

• Just a reminder to everyone. Item#10 of the Serendipity Rules and Regulations states in part the following:

"All lot rental amounts are payable in advance the first day of every month and are delinquent if not paid by the fifth (5th) day of any month in which the lot rent is due. All lot rental amounts paid after the fifth of the month will be subject to a late fee".

Currently the late charge fee is \$25.00

- As I go around the Park, I have come across a number of homes that do not have 2015 tags. Please keep in mind that all homeowners must have these on the front windows of your home. If your home is not registered, you are subject to fines by Pinellas County, so it is to your benefit to get them immediately and keep them updated as needed.
- A reminder to all seasonal residents that when you head back north, you are still responsible for the upkeep of your home and yard. Please make arrangements with someone to take care of this while you are gone.
- The golf balls at the golf net by the shed are provided by Serendipity, so please keep them at this area
- A committee has been appointed by ROC to review the Rules and Regulations of your community. As such, an Input sheet was previously placed at your home requesting any ideas and suggestions you may have regarding this subject. If you do not have this form, please come to the Office and one will be provided to you. The deadline to receive your suggestions is March 15th, as this Committee would like to move forward as quickly as possible to update the current Rules and Regulations now in effect. Any and all relevant ideas will be reviewed and appreciated by this Committee.
- There is some Fitness equipment in the East Clubhouse that the Park is looking to sale. If anyone is interested in any of this equipment, please let me know.
- Item #29 of your current "Rules and Regulations" states in part the following: "For Sale" signs are permitted. They must be attached to the HOME or displayed in the window and be no larger than 18 inches square"
- Just a few items of note:
- 1. A black vinyl 6 foot chain link fence will be placed on the north side of Serendipity between your Park and Riviera. This project should be started within the next few weeks.
- 2. Two cameras will be installed on the shed by the dumpsters on Imperial and will also be completed in the next few weeks.
- 3. The ROC Board has approved the purchase of a new home to be placed on one of the empty lots. This will be a doublewide unit and should be here in the April or May timeframe.
- 4. A West Clubhouse Renovation Committee has also been established and the members are working diligently to address any and all options to improve the functionality and appeal of this clubhouse.
 - Here's hoping that you are having a great winter at Serendipity, and that March brings a little more pleasant weather as spring is coming!

What is Pi?



Pi and the Pyramids!

No, not the kind of pie you eat but the mathematical pi! The number π is a mathematical constant, the ratio of a circle's circumference to its diameter, commonly approximated as 3.14159. It has been represented by the Greek letter " π " since the mid-18th century. It is also sometimes spelled out as "pi." Because pi is an irrational number, it cannot be expressed exactly as a common fraction. Consequently, its decimal representation never ends and never settles into a permanent repeating pattern. Pi is also a transcendental number, a number that is not the root of any non-zero polynomial having rational coefficients. It is impossible to solve the ancient challenge of "squaring the circle" with a compass and straightedge. Pi is found in many formulae in trigonometry and geometry. It is also used in branches of science such as cosmology, number theory, statistics, fractals, thermodynamics, mechanics and electromagnetism.

Okay, that's enough technical math for my poor brain (math was never my favorite subject)! Just remember that pi is amazing and it has been used for centuries. It was used in Indian mathematics in the 5th century CE. The first exact formula was not available until a millennium later. There is a national pi day celebrated on March 14, which is also Albert Einstein's birthday!

Interesting facts about pi:

- The ancient Babylonians knew of pi's existence nearly 4,000 years ago, found on a tablet from between 1900 and 1680 BC.
- The King James Bible gives an approximation of pi in cubits.
- The Greek mathematician Archimedes approximated the Pythagorean Theorem.
- Number enthusiasts have memorized many digits of pi. The record for the most digits of pi memorized belongs to Chao Lu, of China, who recited pi from memory to 67,890 places in 2005.
- John Taylor (publisher/writer) first proposed the idea that Egypt's Great Pyramid at Giza (built around 2589-2566 BC) was designed based on pi. Since then, others have made the link between the Great Pyramid and pi as well. He wrote a book called "The Great Pyramid: Why Was It Built? And Who Built It?" Many others have also written books about the pyramids. The Egyptian pyramids built in the 4th dynasty and still standing have precise angles between 43° and 55°.
- If a pyramid architect decided that the base should be a perfect square and that the apex should be directly above the center of the base, this would mean that the pyramid would be very symmetrical. All the faces would be isosceles triangles and slated at the same angle. The architect would then have to choose that angle and the builders would have to be able to carry out the design with perfect precision. The ancient Egyptians certainly had advanced mathematical knowledge.
- To calculate pi, measure the circumference (or distance around the edge of a circular/ curved object) and the diameter of the object.
- In the Star Trek episode "Wolf in the Fold," Spock foils the evil computer by commanding it to "compute to last digit the value of pi."
- The symbol for pi (π) has been used regularly in its mathematical sense only for the past 250 years.
- A Givenchy men's cologne named Pi is marketed as highlighting the sexual appeal of intelligent and visionary men.
- If the circumference of the earth were calculated using π rounded to only the ninth decimal place, an error of no more than one quarter of an inch in 25,000 miles would result.
- A mysterious 2008 crop circle in Britain shows a coded image representing the first 10 digits of pi.
- Pi is the secret code in Alfred Hitchcock's Torn Curtain and in The Net starring Sandra Bullock.
- Computing pi is a stress test for a computer—a kind of "digital cardiogram."
- The π symbol came into standard use in the 1700s, the Arabs invented the decimal system in A.D. 1000, and the equal sign (=) appeared in 1557.

There has been much debate in the scientific community about whether the pyramids were constructed using precise calculations or if it is purely coincidental that many of them exhibit angles that use mathematical values such as pi, phi and the Pythagoras Theorem. It is postulated that even today with our technology, advancements, computers and robots, that these monuments cannot be replicated! In the end, the pyramids are amazing structures and pi is an amazing mathematical function!
