

Please remember that no glass of any kind is allowed around the pool area. We are getting reports of beer bottles around the pool. If glass is broken in the pool, it can be quite expensive to clean out.

Please remember there is no alcohol in the pool area or in the pool or hot tub.

Home Site Alterations

I f you are making any changes or additions to your home site or the exterior of your home, please come to the office and submit a completed request (green sheet). Paint colors must be approved and a request form must be approved. Submit your written request and wait until you have received approval before proceeding with any work. Anyone other than the homeowner working on the home must be licensed and insured and we must have a copy of such on file in the office.

Guests

dditional guests staying overnight in the park must be registered and paid for. Cost is \$3 per person per night, \$12 per person per week and \$40 per person per month. Residents must accompany their guests while at the pool or other locations and are responsible for the behavior of their guests. Children under 18 must be accompanied by an adult who shall assume full responsibility for their safety and conduct. No running, jumping or diving into the pool.

Driveways

There have been close calls with residents backing out and not looking.

We strongly urge residents to obey the one way arrows. We have seen many instances where someone has almost gotten hit because of someone going against the arrows.

Mowing

f you have any problems with the mowing, please contact the office and not the mowing crew. The office will contact the manager and get the situation resolved as quickly as possible.

Golf Carts

olf carts are only to be driven by persons 18 years old and older with a valid driver's license.

Hot Tubs for Adults Only

No one under 18. Food and drink are not allowed in the pool or hot tub. The hot tub is meant for short sessions only, no longer than 15 minutes. The use of alcohol combined with the relaxing heat of the hot tub can be a dangerous combination. A person can easily slip under the water unnoticed and tragedy can strike quickly. Never swim alone. Use the buddy system for safety.

Also, for the health and wellbeing of everyone, please do not go in the hot tub or pool if you are not feeling well, have wounds or open sores.

Stop Signs and Speed Signs

Please stop at ALL STOP SIGNS IN THE PARK. Cars, bicycles and golf carts continue to roll through them and someone could easily get hurt one day. Just please pay attention.

Three activities to ward off Alzheimer's

lzheimer's disease may not have a cure, but experts believe some practices can help delay memory loss. Here's what you can do:

- Cognitive training. Crossword puzzles and other games can help, but try some different techniques. Do simple arithmetic in your head instead of relying on a calculator. Develop a new method for remembering what's on your shopping list. Train your brain to remember things in new ways and you'll keep it sharper.
- Control your blood pressure. Reducing high blood pressure with medication and weight loss not only cuts your risk of heart disease, but it can also ease stress on the delicate blood vessels in your brain— stress that can exacerbate memory loss and dementia.
- Exercise. Moderate aerobic exercise has many health benefits, including heading off symptoms associated with Alzheimer's. Try exercising for 30 minutes five days a week, or 50 minutes three times a week. You'll feel better and extend your cognitive health.

Scientists search for life on the toughest planets

Pe think of life as viable only on planets orbiting stars like our sun, but scientists now speculate that it could evolve on worlds circling very different types of stars.

Stars called M dwarfs are the most common stars in our galaxy. Their harsh flares and gravitational grip on their innermost planets could interfere with the formation of liquid water, which is necessary for life. However, astronomers have spotted approximately 200 planets circling M dwarfs, and dozens are in the so-called habitable zone where liquid water could exist and temperatures aren't too extreme for the development of life.

Scientists are studying these strange new worlds in hopes of detecting conditions that might lead to life—although it will probably be very different from any life found on Earth.




