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
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FROM THE EDITOR'S DESK


November Monthly Meeting Minutes Thursday November 6,2014

• The minutes of the March 2014 meeting were read. A motion was made and seconded to accept the minutes as read. Minutes were approved.

Communications and Bills

• Ed read a resignation letter from Karen Merzendorf. The letter was submitted to the Secretary. A thank you letter be sent to Karen by the Secretary. Majority agreed.

Reports of Special Committees

• Ron Harsh- representing the FMO needs our support and can still use more people to join and be represented. The dues are \$22.00 a year. Information about joining FMO is posted on the board.



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- Good Neighbors will meet, Friday, November 14, 2014. A cleaning party is scheduled for 9:30 Wednesday, November 12 to clean cupboards, storage room and shed. Asking for volunteers. Welcome back party November 15, tickets will be on sale for the party on Saturday at Koffee Klatch. Thanksgiving dinner tickets will also be on sale at that time. Frank stated that his nominating committee for Good Neighbors election of officers will be Hazel Price and Jenny Harsh.
- Bingo is going good, but need a Bingo caller to replace Andy. Have one caller and need one more. Please see Julie if you would like to volunteer.

Old Business

- Ed announced that Management has \$1000 approved for Bocce Ball Court. Resident volunteers are needed to help build.
- Ed stated that Management will not move hand rail in the front of the clubhouse.
- It was suggested that the maintenance man or residents in the park could move the rail ourselves. It amounts to moving 12 bolts.
- The Handicap parking areas are located in front of building and the handicap ramp is located at end of building. Could handicap parking areas be moved over by ramp.
- Sidewalk repair is being done, but work is not being done well. Management is looking for another contractor.





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New Business

Need a volunteer to update phone books for 2015.

General Discussion

- Resident wanted to know what happens to written complaints when they are sent to the office. Why does it take so long to get results. According to the Park Prospectus if more than two complaints are received by the Office regarding a resident; an eviction notice may be sent to that resident. Ed stated that two residents were evicted from the park this summer.
- People are buying coaches in the park and not living in them. They are allowing other people to live in them; who have not had background checks.
- Fire Pits are illegal and not allowed in Riviera Estates.
- Rent increase is tied to the CPI at less than 2%. The pass on tax will probably be lower than stated in our letter. A copy of the letter will be posted in the Club House.
- Special mention and appreciation was made regarding the renovations to the Club House. (Cleaned floors, ceiling fans, paint, new ceiling in kitchen and a beautiful front door).
- Would like a report from Management, on how the 50 cent increase in our rent for the heating of the swimming pool is working out.
- A suggestion was made to see if the pool could be heated from October thru March, instead of November thru April. Ed suggested maybe the middle of October thru the middle of April would be a good concession. Idea seemed agreeable. Ed will make note.
- A question was made about the nonpotable water being used to fill the pool. Ed explained this was a one time mistake by the Pool Company and corrected. The water was tested and at no time unacceptable to swim in.
- Certain residents are allowing their dogs to be kept in a fenced in area. The unattended dogs are barking are disturbing other residents. Written complaints have been made. Dogs should be controlled and walked on a leash. The number of dogs and their size are increasing in our park and the privilege is getting out of hand.
- Also reported, people are not cleaning up after their dogs in the dog area.

Announcements

• Ed Mitchell read a letter of resignation as President of the Homeowners Assoc effective immediately. The letter was handed to the Secretary.

Meeting was adjourned at 10:28 AM. All were in motion.

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POOL AND PET OWNER REMINDERS

YI: Riviera Estates MHP would like to remind our residents that NO one is allowed to touch the temperature settings on the pool heater and/or the clubhouse air conditioner. Our manager and the Homeowner's Association Executive Board have insisted on this. Pool hours are 9:00 a.m. until dusk daily. Pool is heated in winter, the months of November through March.

ATTENTION PET OWNERS: Please be a responsible pet owner and a RESPECTIBLE pet owner as well. When walking your pets, please do not allow them to "potty" in other people's yards. Some are not pet lovers as we are. Your dogs must be leashed at all times, and there are plenty of areas where your dog can go. There is a pet cleanup station in the storage field for your use. Please be sure to clean up after your pet. Also, please try to keep your pet from barking or making loud disturbing noise that can bother a neighbor. Complaints are being received by the office on a constant basis of pet problems in the park. So, at this time, our pet rule policy should be noted. Pets are allowed in park, UP TO 20 POUNDS weight restriction. Copies of pet innoculation certificate must be given to the office as proof the pet has been vaccinated. There is a LIMIT OF TWO PETS PER COACH. Fences for the pets are not allowed to be installed. All pets must be leased at all times when outside the coach. Make certain when you leave your pet, they are not barking the entire time you are gone and bothering your neighbors. If this is the case, please make some type of arrangements that will alter this situation, such as a pet sitter, taking pet with you, or if the problem continues, and complaints continue in the office from residents being bothered by the barking, the park is forced to take steps in resolving the issue, such as requiring you to get rid of the dog, or face eviction procedures. Please be a responsible pet owner and obey the rules concerning them. It is IMPERATIVE THAT YOU CLEAN UP AFTER YOUR PET EVERYWHERE, INCLUDING THE DOG WALKING AREA.

Please do not ignore these pet owner rules, so that we all can continue to love and enjoy our pets. But at all times we must be respectful of all the residents that live here, that they are not bothered by our pets in any way. Not by hearing them all the time, or stepping in their waste when out walking etc. Thank you for adhearance to the pet policies and rules.




