587-6730) immediately and please notify the community office if you have a solicitor come to your door. Even if you think you can just send them away with no harm, please remember they will be preying on your neighbors. Be a good neighbor and help to get rid of these predators. If a solicitor tells you they have received permission from the office to be in the park, do not believe it. Management NEVER gives permission for solicitation.

POOL RULES

All the rules for the pool apply to all people at all times. The Corral Pool has extended hours, from 6:00am – 11:00pm. The children hours are now 10:00am -11:00pm. The rules posted as well as those which we highlight in this Bulletin are to be followed at all hours and conditions. Just because no one else is at the pool when you are, does not mean the rules can be altered for your convenience. For example: If no one else is at the pool you must still abide by the No Smoking Rule and only smoke in the designated area. This is just an example, but you get the idea. Pool tags are being checked randomly, so please be sure to have your pool tag and guest pool tags. You can get a guest pool tag at the office with a \$2.00 deposit. Let's all keep the rules and keep Ranchero a pleasant place to live and enjoy.

HOT TUB USE is for adults only.

No one under 18. Food and drink are not allowed in the pool/hot tub. The hot tub is only meant for short sessions, no longer than 15 minutes. The use of alcohol combined with the relaxing heat of the hot tub can be a dangerous combination. A person can easily slip under the water unnoticed and tragedy can strike quickly. Never swim alone, use the buddy system for safety.

Also, for the health and well being of everyone, please do not go in the Hot Tub or Pools if you have wounds or open sores.

GLASS BOTTLES – PLEASE REMEMBER that no glass of any kind is allowed around the pool area. We are getting reports of beer bottles around the pool. If glass is broken, you have the potential of people getting cut. If glass is broken in the pool, it can be quite expensive to clean out.

No smoking at the pools – please adhere to the No Smoking Rules at the pools and smoke only away from the pool area in the designated areas. This includes vapor and e-cigarettes.

PUT IT IN WRITING!

All requests and complaints should be put in writing and signed. Anonymous reports will not be addressed. Forms are available in the office for your convenience.

The office does not monitor Next Door.
